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PREFACE.

On the 31st of August 1898, a meeting of the descendants of Nicholas White was held at Historical Hall, in Taunton, under the auspices of the Old Colony Historical Society. At this meeting an association was formed called the Nicholas White Genealogical and Historical Association. Rev. Nehemiah White, D. D., of Galesburg, Ill., was chosen president, Mrs. Clara Isabel Hubbard of Taunton, secretary; and Thomas J. Lothrop, historian. Mrs. Fanny M. Leonard of Taunton, contributed a poem which was well received. She also contributed a poem for each of the three subsequent meetings held in the years 1899, 1900 and 1901.

At the first meeting in 1898, after remarks had been made by several of the descendants, it was voted unanimously that a genealogy of the descendants of Nicholas White should be compiled,

and the historian soon entered upon the work.

For the compilation, the records of many towns and the land and probate records of several counties in Massachusetts were examined. Local histories and printed genealogies of allied families were searched and considerable material taken from these sources. Frequent use has been made of Clark's History of Norton, Chaffin's History of Easton, and Mitchell's Bridgewater, The "Halls of New England" the Read Genealogy by J. W. Read, the Eddy, Guild, Drake, Hodges and Pratt genealogies have furnished much information and some items have been supplied by Austin's One Hundred and Sixty Allied Families. In all cases, however, where a discrepancy appeared between the printed book and the town records, the latter has been followed.

After the work was well under way the compiler learned that a Nicholas White genealogy had been begun by the late William R. Deane and that his manuscript had been placed in the files of the New England Historic Genealogical Society. This manuscript was borrowed and compared with the results of the compiler's investigations; no important discrepancy was found. Mr. Deane's manuscript, however, included only the male lines of the first four generations and did not claim to give a full record of them.

Besides the sources of information already named individual members of the family were applied to. Prompt responses were usually made to these applications and in this way much valuable assistance has been given. In obtaining the numerous descen-

dants of Mary 3 White, who married Nathaniel Wetherell, material aid has been furnished by Mrs. Lucinda L. Lincoln, Miss Catherine L. Bassett both of Taunton and Mrs. Eliza J. Osborne of Middleboro, all descendants of said Mary 3. Miss Sarah W. Copeland of Mansfield contributed the valuable record of the descendants of Martha 5 White who married William Copeland.

J. E. Seaver, Esq., secretary of the Old Colony Historical Society furnished the extensive record of the descendants of Mary 4 White who married William Presbrey and from whom are descended nearly all and perhaps all of the Presbreys now living in Taunton.

For the descendants of Nicholas 5 White, I am indebted to Mr. H. Clure White of Gaines, N. Y. The important and extended record of the descendants of Philip 5 White is the work of his grandson Rev. Nehemiah White, D. D., of Galesburg, Ill., who has been president of Lombard University and is now at the head of its Theological Department.

In the early part of the work the compilation was much encouraged and assisted by Mrs. Henrietta E. V. Hayes who died in Sept. 1901. She took a deep interest in the matter and to her is due the credit of originating the movement which has resulted in this compilation. Besides those already mentioned; the following should be named as important aiders and abettors in the work: Miss Josephine L. Hall of Boston, Miss Clara A. Avery of Detroit, Mich., Mr. A. J. Turner, of Portage, Wis., Miss Elizabeth Crafts, of Abington, Mr. William P. Wetherell of Washington, D. C., Miss Elizabeth H. Leonard and Mrs. Alice B. Leonard both of Mansfield. To each and all of them, and to all who have in any way contributed to the compilation, I here acknowledge my obligations and extend my thanks.

Very few abbreviations are used in the book, the letter "b" is used to indicate born in the list of names of children. $\mathbf{W}_{\mathbf{hen}}$ the name of a town situated in Massachusetts is used, there is no abbreviation to indicate the state, but when the town is in another state the common abbreviations are used. In giving the names of children, the surname is omitted when it is White, and the child is descended in a male line from the pioneer. In other cases the sur-

name is given in full.

The compiler hopes his work will afford a basis for further and more complete ancestral investigations. Much additional material has been collected and may be used for another volume to include the eighth and subsequent generations.

NICHOLAS WHITE OF DORCHESTER AND TAUNTON.—PIONEER.

We have no knowledge of the birth and ancestry of Nicholas White, but that he belonged to the yeomanry of England we have no doubt. When, and how he came to New England, we do not know. He was a freeman in Dorchester in 1643, and about the same time married Susanna, a daughter of Jonas and Frances Humphrey, who had also settled in Dorchester. At this time he was probably about 25 years of age, and had won the confidence and respect of the early settlers.

In 1657 the first book of the Dorchester records was destroyed by fire. This book is said to have contained the records of the early births, marriages and deaths, the assignment of lots to the settlers, and the transfers of property. We have reason to believe that it contained the record of his marriage and the births of his children, as well as many facts relating to his life and doings while in Dorchester. Many interesting and important facts were undoubtedly lost with the book.

The knowledge we have obtained relating to Nicholas White has come from Massachusetts State Archives, Plymouth Colony Records, Suffolk probate and land offices, and various other sources.

In 1647 he bought from Henry Woolcot a tract of land in that part of Dorchester which was then called Uncaty, and is now the town of Milton. He cleared a part of it and built a house, but before he was able to enjoy the benefit of his labor he was sued by a Mr. Hutchinson, who claimed a prior title. Hutchinson obtained judgment and ousted him from the premises. He then sued Woolcot on his warranty and obtained judgment against him. An execution was issued and Woolcot gave bills to satisfy it, but without the knowledge of White petitioned the General Court for a stay of proceedings and the annulment of the bills. The petition was granted. Nicholas White then presented to the General Court a petition in which he set forth the facts in the case and

from which we can obtain some knowledge of his family and the condition of his estate. The papers in the case may be found in the Massachusetts State Archives. Below is a copy of the order of the Court, adopted on Woolcot's petition; also a copy of the petition of White and order thereon. The petition of Woolcot was not found in the archives.

Answer to Petition of Henry Woolcot.

In answer to the petition of Henry Woolcot of Winsor on Connecticut it is ordered that all proceedings about the thirty pounds seven shillings mentioned in the petition be suspended, and that it remain in statu quo prius as before the execution levied, until the petitioner may have opportunity either jointly with Nicholas White or in the name and right of the said White, though his consent should be wanting, that the petitioner, either by himself or his attorney, may have opportunity to review or try an action as aforesaid, for the clearing of the title of the land sold by the petitioner unto the said White, in the County Court to be held at Boston in the 5th (or 8th) month next. And if the land shall be recovered of Mr. Hutchinson for the said White, then the bills for the thirty pounds seven shillings to be null without more impleading of White; and also that the Magistrates then shall determine all damages respecting Mr. Woolcot and Nicholas White, in reference to all former proceedings by their impleading each of other. Adopted May 29, 1655.

PETITION OF NICHOLAS WHITE AND ORDER THEREON.

To the Right Hon. Governor, the Deputy Governor and Magistrates, with the Worthy Deputies of this Honored Court:

Humbly Showeth that your petitioner in August, 1647, purchased a piece of land at the hand of Mr. Henry Woolcot, containing about 20 acres, scituate in Dorchester, with assurance under hand, for a firm conveyance to be made in due time, & in the meantime was put in peaceable possession of the said land, built upon, broke, and fenced much of it; yet before any crop had thereon was molested, sued, overcome &

ousted of his lawful purchase by Mr. Hutchinson, of whom he was forced to hire his own again and with it compelled to rent his farm, the which being so great an undertaking for your petitioner occasioned his sudden poverty, and thereupon forced to forsake his own with his wife and five small children, to seek subsistence far remote; and in his absence the house burned, fence razed, the ground broken up, is grown up again

and all ruined and brought to naught.

The petitioner sued Mr. Henry Woolcot, recovered damages to the value of forty pounds, irrevocable, he received bills of Mr. Woolcot for payment & expecting the same in time & kind. Mr. Woolcot, unknown to your petitioner, hath received a grant from this Honored Court to make his said bills void, whereby your petitioner is now left naked and destitute, himself his wife and children having neither his land restored, his due damages paid, nor opportunity to find his family with bread, by this trouble, and charge hath accrued hereupon; wherefore your petitioner humbly requesteth this Honored Court to compassionate his sad condition and vouchsafe to grant that his case may be heard and rightly understood so as that with all possible speed he be repossessed of his said land, and that such damages he hath sustained by means of default as above said may be paid him by Mr. Woolcot, and your petitioner put in capacity to relieve his family, for which he is willing to refer himself to this Honored Court & to take the land as prized in part payment, so shall he as in duty bound praying your happiness & remain your humble servant.

NICHOLAS WHITE.

In answer to this petition the Committee doth apprehend that Nicholas White hath had much wrong and damage in being ousted of his land by Mr. Hutchinson, whererof he was possessed and whereunto (as it doth appear) he had just title. Therefore he ought to seek reparation legally at the hands of his disturbers, and that the General Court order dated 24 May, 1655, respecting this case be and remain in full force.

.It will be seen that the order in answer to Woolcot's petition was adopted in May, 1655. The petition was probably presented at the same session of the Court. White's petition was presented and the order adopted thereon in May, 1656. White had then moved to Taunton.

Whether or not suit was brought against Hutchinson by either Woolcot or White, as recommended by the Court, does not appear. There seems to be no record of any further proceedings in either the County or General Court. It is probable that the property was in some way restored to White. September 12, 1659, the Selectmen of Dorchester (to use the language of the record) "desired William Robinson to inquire how long Thomas Trott hath lived at Uncaty in Nicholas White's house." In June, 1663, an inventory was taken of the estate of Thomas Gatlive, deceased, which included the following item: "Land at Milton bought of Goodman White £140." In October, 1664, Jonathan, a son of Thomas Gatlive, sold this property to David Holmes, and the deed given by him contains a description of the premises, from which it appears that it was situated in the easterly part of Milton, near the Braintree line.

When did Nicholas White move to Taunton? This question cannot be answered definitely. In 1652 he mortgaged a part of his real estate to John Gill, of Dorchester. In the mortgage he is described as a resident of Dorchester. The record of a lawsuit at Plymouth between Jonathan Briggs and William Hailstone shows that in October, 1655, he was a resident of Taunton. His removal must have been between 1652 and Oct., 1655; probably in the spring of 1655, when he had obtained judgment against Woolcot, and supposed the controversy settled. His petition presented to the General Court in 1656 states that he was obliged "to seek subsistence far remote." What he meant by "far remote" is not clear, but it is probable that Taunton was intended. At that time there was no settlement between Dorchester and Taunton, and neither roads nor bridges. Aithough the distance between the two settlements was only about 80 miles the wilderness intervening, made it seem much more.

In 1657 he was included in the list of the inhabitants of Taunton, who had taken the "oath of fidelity." He was very early an owner in the Taunton Iron Works and was prominently connected with them for many years. Among the entries in the books of the Iron Works Company is one which reads as follows, viz.: "delivered to Nicholas White, Sr., to carry through the wilderness, 32 miles to Major E. Tyng, 7c. of iron; also to Madame Leverett, of Boston, 7c. of iron, and for Samuel Capen 8c. 2 qr. for Dorchester Church, due for 1688-4."

Besides his interest in the Iron Works he soon became the owner of a quarter of a saw mill situated on Mill river; the exact location is not definitely known. The saw mill gave the people of Taunton some annoyance by stopping the run of the fish up the stream, to the pends above. "October 31, 1666, George Watson, Gyles Gilbert and William Wetherell (all of whom resided or owned property near Watson's and Winnecunnet ponds) complained at the Plymouth Court against James Walker, Robert Crossman, John Macomber and Nicholas White, in an action of trespass on the case, to the damage of an hundred pounds for hindering the fish for having a convenient passage up and down Mill River at Taunton by the work about the saw mill, contrary to the promise of said James Walker, all of which hath been great damage to the complainants and others."

The jury found for the plaintiffs "that a sufficient passage be made by the defendants with the expense of time and costs of suit." The mill owners in accordance with this verdict made a passage way and the herrings resumed their accustomed visits to

the ponds.

This is one of the first—perhaps the first of the many contests that have been waged over the Taunton Herring in the courts and

the Legislature of the State.

In or about 1661 Block Island, or New Shoreham, was bought by John Alcock, acting in behalf of sixteen residents of Dorchester, Braintree and neighboring towns. In April, 1661, a shallop sailed from Braintree for Block Island. It stopped at Taunton, where fifteen of the sixteen purchasers went on board as passengers. They were Thomas Terry, Samuel Deering, Simon Ray, William Tash, Thormut Rose, William Barker, David Kimball, William Cahoone, Duncan Williamson, John Rathbone, Edward Vorse, Nicholas White, William Billings, Trustaram Dodge, John Ackurs. The other purchaser, Thomas Faxon, had preceded with the surveyor. Nicholas White probably sold his right very soon, as his name does not appear in the first division of land made in September, 1661.

In 1668 Nicholas White, his son Nicholas and his son-in-law, Samuel Hall, were members of a company which purchased a large tract of land lying north of Taunton and extending to the boundary line between the Plymouth and Massachusetts Bay colonies. It was called the Taunton North Purchase, and embraced the present town of Easton, nearly all of Mansfield and a large part of Norton.

In 1672 Nicholas White, his son Nicholas, and son-in-law, Samuel Hall, were among the associates who bought a large tract of land lying south of Taunton, and comprising the town of Dighton and part of Berkley. This was called the Taunton South

Purchase.

Nicholas White was not a prominent figure in church, nor in public affairs, but an industrious and enterprising citizen, who in a quiet way did his full share in converting the forests and wild lands into fertile fields and laying the foundations of a city in the wilderness. He was an active participant in promoting the prosperity of Taunton, and a large owner in its industries. By energy, industry and frugality he acquired a large property amounting to about £300 cash value as appears from the inventory of his estate, taken at a time when money was scarce and property held at a low valuation.

He died in 1697 and in 1698 his estate was divided between his three sons, Nicholas, John and Joseph and his daughter, Elizabeth. It will be remembered that in 1656 in his petition to the General Court he stated that he had "five small children;" probably one of the five died early, leaving no issue to inherit

property.

Other items relating to him and his transactions appear on the records of Dorchester and of Plymouth Colony, but as they would not add materially to the interest of the sketch they have been omitted.

It is probable that when Nicholas White moved to Taunton he located and lived a few years at or near Scaddings pond, for we find in the will of John Dean of Taunton, made in 1660, mention of "a parcel of land between Nicholas White's house and Mistress Gilbert's farm at Scaddings."

Wills &c., within the County aforesaid), being administrator to the estate left by his late father, Nicholas White, late of Taunton, aforesaid, deceased, and made oath to the inventorys both of lands and movables above and within written, are true and just to the best of his knowledge, & when he knoweth of more he will reveal it that it may be herewith recorded.

The following agreement was made by John White and Joseph White with their brother, Nicholas White, administrator of the estate of their father, Nicholas White, deceased.

Know all men by these presents, that we, John White and Joseph White of Taunton, in the County of Bristol and Province of Massachusetts Bay in New England, sons of Nicholas White of said Taunton, deceased, have fully agreed with Nicholas White, our brother and administrator to the estate of our father, deceased, as by letter of administration may appear, bearing date the 14th day of July last past (that is to say), said John and Joseph White do agree with said administrator that each of them shall be fully satisfied, contented and paid their full proportion of what of right belonged to us, said John and Joseph, as our full shares of the estate of said father, deceased, as by schedule or account annexed to this agreement, appeareth that is to say fifty-five pounds fifteen shillings as inserted and the remaining part of our proportion of our share of said estate to pay the debts due from said estate we leave in the hands of the administrator, and if by overplus or credit to said estate there shall be anything to divide we expect and are to have our proportion thereof that belongeth to us of right. ther, we, said Nicholas White, administrator to said Nicholas White, deceased, and John and Joseph White, do acknowledge that these presents is our absolute contract and agreement and a final issue of anything pertaining to our deceased father's estate. And we, said John and Joseph White, do hereby forever quit claim to any other part of the said estate than what is here, in said schedule inserted.

In witness hereof we have set our hands and seals this 28th day

of October, 1698, in the tenth year of his Majesty's reign, William, the third, king over England, &c.

Elizabeth 2 White married 1st in 1668-4 Samuel, son of George and Mary Hall. They resided (it is said) near the bloomerie, in Taunton. He was born in 1644; held several town offices; was a member of the original church, and died in or before 1689. She married 2d, March 3, 1689-90 Jonathan Pratt, and died about 1707. Nicholas 2 resided in Taunton, probably on Dean street. He was one of the Selectmen of Taunton four years and held other positions of trust and responsibility. Like his father he was engaged in business and a large landholder. He died in Norton, probably, at the residence of his oldest son, Jan. 18, 1727-8. His will was dated September 15, 1724, and proved May 28, 1728. The inventory of his estate amounted to £1558-19s.-8d.* He married December 9, 1678 Ursula, daughter of William and Ursula? Macomber, of Marshfield. Children all born in Taunton:

John 2 White resided in that part of Taunton which became Raynham in 1781; died September 8, 1726, aged 77 years. He was a surveyor, clerk of the military company, one of the Selectmen of Taunton and a large owner of real estate. In 1704 he represented Taunton on a committee to settle the boundary line between Dorchester on the one side and Taunton and Bridgewater on the other. He married February 24, 1679-80 Hannah, daughter of Samuel and Susanna (Reed) Smith, of Taunton. Children all born in Taunton:

*Among the articles inventoried were a sword at Thomas White's and a gun at widow Mary Hall's. Estate of Nicholas 2 was divided and the division entered in Court December 15, 1780. Nicholas 3 White, resided near Cobbler's Corner in the North Precinct of Norton (now Mausfield). The house in which he lived is now (1901) standing. He was one of the earliest settlers in that neighborhood and a leader in all movements for the comfort and welfare of the people. With George Leonard, who had also settled in another part of the territory, that is now Norton, he led the movement to set off the town of Norton from Taunton. He also took a leading part in setting off the North Precinct of Norton and establishing a church within its limits. This was done in 1731, and in 1737 Rev. Ebenezer White of Brookline, a graduate of Harvard in the class of 1733, was ordained as "gospel minister of the church in the North Precinct of Norton." Nicholas White had been a deacon of the first church in Norton for many years, and was the first deacon of the church in the North Precinct. He was also one of the selectmen of Norton, a representative to the General Court, and conspicuous in all public affairs. A large boulder was erected by his descendant, Walter L. White, on the farm where he lived, commemorative of his services as a founder of the town. His will, dated August 8, 1743, was proved October 3, 1743. The executors were his sons, Nicholas and Jacob. You are therefore carefully and diligently to discharge the duty of a Second Lieutenant in leading, ordering and exercising said Company in Arms, both inferior officers and soldiers and to keep them in good Order and Discipline; hereby commanding them to obey you as their Second Lieutenant and yourself to observe and follow such Orders and Instructions as you shall from time to time receive from Me or the Commander in Chief for the time being or other your superior officers for his Majesty's service according to military Rules and Discipline pursuant to the Trust reposed in you. Given under My Hand and Seal at Arms at Boston the fourteenth day of February in the nineteenth year of the Reign of his Majesty King George the Second Annoq: Domini 1745.

MY DEAR HUSBAND-

The thoughts of your absence doth so exceedingly effect my lone wounded soul that I want words to express the sorrow I conceive lest the cruel enemies or the raging seas should swallow up my hopes and deprive me of that which next to my immortal soul I dearly prize. Oh therefore if any tender pity lodges in that precious heart of thine be pleased to allay my fears by sending to me a letter, as I have not received one answer of all my letters which much distresses me with fears that I am deprived of the joy of my heart, the comfort of my life, but I desire to hope for the best concerning you and so shall inform you that all our children are in good health and nothing afflicts them but your absence which I for my part must confess to be very tedious:—

However, my wishes are that all your undertakings may prosper so as to be advantageous for the better and so taking my leave at this time in hopes of a more near and dearer conversation which will be to my satisfaction and so recommending you to the protection of Almighty God and wishing a prosperous expedition

and your return as soon as possible so I remain,

Abraham 4 White resided in Norton, near the Taunton line and on the Medfield road; died Feb. 20, 1801, aged 84 years, and was buried in the White burying ground, near the Medfield road. He was a representative to the General Court, a member of the Constitutional Convention of 1779 and 1780, a State senator and a member of the convention of 1788, held for the purpose of adopting the Constitution of the United States. It is said that he was somewhat eccentric, but possessed of much native talent, practical good sense and sound judgment. He was influential in all town affairs and much employed in public life. He had energy and decision of character, a ready wit, keen satire and an ability to meet any emergency. He was a soldier in the company of Major Joseph Hodges in the expedition to Cape Breton in 1745, and was at Sheepscot, Me., in 1749. He married first a daughter of John Holmes of Taunton. Philip 5 White, the progenitor of one of the branches of the Nicholas White family in Vermont, was born in Norton, Mass., July 28, 1734. Feb. 2, 1758, he was married to Abigail Campbell, daughter of Joshua and Abigail (Britton) Campbell. Abigail Campbell was born in Raynham, Mass., Sunday, Sept. 18, 1787. They were married at Norton, Mass. by Rev. Ebenezer White, pastor of the Congregational church at that place.

At some time between 1759 and 1761 Philip White removed to Woodstock, Conn., whence in 1778 he emigrated to the "Hampshire Grants," as the State of Vermont was then called, and settled on a farm in the township of Tinmouth. This farm he had purchased Jan. 4, 1776, while still a resident of Woodstock. In 1798, through the shifting of township boundaries, he became a resident

of Wallingford.

Philip White died in Wallingford, Vt., Oct. 16, 1822; his wife, Abigail, died at Wallingford in 1808 or 1804. It is much to be regretted that the date of her death cannot now be ascertained. For many weeks she was tenderly cared for by her mother, Abigail (Britton) Campbell, who, though nearly ninety years of age, was still in possession of much of her former vigor.

Philip White married a second wife, Mrs. Sally Wood, of Middletown, Vt., who survived him.

Physically, intellectually, and morally, Philip White was a man of marked characteristics.

He was of medium stature, and had a compact and firmly knit frame. Many stories are told of his agility and wonderful feats of strength. One of these possesses more than a passing interest. Two men together with a lawyer whom they had retained, met Mr. White in the office of the lawyer (probably) to arrange some matters of business. Soon after the beginning of negotiations one of the party locked the door of the office. Papers were then presented to Mr. White for his signature. He refused to sign them; they insisted, and finally coupled their requests with threats of bodily injury in case he did not yield to their demands. When Mr. White became fully convinced that he must accede to their wishes or suffer great bodily injury and perhaps death at their hands, he lost no time in coming to a decision. Throwing off his coat and cravat, he attacked his adversaries with such vigor that in the space of a few minutes, all three were begging for mercy. Although Mr. White many times told to his grandchildren the story of this encounter with the three men, it seems somewhat singular that none of them could remember the nature of the business that called the parties together. It would seem as if no trouble could have arisen in connection with any transactions in real estate made by Philip White, after his removal to Vermont. Only one plausible explanation can, in the opinion of the writer, be given, but this explanation seems to bear the marks of probabil-It has been stated that Mr. White, while still residing in Woodstock, Conn., purchased a farm in Vermont, Jan. 4, 1776. He may have intended to go to Vermont in the spring following. Early in March, however, he enlisted in the service of the Revolution, joining Co. 6th, 11th Reg. Conn. Militia. He served until December of the same year, when he returned to Woodstock. It is supposed that during the two years before his removal to Vermont, other parties had taken possession of the farm and sought to retain it by methods not unknown at the present day. The men in question probably sought to compel Mr. White to give them a quit claim deed of the farm. This physical vigor suffered no abatement during the whole period of middle life. To a friend who asked him at what age he could endure the most hardship, he made the somewhat remarkable statement: "I think that when between 55 and 60 years of age I could do more work with less fatigue than at any other period of my life."

He was a man of more than average intelligence and as he had

had considerable experience both in military and in civic life, he became a helpful factor in the development of the community in which he lived. His educational advantages were of the most meager sort, and it is not surprising that he never acquired a taste for study, nor that he had little love for books—the Bible being the one notable exception. He was, also, a man of indomitable energy and perseverance. Twice he served his country in the capacity of a soldier. A few weeks after his marriage he joined the forces under Abercrombie destined for the reduction of Ticonderoga, and was in the second line of assault composed in part of provincials from Massachusetts. The gun (fusil) which he carried in this battle and also in the campaign of 1776, is now in the possession of the writer, his great-grandson, a resident of Galesburg, Ill. This gun was made in London in the year 1741 or 1742.

In early life Philip White is said to have been of a somewhat wild and adventurous disposition. His interest in religion began in middle life. His name is not on the records of the Congregational church in Woodstock, Conn., where he lived seventeen or eighteen years, but it is certain that he was a member of the Congregationalist church in Wallingford, Vt., from the time of its organization in 1795 to the time of his decease in 1822. He at once became a most ardent advocate of the faith he had espoused. In theological belief he was a strict Calvinist, and a strenuous defender of the characteristic doctrines of the great reformer. When in later years he realized that through the preaching of Wesley, who sought to "turn all doctrinal truth into instant life," the clear cut doctrines of Calvin might suffer, at least, a partial eclipse, he regarded the new movement with extreme disfavor.

We naturally seek for the springs of that influence which leads persons of strong and imperious will, to surrender that will to the Divine leadership. We cannot fathom the inmost recesses of the human heart, but we do know that reflection has often within it a strange power of ministration. The source of that influence may have been the surviving memories of the awful carnage before the ramparts of Ticonderoga; it may have been the result of meditation on the tragic death of his first born; and it may well have been due to the tender solicitude and the subduing appeals of a loving and saintly wife. True, even after his conversion he did not always maintain a spirit of celestial temper, but he did, in great measure, repress the wild energies of his nature, he did become a God-fearing man, and he made conscience the ruling principle in the conduct of life.

Of the science of politics, Mr. White, doubtless knew little, but,

perhaps no man ever had a clearer intuition of the one absolutely essential factor in all enduring corporate life—moral soundness; and his influence must be reckoned among the constructive agencies in the development of the community in which he had cast his lot on the then frontier of civilization.

Though for many years somewhat troubled with a rheumatic affliction, he may be said to have enjoyed almost uninterrupted good health during a long life of more than eighty-eight years. In the spring of 1822, he began visibly to fail. When the end drew near he called to his bedside his grandson, Justin, who had taken much care of him during his illness, and addressed to him a few tender words, telling him that before the setting of the morrow's sun, his spirit would be mingled with other spirits good or bad.

The next morning, when Justin (the father of the writer), went to the sickroom, his grandfather looked up and said: "Justin, my son, I am still alive." These were his last words. Justin took his place beside the chair, on the other side of which his older brother Alvin, who had also been attentive to him in his illness, was already standing. While thus witnessing sufferings which they could do nothing to assuage, suddenly his countenance fell, he ceased to breathe. The man of indomitable will had bowed to the summons of death.

Martin 5 Kinsley graduated from Harvard in 1778; settled in Hardwick, and engaged in the sale of English and West India goods. About 1780 he was commissioned as one of the aids of Major General Warner and was then known as Major Kinsley. He was removed from office in 1786, probably on account of his sympathy with the Shays rebellion, against which removal he published a protest under date of Nov. 24, 1786, in the Worcester Magazine for December, page 450. The Shays party, then a majority of the town, rewarded him by electing him town treasurer six years, from 1787 to 1792 inclusive, and representative eight years from 1787 to 1796, except 1789 and 1798 when no representative was chosen. Previous to Feb. 16, 1798, he removed to Hampden, in the district of Maine, where he was actively engaged on the democratic side in tha fierce political contest which marked the commencement of the nineteenth century.

He was justice of the peace, while at Hardwick, in 1789; was recommissioned in 1802; representative from Hampden to the General Court 1801 to 1806 (except 1805); senator from Hancock County in 1814; member of executive council 1810 and 1811 and member of congress in 1819 and 1820; he was appointed justice of the court of sessions Sept. 8, 1811, and on the eighth of the following October judge of the court of common pleas for the eastern

Jacob 6 Deane was a farmer and fruit grower, and in the early part of his life a school teacher; he resided in Mansfield and lived

to a ripe old age; he died in Mansfield July 15, 1871. The following sketch of his life was written a few months previous to his death:

A Few Hours with a Nonagenarian.—Thursday, December 8th, being the day on which Mr. Jacob Deane, of Mansfield, attained the age of 90 years, we traveled a few miles to spend a few hours with him on that occasion. Although his hearing is dull and his memory of recent occurrences defective, he related many reminiscences of the olden time. He lives in the house in which he was born, that was built previous to 1728, by Deacon Samuel Deane, of Taunton, and given by him, in his will, to his son Deacon William, who gave it to his son, Deacon John, who was the father of Jacob. He contemplated, when a young man, obtaining a college education, but finally sold his Greek and Latin books, and, instead of searching for the roots of the languages in them, bought of the heirs the Old Homestead and dug out roots and rocks there, clearing field after field of brushy dingle and "deep tangled wildwood," raising large quantities of hay and grain and planting large orchards. He felt that there was a glory in the ownership of lands and houses, of cattle and woolly flocks, of wide fields and thick growing woods; even when the ownership conveys to the owner only a realization of property in the soil, and much more in it when it is written all over with the memories of old years, when the glory is the glory of race as well as of power and property. He, therefore, took hold of the plough and has not looked back from it since.

At the age of twenty Mr. Deane kept a public district school at the house of Captain Zebulon Field in the north part of Taunton. This was his first experience in teaching. During the term there was a great controversy about removing it; no place could be agreed upon. Gen. L., a prominent and wealthy man, as he could not effect the removal, was determined to break up the school entirely. He told his son, but three years younger, and quite as large as the teacher, when he went to school in the morning, if he did not whip the master before he came home he would whip him. The scholar for some turbulence was called out, he came over the seats and seized young Deane, who very quickly placed his antagonist upon his back on the floor, where he held him for some time, and told him he should not pound him there, but should whip him in a different position. Capt. Field, hearing the noise in the school room, looked in, and seeing the battle go on about as he thought was right, withdrew. Young Deane called two of the largest boys, let his scholar rise from the floor, and directed them to hold him in a position, which in ancient

days was considered by mothers the most favorable for the application of the rod to young children, when he laid a few severe stripes upon his back with a suitable stick with which he had taken care to provide himself. The father, Gen. L-, immediately prosecuted young Deane, who went to the Green and was tried before a justice. Mr. Paddelford defended him without charge, and he came off with flying colors, and a universal and enthusiastic sentiment in his favor. He returned and kept his term to the end. Several persons who were scholars there, some who have since died old men, have often spoke to us of this occurence. Rev. Mr. Pipon, of whom no one can think but as an apostle of peace, was one of the school committee at the time, and immediately after the affray, and before the trial, visited young Deane's school, talked out boldly before the whole school, approving his government, and encouraged him that he would come out right, saying in these identical words: "Don't be troubled; I will help you hoe your row; I will hoe the bean hills."

The succeeding summer young Deane attended the private academy of Rev. Calvin Chaddock (or Chadwick) in Rochester, Mass. Among the scholars were the present Deacon Eliab Byram Dean of Raynham, and Albion K. Paris, afterwards the first Governor of Maine.

Mr. Deane subsequently kept school seven or eight winters in Easton, Stoughton and Mansfield. Otis Pierce, preceptor of Bristol Academy, between 1816 and 1821, and Deacon Joseph Wilbar, the present venerable Registrar of Deeds for Bristol County, were his scholars.

Mr. Deane has always felt great interest in the cause of education and in agriculture. He has attended every exhibition of the Bristol County Agricultural Society from its commencement, and has obtained many of its premiums, almost always the first on apples when he exhibited them. He is also a member of the Central Agricultural Society of this county. We have often applied to him the maxim:—"Beware of the man of one book." He has read thoroughly a few books.

Some remark was made to him about keeping his coat so closely buttoned; he instantly said, somebody has said of some one:

"An honest man close-buttoned to the chin, Broadcloth without and a warm heart within."

Although this was a mere spark from his memory, it was a very perfect representation of himself.

Here we see an aged pilgrim, the last of his generation, filled with the pensive memories of ancient days, standing almost alone

on the river's brink, looking earnestly towards the country on the other side and waiting to go Home.

"Ninety years ago began
The life web of the strong old man;
Ninety years in sun and shade,
He his part on earth has played.

After disposing of his interest in his Providence business, Mr. Read removed to New Jersey, where he died at the age of 79 years. He was a thorough

mechanic and during his long, exemplary, and useful life was the author of a large number of useful pieces of mechanism. He was a firm friend of temperance, a kind father, a true citizen and friend, and a man whose memory will be reverend and loved by all who knew him."

"Henry lived at home until he was 23, received common school advantages, taught two terms of school when about 21, became a farmer, and also a machinist, which trade he pursued for three years in Worcester and Providence.

Mr. Read has been Whig and Republican in political belief; has as such been elected selectman and member of the Legislature (1875-76). He has been an honored and worthy citizen, stands high in the esteem of his townsmen, has discharged all trusts placed in his hands conscientiously and well, and is accounted a very liberal man, who never turns a deaf ear to suffering or to any enterprise for the betterment of humanity, or withholds pecuniary aid from any worthy object. Formerly an orthodox Congregationalist, of later years he has found great solace in its spiritual philosophy, and, supported by this faith and the ministrations of a loving wife and children, he is passing down, with much of the vigor of early manhood, contentedly towards the evening twilight of earth, in the rectitude of a life well spent, and 'with malice towards none,' leaving the rich legacy of 'a good name, which is rather to be chosen than great riches,' to his descendants. He has

a pleasant home, which has been in the family from his grand-father's days, comprising in all about two hundred acres of fertile land, and which bears the evidence of refined taste. It is worthy of special mention that neither Henry C. Read, nor any of his father's family ever used tobacco in any form or liquor of any kind."
