Author's Notes

I original created this ancestral file in the 2012-2015 timeframe while living in Longmont, Colorado. At the time I was a member of the Longmont Genealogical Society, and one of our activities was helping organize and digitize burial records for the Mountain View Cemetery in Longmont.

With over 20,000 cemetery burials, and realizing that there were many veterans buried therein, there was only one Congressional Medal of Honor (CMOH) awardee buried in the cemetery, namely one *John Harvey Fisher*.

It appeared that no one locally (in Longmont) had created a family history for Fisher, so I decided that would be one of my tasks. I spent some time gathering data and documenting Fisher's ancestral line and then, ultimately, also his descendant line. I should also note that while creating this Fisher family tree and posting the ongoing results on Ancestry.com, I actually enjoyed some contact with a few Fisher descendants and entered into correspondence with them. In an effort to help them in their own family tree pursuits, I answered what questions arose that I was able to answer, and I created a DVD including the supporting documents and images I had gathered. I hope this was helpful to them all.

"At the time of the siege of Vicksburg they called for volunteers to try to take at night a hill held by the Confederates and high enough to mount artillery to shell the city. [John] Harvey Fisher was one of the volunteers that took the hill and Harvey got a body full of shrapnel and a Congressional Medal. I have wondered about this medal but have been told it wasn't quite as hard to get this medal in the Civil War.

"[John] Harvey Fisher married and raised a large family. He used his Civil War script to buy raw land in the North West near Spencer, Iowa about 60 miles from Sioux City."

Service Record: Enlisted in Company B, Illinois 55th Infantry Regiment on 31 Oct 1861.Promoted to Full Corporal.Promoted to Full 1st Lieutenant on 22 Jul 1864.Mustered out on 15 May 1865.

John Harvey Fisher (1837 - September 16, 1895) was a Union Army officer during the American Civil War. He received the Medal of Honor for gallantry during the Siege of Vicksburg on May 22, 1863.

Generation 3 (con't)

Fisher joined the 55th Illinois Infantry as a private in September 1861, and was discharged as a captain in May 1865.

Background: On May 22, 1863, General Ulysses S. Grant ordered an assault on the Confederate heights at Vicksburg, Mississippi. The plan called for a storming party of volunteers to build a bridge across a moat and plant scaling ladders against the enemy embankment in advance of the main attack. The volunteers knew the odds were against survival and the mission was called, in nineteenth century vernacular, a "forlorn hope". Only single men were accepted as volunteers and even then, twice as many men as needed came forward and were turned away. The assault began in the early morning following a naval bombardment. The Union soldiers came under enemy fire immediately and were pinned down in the ditch they were to cross. Despite repeated attacks by the main Union body, the men of the forlorn hope were unable to retreat until nightfall. Of the 150 men in the storming party, nearly half were killed. Seventy-nine of the survivors were awarded the Medal of Honor.

Steven Hamilton and Isaac Baldwin came to Jones County, Iowa from Medina County Ohio. I don't know if they knew each other before this or not, but when their children were through the local schools they both sent them back to Ohio to finish their education.

Steven Hamilton married and raised three sons, Nial, Edwin and Arthur A (Family Bible DoB Nov 17, 1835). His first wife died and he married again and they raised one son named Charles.

When the Civil War started and with the call for volunteers about 25 or 30 Jones County boys enlisted, elected their own officers, were sworn in on the village green and went off to war. The three older Hamilton boyes were in this number and one was named sergeant. In the city square of Wyoming, Iowa is a granite stone with their names inscribed on it. (Civil War Veterans)

When they were mounting the attack to take Vicksburg and cut the Confederacy in two, most any boat that would float was pressed into service. The boat that would float was pressed into service. The boat that was coming up the Mississippi with Edwin Hamilton among others were pouring on the coal to get there in time for the battle. The boiler blew up and killed Edwin and most of the others.

Nial was killed in action but I don't remember hearing them say where. (My note; I found a reference in The Craft Family where they state Nial was killed in a steamboat explosion while returning from CA. I have also not been able to find any Civil War references on Nial, although there was a famous steamboat explosion at the battle of Vicksburg. This is an area that needs more research)

Arthur served throughout the war but the only battle I can remember them talking about was the battle of Pea Ridge, Mo. I have read that this was a battle to keep Missouri in the Union which the North did by winning the battle.

Steven Hamilton prospered and they say around there that he had so many land notes and mortgages that people in debt used to say they had a little Hamilton on their place.

Before Arthur came home, his father died and the second Mrs. Hamilton within a week had sold all the land and securities for whatever she was offered. She took Charles and left for parts unknown.

(personal note: My research shows Steven died in 1873, so I am not sure of the date of Arthur "coming home". He died the same year as his dad.) About twenty years later dad's (Nial Hamilton) mother Ada received a letter from somewhere in Missouri saying she was sick and dying, broke and if she couldn't raise some money would be buried in a paupers grave. Ada Hamilton mailed her (Arthur Steven's stepmother) two hundred dollars at that address and nothing more was ever heard.

The folks took the Wyoming Journal for about twenty years after they moved to Kansas.

The local ladies collected information about pioneer history of Jones County and its people and published it in the Journal and I used to read it and one of the items I liked said that Steven Hamilton was the first surgeon at Wyoming. A neighbor got gangrene in his big toe and Steven Hamilton heated a coal chisel red hot, took a hammer and cut off the toe.

Arthur A Hamilton returned from the war, married Ada Fisher and started farming on an eighty acre farm southeast of Wyoming, Iowa. I am not sure but I think this was Fisher land, and I know it was across the road from the Baldwin farm and Baldwin school.

Arthur A. and Ada Fisher were married Tuesday Feb 9, 1869 at Anamosa, Iowa. Dad was born Feb 1, 1870, and Arthur Hamilton named him Nial Edwin after his two lost brothers.

Uncle Arthur was born Nov. 28, 1872. He was named Steven Arthur after his granddad and his own father, but when he grew up he changed the name to Arthur Steven.

Barbara Fisher Barber and George Barber produced four children and while the children were real young, Mrs. Barber died.

Arthur Hamilton died while his children were young (Note: independently Uncle Harold told us he committed suicide and hung himself in the barn. The terrible fruits of war. I have not independently verified this, but it must be in a record somewhere. Uncle Harold did not find this out for years, as people don't talk about such things. I have often wondered about the effect on this of his son becoming a renowned neurologist.) and Ada Hamilton and George Barber married and brought up their children together. (Note: This means their children, besides being stepsiblings, were also cousins) After the children were grown and George Barber died, she married Mr. Eb Wherry.

Harvey Fisher married and raised a large family. He used his Civil War script to buy raw land in the North West near Spencer, Iowa about 60 miles from Sioux City.

When Dad (Niel Edwin Hamilton) was 16, he spent a whole summer with his uncle's family. (Note: I assume this is Harvey Fisher). They had lots of cattle and open range so Dad and his cousins would drive the cattle out and watch them through the day. He said they raced their horses, played games and carried water to drown out ground squirrels to pass the time. Dad used to say that his

aunt was one of the finest women he ever knew. He said she worked long, hard days taking care of her large family and some times would be up half of the night trying to ease the pain of he shrapnel.

Dad and his cousin George Fisher corresponded as long as they lived. George Fisher was the editor of a union Newspaper in Fort Worth, TX.

We (Dad and the Family) stopped one time to see another of these cousins who had just retired as a teacher in the Denver, Colorado schools.

Now about Isaac Baldwin. He was born 4-2-1797 at Carmel, Putnam County, NY and married Susan Sunderland born at the same place on 10-13 1784. They were married 5-13-1834 in Pike Township Allegheny NY and moved to Iowa.

Of their five children, Marcellus served through the Civil War and then came to Ogden, KS where he had a general practice as a doctor and surgeon for the rest of his life.

Lydia Lois married a boy who lived on the other sie of the Hamilton farm named Fielander (sic. Philander) Vaughn.

Theron Julian Baldwin married Eliza Ann Smith and they became the parents of ten children which included Flora Gertrude Baldwin 2-9-1874.

Niel Edwin and Arthur Steven Hamilton grew up on the forementioned eighty acres and when their mother decided to remarry, she gave the farm to her two sons. Uncle Arthur wanted education and Dad wanted to farm so Dad bought him out.

Dad said he had several dates with Jennie Baldwin Walston, but his kid brother would say, "Why don't you set your cap for that Gertie, She's the one that takes my eye." and eventually he did.

They married at Anamosa, lowa on Oct. 4, 1892 and this union was blessed with seven children.

In 1870 he [Watkins James] wedded Miss Mary [Elizabeth] Fisher, [Daughter of George W and Barbara Fisher] a resident of Jones county, and they are the parents of the following children: Angie. who is the widow of W. A. French, resides with her parents, and she has one daughter, Ruth: Francis: Oscar, an agriculturist of Clay county; Walter; and Gladys. Politically Mr. James supports the republican party and in the township has successfully served as school director, road supervisor and trustee. He and his wife attend divine services at the Methodist Episcopal church. He is a man who through enterprise and honesty has acquired an excellent reputation in the community.

Watkins James, who is largely identified with the agricultural and stockraising interests of Royal, this county, is among the number who do not need to have recourse to history in order to gain a knowledge of the hardships and adventures of the early settlers, as these arc among, his own experiences, for he located in a crude and uncultivated country requiring all his energy, perseverance and patience to convert the prairie into the excellent and highly improved farm which he now owns. A native of Virginia, he was born September 18. 1848. a son of Walter and Susannah (Alt) James. His father, also a native of that state, came to lowa about the year 1851 and located in Jones county, where he tilled the soil until he departed this life. His father having passed away when Walter James was a youth, the support of the family fell upon his shoulders, he was compelled to seek steady employment, and became driver on a canal boat.

It is recorded that his brother was farming at Harper's Ferry when John Brown made his famous raid at that place. In politics Mr. [Walter] James was a pronounced democrat and was always loyal to his party both by his vote and his influence. He continued farming from the time he settled in Jones county and met with such high measure of success as to enable him to become one of the most substantial agriculturists in the township. His wife [Susannah], also a native of Virginia, where they were married, departed this life in Jones county in 1861. They were the parents of: John William, a retired farmer of Jones county. Iowa; Martha, widow of George Banks, of Hoges Store, Giles county. Virginia; Margueritte, widow of Phillip Allsbury, who resides in Jones county, Iowa; Walter, who operates a farm in that county; Susannah, who with her husband, John D. Rhode, also resides on a farm in Jones county, where they are living in retirement; G. W., another farmer of that county; Daniel, deceased, formerly of Arizona; Benjamin F.. a Jones county farmer: and Watkins, our subject. Four children died in infancy.

Upon acquiring his education in the district schools of Jones county, Watkins James remained under the parental roof, helping, on his father's farm until he was eighteen years of age, when he began to "work out" by the month in Jones county and finally came to Clay township. Clay county. and took up eighty acres of land on section 10, where he still resides. When he procured the land it was in a raw state, never having been tilled, but in course of time he improved the entire acreage, provided the farm with a dwelling house, barn and outbuildings, and has since been reaping bountiful harvests as a result of his perseverinoefiforts.
