#### BIBLE GENEALOGY

Kings and Other Men of Faith

In the first chapter of Genesis is recorded the creation of man. Given in the fifth chapter of Genesis is the most ancient genealogical record extant, which gives the pedigree of Noah from Adam. In the first chapter of St. Matthew we have preserved for us the genealogy of CHRIST from David.

1. ADAM ("man") was created the sixth day of year 1 B.C. 4004 (according to Usher), died Anno Mundi 930 (B.C.3074) aged 930 years. EVE the wife of Adam was miraculously formed on the sixth day from material already created. Genesis 2:22.

2. SETH ("appointed"), b A.M.130 (B.C.3874) d A.M.1042 (B.C.,2962) at age of 912 years.

3. ENOS ("mortal") b A.M.235 (B.C.3769), d A.M.1140 (B.C. 2864) aged 905 years.

4. CAINAN (possessor) b A.M.325 (B.C.3679, d A.M.1235 (B.C.2769), aged 910 years.

5. MAHAHALEEL ("praise of God") b A.M.395 (B.C.3609) d A.M.1290 (B.C.2714) at age of 895 years.

6. JARED ("low ground") b 460 (B.C.3544) d A.M.1422 (B.C. 2582) aged 962 years.

7. ENOCH ("teacher") b A.M.622 (B.C.3382) never died. In the year A.M.987 (B.C.3017) Enoch at the age of 365, was translated from Earth to Heaven.

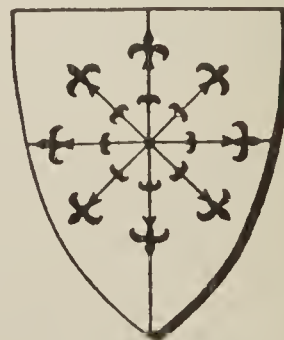

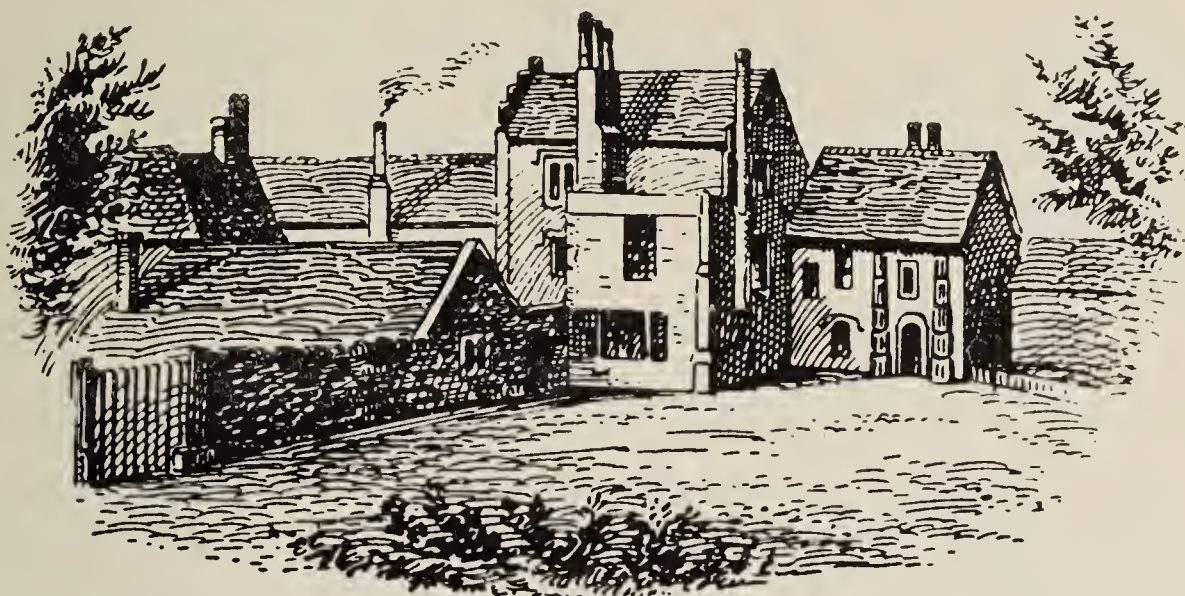

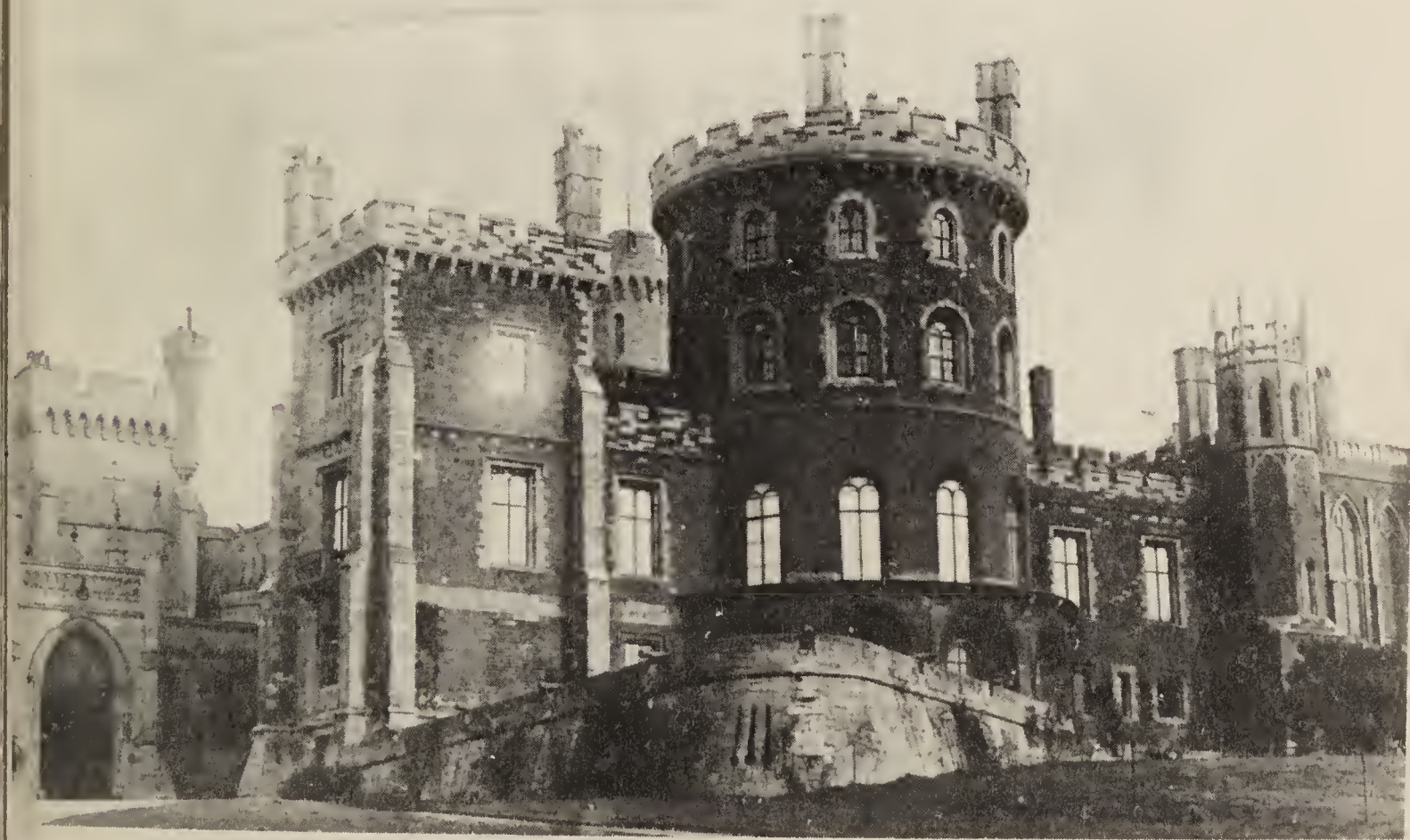

Isabel d'Albini, was a ward of the king and 17 May 1244, Bernard de Savoy and Hugh Gifford were commanded to deliver her to her husband Robert de Roos, grandson of the Surety of that name.

William d'Albini, 2nd Earl of Arundel was at the seige of Damietta in Palistine and returned thence, d 1222. M Maud, dau and heir of James St. Hillery and widow of Roger, Earl of Clare. Issue: (1) William, 3rd Earl; (2) Hugh 4th Earl; 4 daughters, one of whom was Isabel who m John FitzAlan.

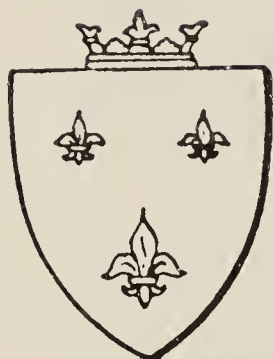

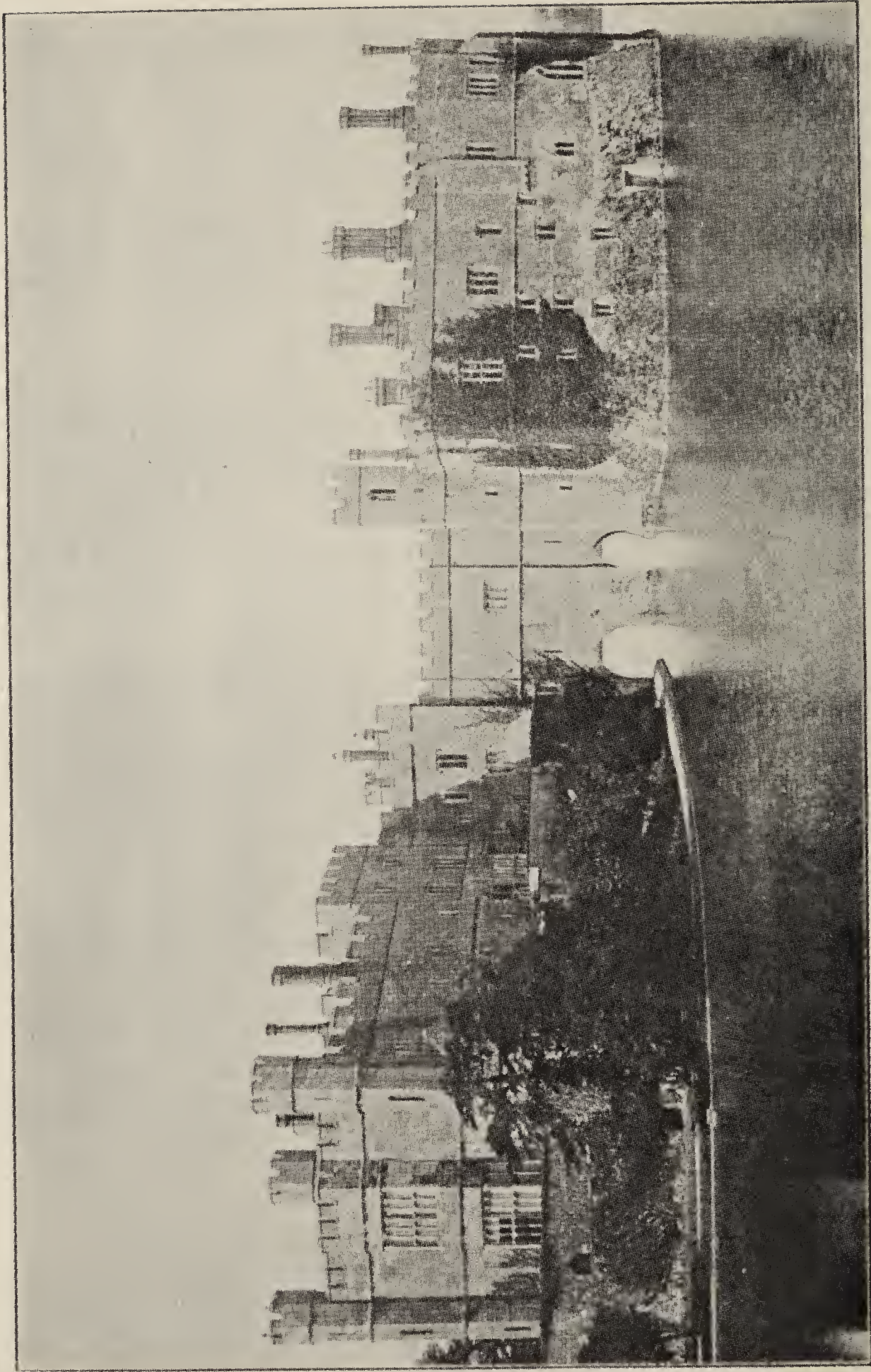

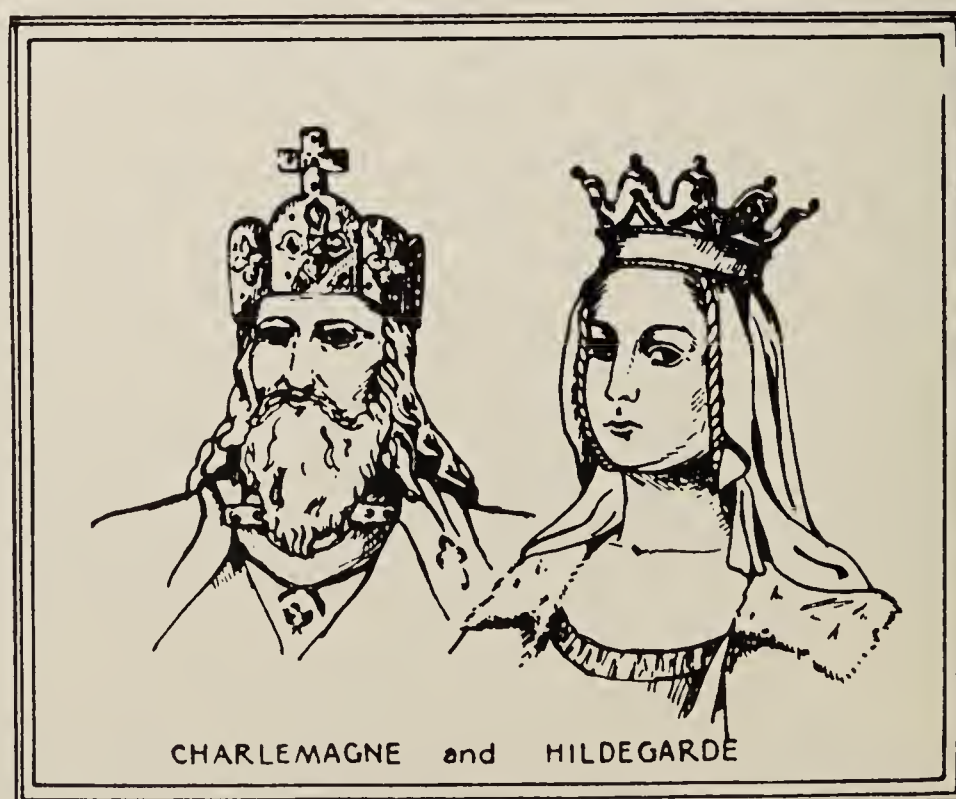

2. Charles II, the Bald, b 823, King of France 840, Emperor 875, d 878. M 842 Hermintrudis, dau of Eudes, Count of Orleans. She d 6 Oct. 869. Ch.: Judith, b 844, 2nd wife of Ethelwuld, father of King Alfred the Great. Their son,

3. Louis II, the Stammerer, King of France, b 1 Nov. 846, d 10 Apr. 879. M 2nd Adelheide, dau of Ludolph, Duke of Saxony.

4. Charles IV the Simple 879, became King of France in 893, d 7 Oct. 929. M 3rd Oct. 918 Edgina who d 948, dau of Edward the Elder King of England.

5. Louis IV, d'Outremer b 920, King of France. During his reign a war was waged with Hugh, the father of Hugh Capet. D 10 Sept. 954. M 939 to Gerberga, b 913, d 969, widow of Gislebert, Duke of Lorraine and dau of Henry I, the Fowler, Emperor of the Germans.

6. Charles, b 953, having been excluded from the throne of France, he became Duke of Lower Lorraine and while waging war for the French throne with his cousin Hugh Capet, was taken prisoner and confined until his death in 993. He m 2nd Agnes, dau of Henry, Count of Vermandois and Troyes and his wife Princess Edgina, granddaughter of King Alfred the Great.

10. Godfrey de Percy a surname derived from their possessions in Normandy and a family that flourished nearly 200 yrs. prior to the Norman Conquest.

He was also distinguished among his contemporaries by the addition of "Will with Whiskers." He founded the abbey of St. Hilda at Whitby, described in the poetical legends of Sir Walter Scott. M Emma de Port, a Saxon lady, said to have been the dau of Gospatric, the deprived Earl of Northumberland, whose lands having been bestowed upon him. 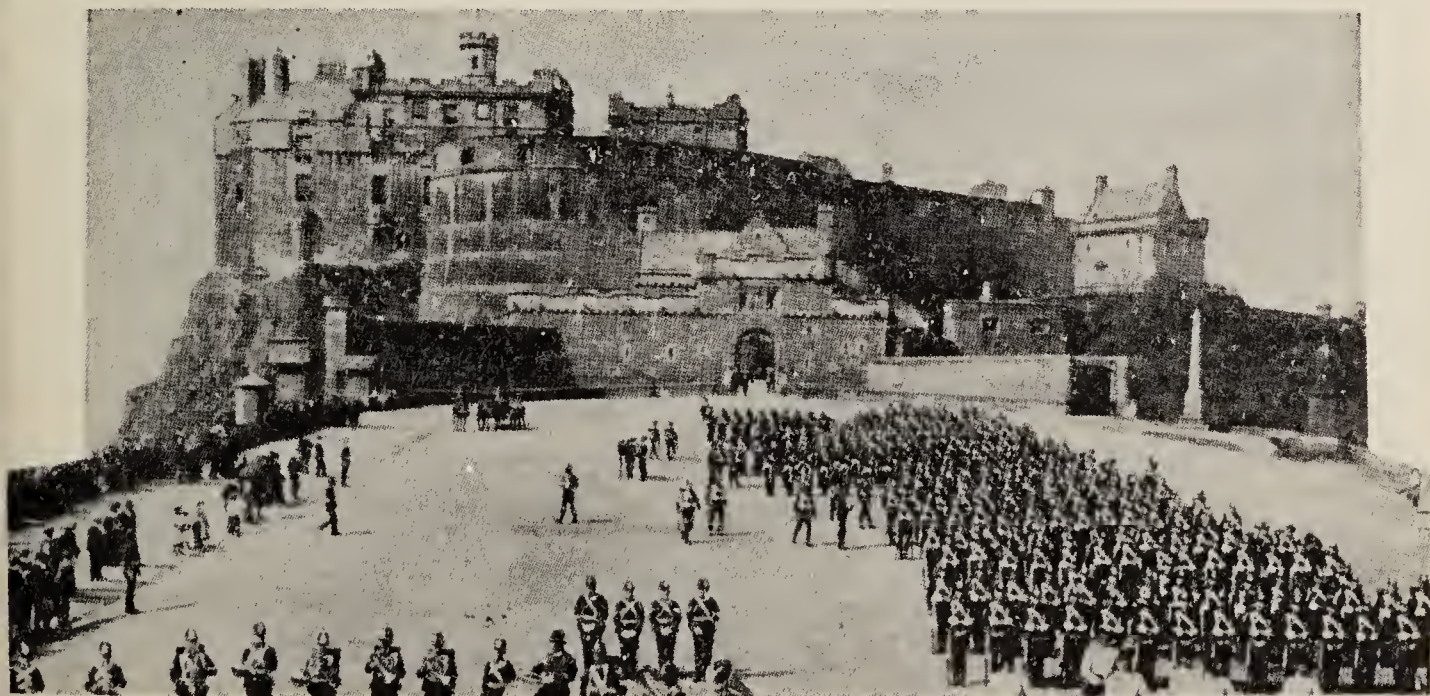

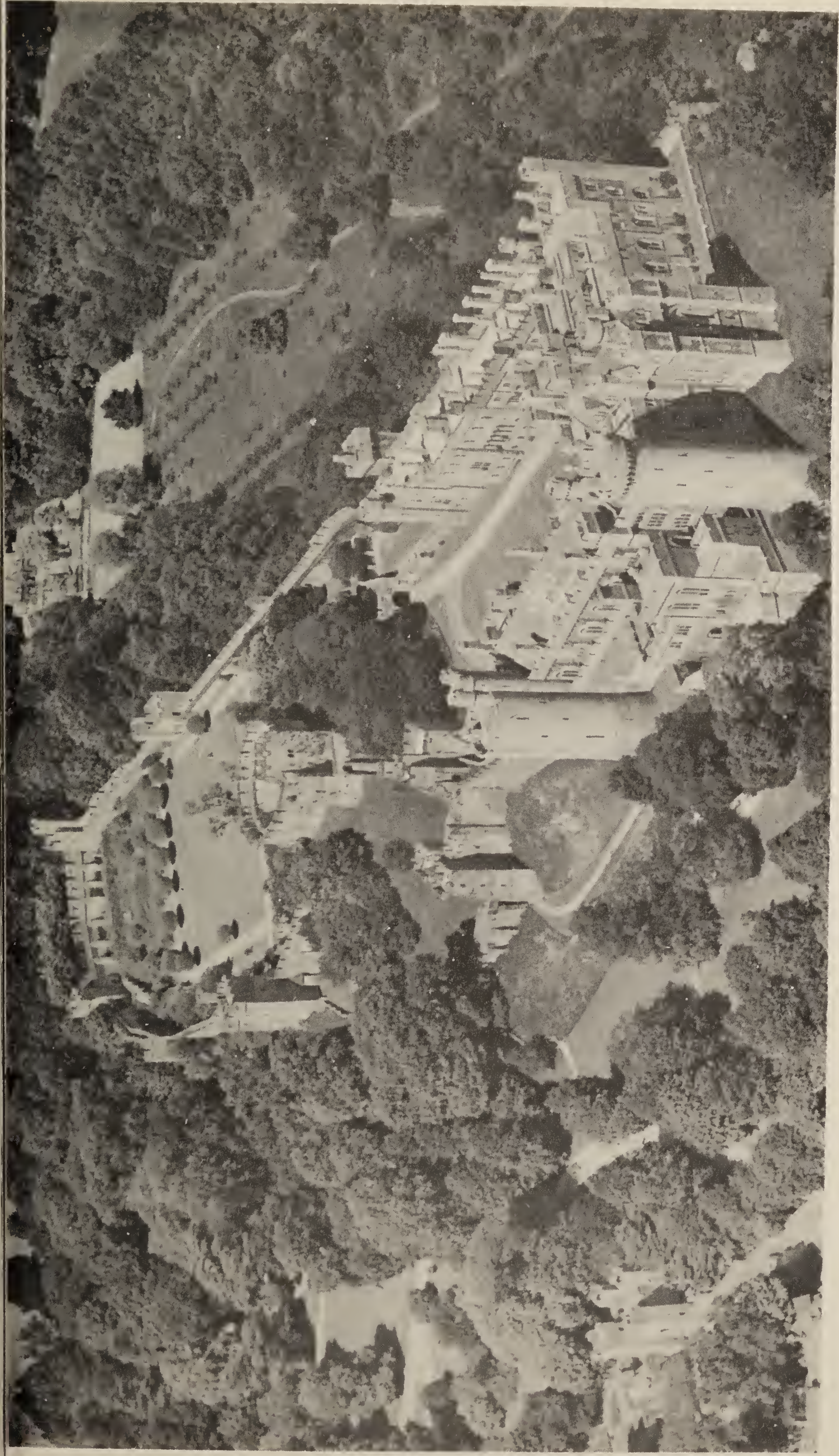

He owned Framingham Castle, which remained in the possession of his descendants many years and countless associations with some of the most distinguished figures in English history are given in Paston Letters, many of which were dated from Framingham Castle. In 1103 he founded the Abbey of Whetford in Norfolk and bur there four years later. He m Adeliza, dau of Hugh de Grantemesnil, high steward of Eng.

2. Hugh Bigod; Earl of Norfolk and Suffolk, lord high steward of the Kingdom. In 1177 as a Crusader, he made a pilgrimage to the Holy Land and d 1131. M Juliana, dau of Alberic de Vere and wife Adaliza Clare.

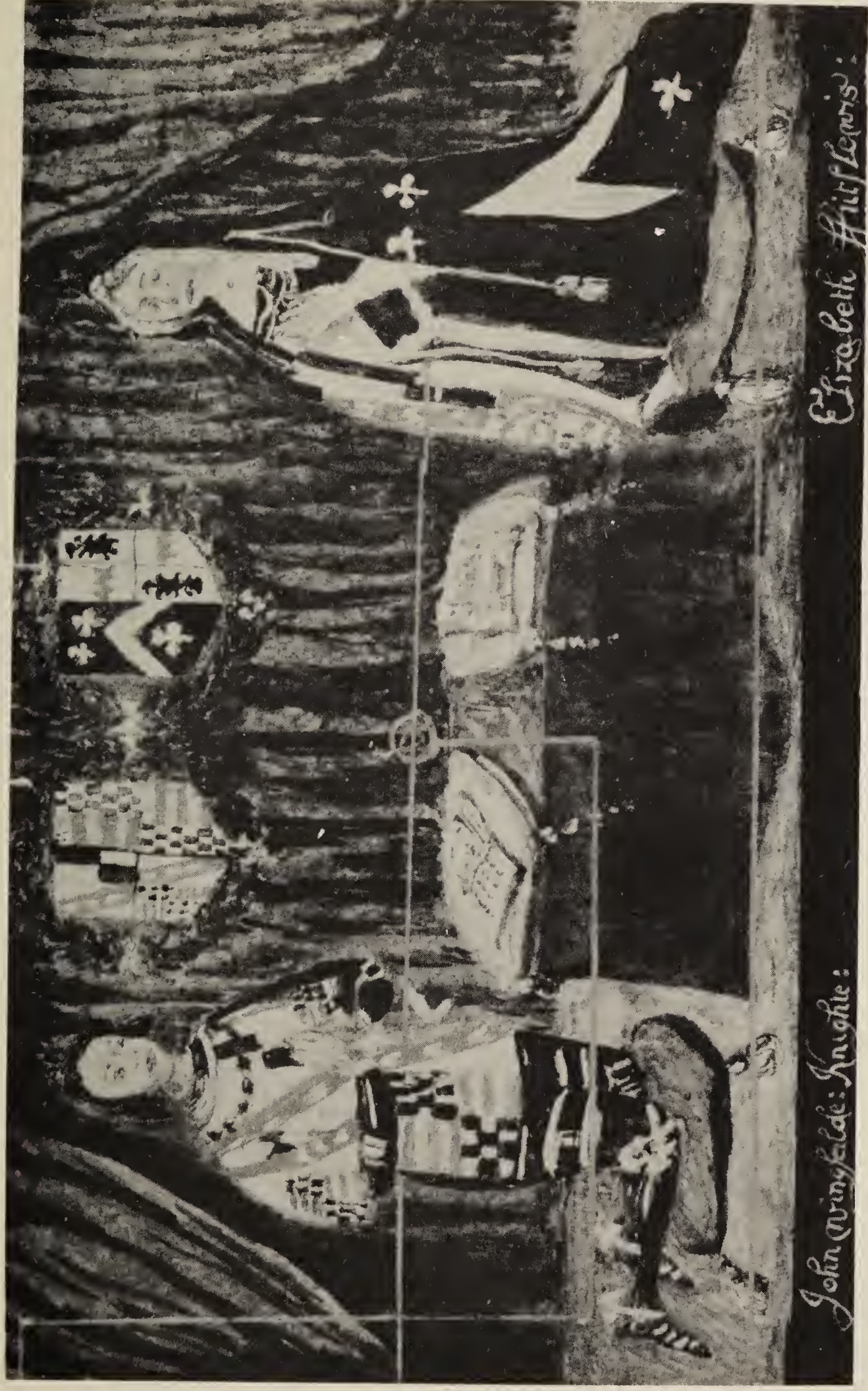

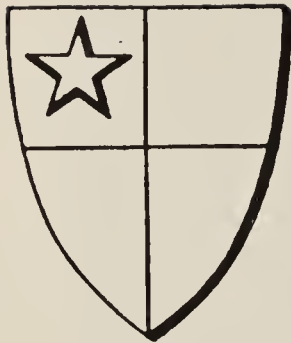

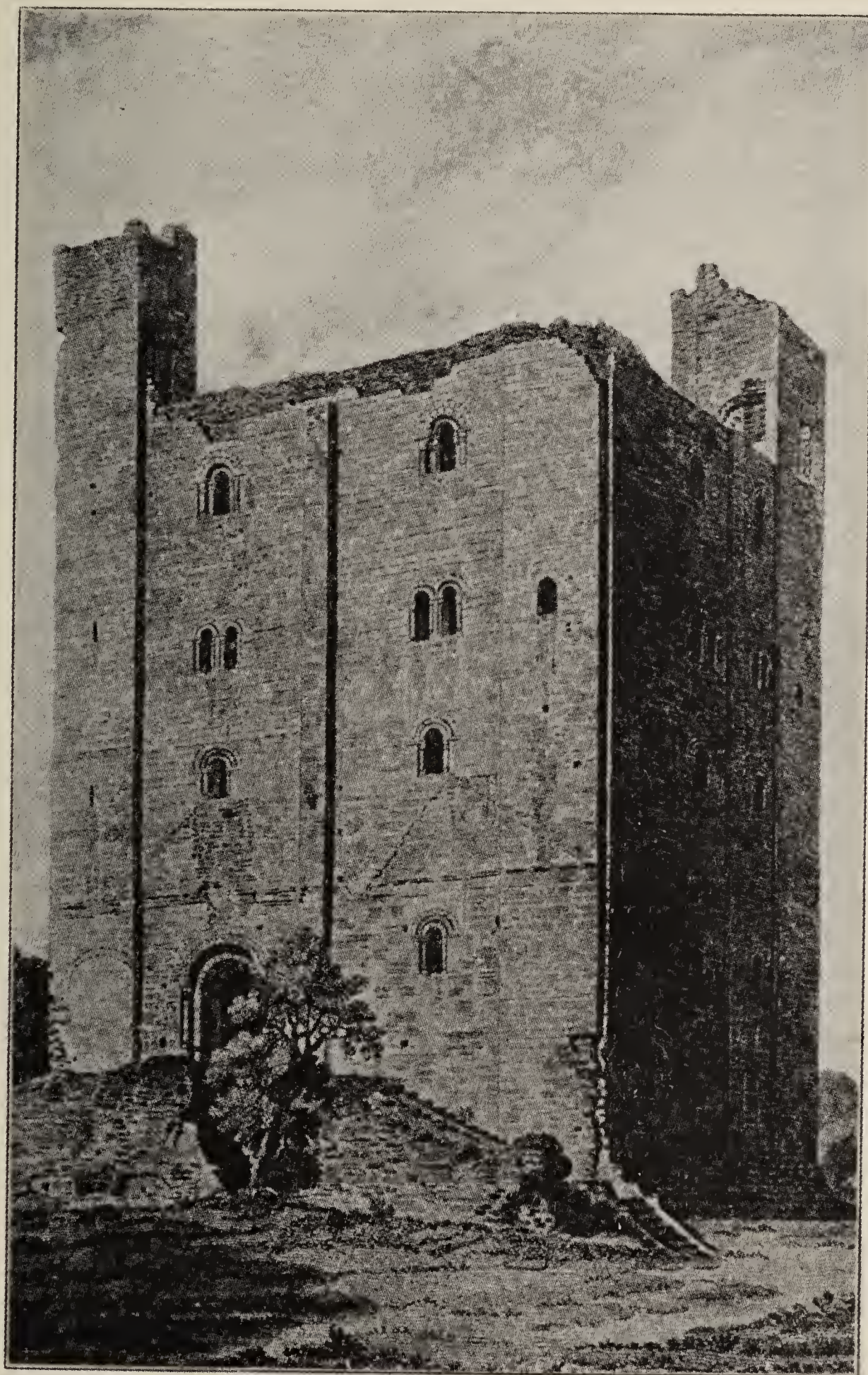

## Chapter 26

### PEDIGREE OF ISABEL DE THORPE

3. Robert Thorpe, therein called Fitz-Roger, who then held seven knights' fees in Thorge, Massingham, Anmer and elsewhere of the honor of Bononia, or Boulogne; he was sometimes styled Robert de Massingham (Hist., co. Norf. ut antea.) Son,

4. Hugh Thorpe de Massingham. Son,

5. John de Thorpe was also Lord of Fundenhall, Wrenningham. Bunwell, and of divers other manors in said co., m Margaret, dau of Robert and sister and co-heir to Bartholmew, Lord of Creak and Hillington, in Norfolk and the Combes of Suffolk. (Collin's Parl. Prec. p. 390). Had son,

6. Robert Fitz John de Thorpe, s and h in 1267. It is claimed that Ashwell was anciently a helmet in Thorpe and belonged to a family which had its surname from thence but was sold by Sir John de Ashwell to the Thorpes who thereupon joined the name to that of their own manor to distinguish it from other Thorps in the same co., had a charter of free-warren for his demesne lands in Thorpe, Massingham, and Funall in Norfolk; Coiton, in Suffolk, Sharpenhou, in the co. of Bedford. He was one of the King's Justices. Son,

7. John de Thorpe, s and h and a man of great eminence; had summons to Parl. as one of the barons of the realm from 2 to 19 Edward II. One of the King's Justices. (Ibid) he d circa (18 Edward II.) Had a charter for the foundation of a free chapel of St. Mary's at Ashwell in which to perform



daily services therein to the inhabitants and to pray for his own and wife's sole, also those of his ancestors and successors. Perkins asserts, he was twice m, 1st to Agnes, dau of --? and 2nd to Alice, relict of Sir Wm. Mortimor, who survived him. Issue by 1st wife,

8. Robert de Thorpe, s and heir, was about 30 yrs. old at the time of his father's d, he m Beatrix, dau of Sir Edwund or John Hengrave, d circa 1330 (4th Edward III), leaving sd. Beatrix surviving, who resided after his death at Massingham, which with North Creak, she held in jointure. Sons, John de Thorp, who d without issue and Edward.

9. Edward de Thrope, heir m Joan, dau of Robert and sister and heir to Thomas Baynard, who seized of the manors of Colkirke and Gately, in the Co. of Norfolk. D 1393 (16 Rich. II.) bur in chancel of Ash-Thorpe. Ch 2 daus and several sons.

10. Sir Edmund, Lord Thorpe, s and h was slain at siege of Lovers Castle, in Normandy in 1417 (5 Hen. V.) His body was brought over and bur in the church at Ashwell-Thorpe, under a stately tomb, where both himself and lady lie, their statues being at full length of white alabaster under a wooden canopy, ornamented with the Thrope arms and those of their respective marriages. M 1st in Oct. 1368, Margaret, dau and co-heir of Richard de la Rievriere and Maud his wife, dau of John la Breton, Lord of Sporle. M 2nd Joan, dau and heiress of Robert (or Roger) de Northwode. Dau,

2. Robert de Roos, 2nd Lord of Hamlake Manor in North Riding of Yorkshire, d 1160. M Sylbell Valoines, who m 2nd Ralph d'Albini.

3. Everard de Roos, 3rd Baron of Hamlake Manor, d 1186. M Rose (Roysia) dau and co-heiress of Wm. de Trusbut, Lord of Watre in Holderness. He was a man of importance and wealth for the time he lived. They had two sons: Robert the older and successor.

4. Robert de Roos of Fursan, 4th baron of Hamlake Manor, b 1177, Surety for Magna Charta, erected the castles of Helmesley in Yorkshire and Werke in Northumberland, member of Knights Templar, d 1226-7, bur in the Knights' Church in London, where his tomb can be seen and is claimed to be the most elegant of all figures in the Temple Church. He m Isabel, dau of William the Lion, King of Scotland and widow of Robert Bruce.

5. William de Roos, 5th Baron of Hamlake Castle by tenure. He became sole heir of Baronial estate of Trusbut in Walthre when two sisters of his grandmother Rose Trusbut d without issue. He d in 1258. M Lucia, dau of Reginald FitzPiers of Blewllevey in Wales.

6. Robert de Roos, eldest son and successor, 6th Baron of Hamlake Castle, d 16th June 1285. M Isabel, d 1301 (widow of John FitzAlan, Lord of Clan, who d in 1240) and dau of William de Albini IV Earl of Arundel, III Earl of Sussex and wife Mabel, sister and co-heir of Ranulf, according to Yeateman.

7. William de Roos, Lord Roos, Giv. of Werke, b 1255, d 1316. M Maud (Matilda) dau of John Vaux.

8. Agnes Roos, m Payne, son of Robert de Tibetot and wife Eva, dau of Pain (Payne) Chaworth. In 1278 King Edward I, granted to Robert de Tibetot the Manor of Nettlestead,

d 1297. Payne Tibetot was summoned to Parliament as a Baron from the 10th of March 1308 to 26th of Nov., 1313, Gov. of Northampton Castle. Slain 1314 at Battle of Strivelin.

9. John Tibetot, 2nd Baron served in wars of France and Scotland, Gov. of Berwick-upon-Tweed in 1346, sum. to Parl. 1335 to 1366. M 1st Margaret, 4th dau of Bartholomew, Lord Badlesmere of Leeds Castle and wife Margaret Clare. D 1367.

10. Robert, Lord Tibetot of Bently near Doncaster and Castle Combe, Wilts and was ancestor of Scropes of Castle Combe, 3rd Baron, sum to Parl., 1367-1371. M Margaret, dau of William, Lord Deicount and wife Alice Neville. He d 13th Apr. 1372, leaving three daughters (minors) in ward to Richard Scrope, 1st Lord Scrope of Bolton.

11. Margaret Tibetot the oldest dau, m Roger, Lord Scrope of Bently.

12. Jane Scrope, m Thomas Brewse, Knight of Topcroft Hall, Norfolk and Wenham Parva, who d 6th Nov. 1514.

13. Margaret Brewse, m Sir Philip Tilney, Knt. of Shelly, co. Suffolk. For their descendants, see Chapter 28.



## Chapter 28

### TILNEY



Tilney

The TILNEY (TYLNEY) family is of Norman origin, but derives its name from the town of Tilney in the Co. of Norfolk and one of the most ancient of Knights' degree in England.

1. Frodo, the first of the family, came into England in the reign of Edward "The CONFESSOR" and held many lordships in Suffolk and Norfolk at the time of the Norman survey. He gave lands to Bury Abbey, which were confirmed by William the Conqueror. Baldin the brother of Frodo, was a monk of St. Denys in France but later the third abbot of Bury St. Edmund's and during his abbacy of 32 yrs. he rebuilt the Abbey church with Stone.

2. Alan, Eldest son of Frodo de Tilney, lived in the reign of Stephen.

3. Adam de Tilney had large possessions in Marshland, in Norfolk in the reign of Henry II. His eldest son was Baldwin de Tilney from whom descended the Tilneys of Marshland. Temp Henry II.

4. Sir Frederick de Tilney, Knt., was a man of more than ordinary strength and Statue and had his chief res. in Boston, England. He attended King Richard I., Anno 1190 into the Holy Land, was with him at the siege of Acon, where he is said to have performed prodigies of valor and was there knighted for his services. Returning home he spent the remainder of his life at Torrington in Norfolk, where he was bur.

5. Sir Philip de Tilney, Knt., Temp., Edward I (1272-1307).

6. Sir Frederick de Tilney, Knt., of Boston, Eng. in the reign of Edward II (1307-1327) and Edward III (1327-1377). M Margaret, dau of Sir John de Rochford. She is conjectured to be the Maude Tilnay who was a principal contributor to the

building of the church "And layid the first stone of the steppille." By Leland.

7. Sir Philip de Tilney, Knt., 3rd son, temp. Henry IV (1399-1413), m Lady Grace, dau and heiress of Robert Rosse, Knt. of Gedney.

8. Sir Frederick de Tilney, Knt. of Boston, Eng., m Margaret, dau and coheiress of Sir John Rocheforde and wife, dau of Richard Rosse. 1406 Frederick merchant of Boston, Eng. and wife Margaret Tilney had an annual orbit on the last day of May. "They gave to this Guild many goods, jewels, ornaments, vestments and gold and also lands and tenaments called Hemerycotes with Amortization to sustain the orbit in a liberal manner forever."

9. Sir Philip de Tilney, Knt. of Boston, Eng. (mem. of Guild 1423) m Isabel, dau of Sir Edward de Thorp, Knt. of Ashwell Thorp Norfolk and wife Joan de Northwold, d 1415. Sir Philip and Isabel de Tilney (Leland says) were the parents of 3 sons and 12 daughters. Sir Philip was a wealthy man for those times; he left to his oldest son Sir Frederic Tilney property worth at that time 700 marks a year; Robert Tilney 2nd son had £100 a year left him by his father arising from lands in Cambridgeshire; Sir Hugh Tilney had lands worth £1000 a year at Boston, Eng. and the neighborhood; Leland says also, "Old Sir Philip bestowed his 12 daughters so well that the least married a man of £XL lands." Sir Frederick heir and oldest son, d 1550, bur Ashwell Thorpe, m Elizabeth, dau and h of Lawrence Cheney, Esq. of Ditton, Cambridgeshire. Their dau Elizabeth Tilney m 1st Sir Humphrey Bouchier, s and h of Lord Berners, their son John Lord Berners. She m 2nd as 1st wife, Thomas Howard, Duke of Norfolk and had 8 sons and 3 daus. The oldest dau Elizabeth, m Sir Thomas Boleyn, parents of Anne Boleyn the mother of Queen Elizabeth and one of the wives of King Henry VIII had beheaded.

10. Sir Hugh de Tilney, Knt. habuit terras ad valor' 100 libror juxta Boston in com. Lincolnshire. M Margaret, dau of Walter Talbois of Boston, co. Lincolnshire. Had dau Agnes, d May 1514 m 17 Aug. 1497, the 2nd wife of Thomas Howard, K.B., K.G. 2nd Duke of Norfolk. Hugh de Tilney and wife Margaret Talbois had son,

11. Sir Philip Tilney, Knt. of Shelly, Co. Suffolk, m 1st Margaret dau of Thomas Brewse, Knt. of Topecroft Hall and wife Jane dau of Sir Richard (or Robert) Scroope, Knt.

of Bently. Had 2 ch Thomas, eldest son and heir and Philip. M 2nd Joan, dau of Thomas Tey and wife Margaret, relict of John Fincham. They had son Edmand, d 1600. M 3 Elizabeth, dau and heir of Jeffery of Stansfield, co. Suffolk. Ch. 3 Katharine, Elizabeth and Ann. Sir Philip Tilney, d 8th Jan. 1533, 1 P.M. (26 Hen. VIII) aged 66 yrs. Will made 8 Dec. 1532, proved 8th Oct. 1533. Dame Margaret Tilney listed with those bur at Shelley Church.

12. Thomas de Tilney, of Shelley, will proved 14th June 1559, m Margaret, dau of --? Barret (or Berrett). From Thomas the Manor passed to his grandson Philip, son of Frederick Tilney. On 11 Aug. Philip entertained his kinswoman, Queen Elizabeth. When Philip d, the Manor passed to his 1st cousin and heir.

13. Emery de Tilney of Hoxton, m Winifred, dau of John Dangers (or Davies) of Crancroke, Kent, d 1606.

14. Thomas de Tilney of Shelley, m Elizabeth (bur at Shelley 11 April, 1646) dau of Anthony Gosnold of Greendisburth and Copton in Suffolk. Will of Thomas proved 1620.

15. Frederick de Tilney, m Mary Rochford of the Manor of Walpole, near Wisbech, Norfolk.

16. John de Tilney, m Alice Holland of East Tuddenham.

17. John Tilney, b 1618, Eng. d Northampton Co., Va. in 1701. He was sent from Eng. by the English crown as a collector of ports in 1648 and settled in Accomac, Va. See American records.



## Chapter 29

### WINGFIELD



Wingfield

The ancient knightly family of Wingfield was seated at Wingfield Castle in the County of Suffolk, England, antecedent to the Conquest. Camden writes "They were famous for their knighthood and gentility." They produced among others, two renowned companions of the "Order of the Carter" in the reign of King Henry VIII.

10. Sir Robert Wingfield de Letheringham, Member of Parliment for Suffolk in 1428; received honor of Knighthood from King Hen. VI, at Hereford. M Elizabeth, dau of Robert Goushill of Haveringham, co. Nott and wife Elizabeth Fitz-Alan. They had seven sons and three daughters: John, their oldest son was ancestor of Comfort Warrington, 1st wife of Lewis Davidson. Henry the 7th son of Sir Robert Wingfield and wife Elizabeth Goushill was ancestor of Elizabeth Claypoole the 2nd wife of Lewis Davidson.

11. John Wingfield of Letheringham, K.B., d 1481, sheriff of Norfolk and Suffolk in 1444 and again in 1472, m Elizabeth dau of John FitzLewis and his wife Elizabeth, dau of Robert Nevill. They had twelve sons and four daughters.

12. Katharine Wingfield, 3rd dau, m Robert Brewse de Wenham co. Suffolk, d Dec. 7, 1513, see Chapt. 25 for Brewse.

13. Thomas Brewse, Knt. of Topcroft Hall, Norfolk and Wenham Parva, m Jane, dau of Roger Scrope of Bently and wife Margaret Tibetot, eldest dau of Robert, Lord Tibetot and Bently and wife Margaret Deicount.

14. Margaret Brewse, m Sir Philip Tilney, Knt. of Shelly, co. Suffolk. For descendants see Pedigree Tilney.

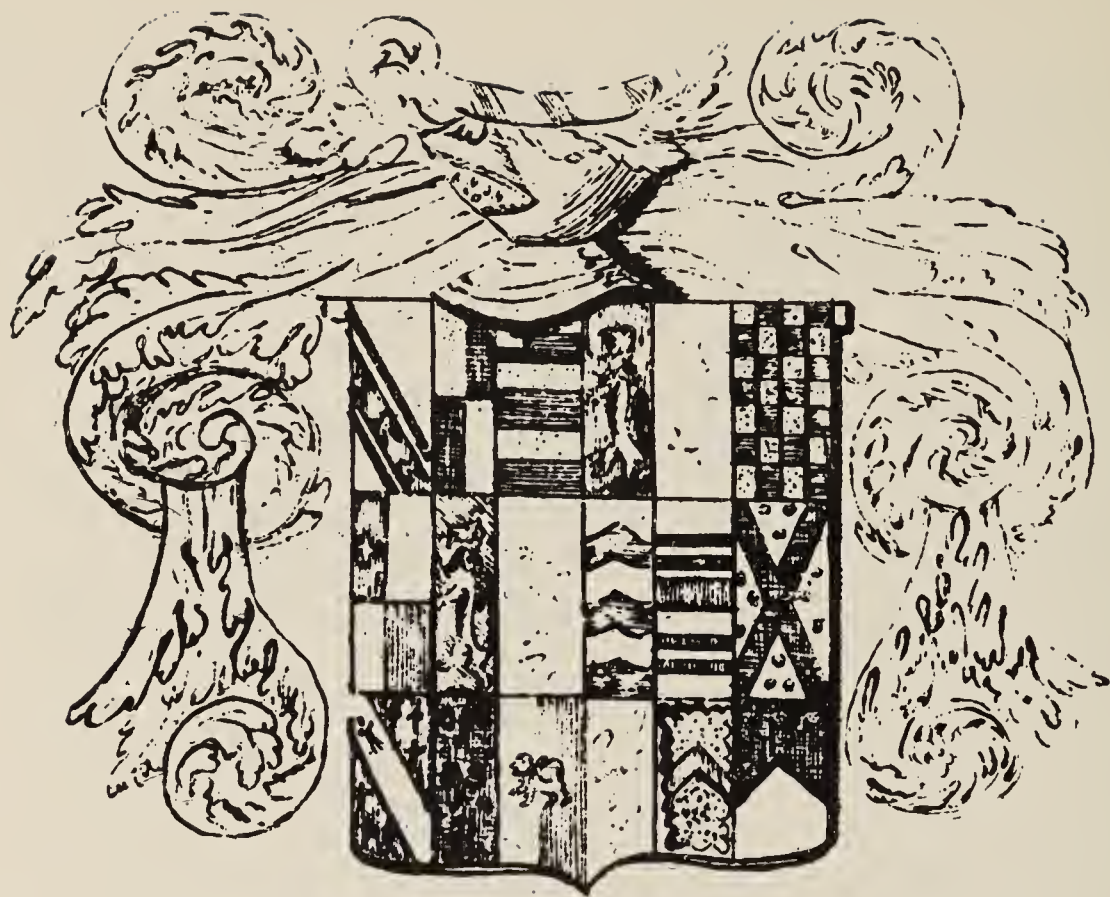

### PEDIGREE OF ELIZABETH CECIL

1. Robert Sitsilt, assisted Robert Fitzhamon in the conquest of Glamorganshire, temp. King William, 1091 and had for his service the manor of Altorennnes, co. Hereford.

Glomorgan, son and heir, was slain at the seige of Wallingford Castle, having then on, a vestment with his arms or ensigns in needlework, as they afterwards appeared on the tomb of his descendant, Gerald, in the abby of Dore and were awarded to his grandson, Sir John, in a controversy with Sir Wm. Fakenham.

3. John Sitsilt, s and h, m Maud, dau of --? de Frennes, being taken prisoner at the seige of Lincoln, he was obliged to sell Beauport to pay four hundred marks for his ransom.

4. Eustace Sitsilt, s and h, m Eleanor, dau of Sir Walter Penbridge, Knt.

5. Sir Baldwin Sitsilt, Knt., s and h, m 1st dau of Sir Maurice de Brampton and mother of his heir. Knighted by King Henry II, and slain at the siege of the Castle of Cardiff.

6. Gerald Sitsilt, s and h, m Mable, dau of Sir William Moigne, Knt.

7. Robert Sitsilt, s and h, m Alice, dau of Sir Robert Tregoz, Knt.

8. James Sitsilt, s and h, m Isabel, dau of Sir John Knell Knt.

9. Gerald Sitsilt, s and h, m 4 times, m 1st Margaret, dau of Stephen de la Bere, mother of his heir. Bur at the Abbey of Dore, under a tomb having thereon the arms of his ancestor, Sir James Sitsilt of Beauport, above mentioned.

10. John Sitsilt, s and h, m Sibil, dau of Robert de Ewyas.

11. Sir John Sitsilt, s and h, between whom and Sir Wm. Fakenham a fierce contention arose at Halidon Hill, 1333, respecting the arms above alluded to which were adjudged to Sir John by a commission from King Edward III, who forbad a single combat on the occasion and are still borne by the



noble families of Exeter and Salisbury. He m Alice, sister of Sir Robert Baskerville and was living in 1337.

12. John Sitsilt, Esq., s and h, m Joan, dau of Sir Richard Mornington, Knt.

13. Sir Thomas Sitsilt, s and h, m Margaret, dau and heir of Sir Gilbert Winston, Knt.

14. Richard Sitsilt, Esq., s and h, m Margaret, dau of Sir John Philip, Knt.

15. Philip Sicelt (as the name was then written), m Maud, dau and heir of William Philip Vaughan of Tilliglase and wife Wenlian, grand-daughter maternally of Richard, Lord Talbot.

16. David Cyceel, 2nd son purchased in Lincolnshire and settled at Stamford. He was sergeant at arms and steward of the king's manor, Coli Weston, co. Northampton, Sheriff of that Co. 1531.

17. Richard Sicelt, Sitselt or Syssel, for thus did he spell the name, was s and h, page and groom in 1516 of the wardrobe of King Henry VIII, in 1530 constable of Warwick Castle. In 1540 (written by Burley) he had a grant of 299 acres in St. Martis, Stamford, the site of St. Michael's Priory near Stamford; In 1544 purchased the manor of Esyngdon, co. Rutland, hence the title to his grandson of Cecil of Essendon, m Jane, dau of Wm. Heckington of Bourn, co. Lincoln.

18. Elizabeth Sicelt, 2nd child and sister of Lord Treasurer Cecil, m 1st, Robert Wingfield, Esq. See pedigree Wingfield.

19. ## Chapter 31

### III. AMERICAN ANCESTRY

#### HENRY BAGWELL.

1. HENRY BAGWELL, our earliest ancestor to America, (Roger Bagwell's Muster), in the "Deliverance" 1608. Mentioned in the Journal of Council and General Court, page 180. Listed under Ancient Planters in Cavaliers and Pioneers, page XXViii.

Another version of the voyage of Henry Bagwell to Virginia, furnished by Mrs. Minnie G. Cook, founder of the order of "First Families of Virginia, 1607/1620," will bear repeating.

On June -, 1609 a fleet of seven vessels left the shores of England for Chesapeake Bay, Va. On July 25th, St. James' Day they ran into the "taile of a hurracanne" that sent a small vessel to the bottom and wrecked the big new Flagship, the Seaventure, at Bermuda. This ship carried all the officers who were sailing to Va. to take over the Colony under the new form of government as called for in the New Virginia Charter of 1609. Fortunately those on the Seaventure were able to reach shore alive due to the excellent seamanship of Capt. Newport who guided the vessel between two big rocks that held her and prevented her from being dashed to pieces on that rough shore. With what they were able to salvage from the wreck, they were able to build two small pinnaces, large enough to carry the passengers and crew upwards, of two hundred all told, together with enough provisions to take them to the mainland, where they finally arrived after being marooned forty weeks at Bermuda. The two boats built at Bermuda were the Deliverance and the Patience and reached Jamestown in May, 1610.

Henry Bagwell had 50 acres patented to him in the Corporation of Charles City where he was living in 1624-5. Va. Mag. of History 16:9.

Hotton's Original Lists of Persons of Quality who went from Great Briten to American Plantation, page 170, Feb. 16th 1623. At West and Sherlow, Henry Bagwell, Thomas Bagwell.

Thomas Bagwell (said to be a bro. of Henery) "an Ancient Planter" Burgess for Pasbehey in the Corporation of James City in 1629. Time of coming cannot be determined. He had the following Patents:

Henry Bagwell appears in Accomac Co., Va. in 1629 as a Member of the House of Burgesses from that Co., Mar. 1629-30 and Sept. 1632. Va. Mag. of Hist. 5:339-340. He was also the first Clerk of the County Court in 28th Nov. 1636, named as a "Viewer of Tobacco Crop" in Accomac Co., 1638. Va. Mag. Vol. 5- page 119.

Henry Bagwell, Member of the Vestry, Mr. Cotton, Rector, 20th May, 1636(1-53) Mr. Cotton was the first minister of Hungars Parish, established in 1634, Rebuilt in 1690 and located near the old village Bridgetown.



In the name of God Amen. I Francis Stockley, bequeath my soul to God and my body to the Earth from whence it came.

I give to my beloved wife Three Cows and four Steers and I doe give to my Daughter Ann Stockley towe Cows and three steers And I give to my Sone John Stokely Three Cows and three Steers.

If in case that any of these children should dye then y<sup>e</sup>estate should be equalye divided between y<sup>e</sup>other twoe. And if in case that it please God to will all Three of these children then the Estate faleth to the Mother her disposing I do give unto my beloved wife. I do give unto my beloved wife the best Bedd the Curtains and Valence and all that belongeth to it.

I doe give unto my Daughter Frances Stockley one bedd and to my Daughter Ann Stockley one bedd. And I give unto my sonne my gunn and the first calf that falleth from coves and my Daughter Ann her coves the next year. I give to my Daughter Frances Stockley.

I do give unto my Godsonne Francis Willymans one cown Caffé the next year (that cove calfe that my brother Jn<sup>o</sup> oweth mee) I give unto his sonne William Stockley.

I give unto my beloved wife all moveables and all things that belongeth unto me. And I give unto my well beloved wife the plantation to manage her lifetime And after her decease it shall return unto my sonne Jno. Stockley And after the death of the sd. Richard Whooton deceased the remainder of the estate is to be equally divided between said Jno. Stockley And his sister Frances Stokley.

This is my last will and unrevokable.

In the Name of God Amen. I John Tilney of Nasswaddox in the County of Northampton, Gent. being at present in health of body and sound of minde and memory praise be God for the Same: Doe make and declare this my last will and Testament in manner and forme following:

Impris - I bequeath my Sole to God that gave it hoping that by the meritts of Jesus Christ my blessed Savior to obtaine A pardon for all My Sins and A glorious Resurrection at the last day And my body to the Earth to bee decently buried at the discretion of my Executor hereafter Named:

Item - I give to my Daughter Ann, wife of Richard Drumond one Shilling.

Item - I give unto my Son John Tilney one Shilling.

Item - I give unto my Daughter Margaret Moore the wife of John Moore the plantation whereon I formerly lived containing Two hundred Acres (more or less) At the head of A Branch of Naswadox Creeke to her and her heirs forever; Withall houses, fences, Orchards, pastures, woods, Underwoods, Tember, tembertrees, Moores, Marshes, water, Watercourses, all other Appurtenances thereunto belonging or in anywise Appertaineinge.

Item - I give unto my Two Daughters Mary and Martha Tilney one hundred Acres of land which I formerly gave my Son Thomas Tilney deceased and one shilling A peece Likewise.

Item - I give unto my Son in law John Moore my malotto boy Kettle during my natural life: And if I shall chance to dye betweene the first of March and the last of November that then he shall quietly possess the said boy til he hath finished his Cropp and then the Said boy to return to my son John Tilney if he be living to serve out the rest of his time According to order of Court. And if in case my son John Tilney shall dye before his time be Expired then the said boy to serve the remainder with my son John Moore.

Lastly-All the rest of my Estate Reall and Personall (My debts and legacies being first paid) I doe give and bequeath to my son in law John Moore-whome I doe ordaine and Appointe my whole and sole Executor Accordinge to this my Will: Revoking, makeinge Void and Annihilatinge All former Wills and bequeaths be me either made or spoken and this only to stand and be for and as my last Will and Testament and Nare other: For Confirmation whereof I have hereunto sett my hand and Affixed my

In the name of God Amen, I William Warrington of County aforesaid, yeoman, being sick weak in body but of sound and perfect mind and memory, thanks be given to Almighty God for the same, calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing it is appointed to all men once to Die have made an appointed this my last will and Testament in form and manner following, but first of all I reccomend my Soul unto the hands of God who gave it and my body to the earth to be buried in a Christian Manner at the Discretion of my Executrix hereafter named and as for such worldly goods which it has pleased God to bless me with in this life, I give devise and dispose of the same in form and manner following:

Item.- I give and bequeath to my three sons, to wit-William John and Joseph Warrington and the three children of my daughter Tilney, Deceased- to each and every one of them One Shilling Sterling Cash to be paid to them soon after my decease, to them and their heirs forever.

Item- I give and bequeath to my two sons to wit, Benjamin and Thomas Warrington all that tract of Land and Plantation wherein I now reside to be by them equally divided Quantity and Quality at the discretion of my two sons William and John Warrington and also some land to be taken up by Warrent in the Surveyors Office all of which Land and premises aforesaid I give to my two sons as aforesaid provided they shall pay and discharge all my just debts. I give and bequeath to my two sons as aforesaid Benjamin and Thomas Warrington to their heirs and assings forever.

Item- I give and bequeath to my loving wife Mary One third part of my moveable Estate and also one yoke of Oxen and one new pair of cart wheels and all Hogs on the plantation between my wife and son Thomas Warrington aforesaid.

Item- I give and bequeath to my Daughter Comfort's two children, Viz, William and Lewis Davidson to each of them One Shilling Sterling to be paid soon after my decease.

Item- I give and bequeath to my Grand Daughter, Tilney Warrington one Gold ring Twenty Shilling piece to be paid soon after my decease.

Item- I give and bequeath to my three daughters, viz, 1 Susanah Verden Vallace and Anna Warrington to thirds of all my moveable estate not

before given and bequeathed to be paid to my daughters as aforesaid soon after my decease.

Item- I give and bequeath to my two Grandsons both Williams and the son of John Warrington and son of Benjamin Warrington Ten Shillings each be paid and each of them one pair of Silver Shoe Buckles to be paid by my Execitrix out of my moveable estate before Divission.

Item- I give and bequeath to my loving wife Mary my mare and the Colt she goes with, I give and bequeath to my son Thomas to be by them immediately possessed and enjoyed.

Item- And whereas there was by me a tract of Land sold some time past to Robert Hopkins which Land was taken up by me and Benjamin Stokely lying in Woster County on the head of Branch called "Sheety's Branch" and by name of Warrington Choice, the right being made in my name but sold by us both as partners but not having opportunity to make Deeds for the same Do Give and bequeath the afr-sd Land and premises thereto belonging to my beloved friend Robert Hopkins afs-d his heirs and assigns forever to be by him freely possessed and enjoyed acknowledging myself to have received full satisfactions for the same. ## Chapter 36

### WILLIAM DAVIDSON, EMIGRANT, AND ELIZABETH --

The facts concerning the earlier generations of the Davidsons are meager. William Davidson, Sr., the emigrant and covenantor and called by tradition Scotch-Irish, possibly came here from Ireland where hundreds of persons had gone to escape religious persecution.

1<sup>1</sup>. WILLIAM DAVIDSON, b in Scotland and undoubtedly came from the clan of Davidsons, at one time very powerful. All accounts agree that they are descendants of David Dhu, Black David, but they do not agree who David was. Shaw makes him the youngest bro. of Gilli-Cattan, third in descent from Gilli-Cattan Mor. The Machintoshes account describes him as son of Slane, 2nd dau of Eva, wife of Angus, b 1268, d 1345, m 1291-2. The Macphersons account is that he was the youngest son of Murdich 4th in descent from Gilli-Cattan. It is not perhaps of much importance which of the accounts is correct as in any case the Davidsons were either of the old or later Clan Chattan.

The Davidsons are Celtic. Their Pipe Music is "Tulloch's Salute." Their Badge, boxwood; their home, like that of the Cumins, was in Badenoch.

The history of the clan is interesting, portraying close affiliations and intrepid against a foe and an invincible fighting spirit which never knew defeat.

In one noted contest where they were outclassed in strength (or intrigue, as is claimed), twenty-nine Davidsons were killed with only one escaping unharmed. Through him the story goes the clan was held together and the family line maintained.

From Antiquarian Notes by Charles Fraser Mackintosh:

Shaw, whose work will always be looked on with respect is nevertheless often wrong. He makes the combatants to be Macphersons and Davidsons and that it arose from the jealousies and heartburnings caused by the decisions of Mackintosh as Capt. of Clan Chattan in favor of the Davidsons forming the right of battle of Invernahavan. He also describes Mackintosh as umpire and it might be sufficient in

answer to Shaws hypothesis to say that Mackintosh as Capt. could easily control disputes between two of the tribes of Clan-Chattan.

Tulloch in Ross-shire, is the residence of the Chief. He is the hereditary Keeper of the Royal Castle of Dingwall.

William Davidson the Emigrant, b in Scotland and there lived until he was grown, m and had ch. It is claimed they went from Scotland to Ireland where they remained but a short time before coming to America. Apparently Elizabeth was his first wife and the mother of William 2nd, who also was of Somerset Co., Md.

As given in the letters of Rev. Lewis Hutchinson Davidson, there were four or more sons of William and his first wife, but the name of one son, William only, was given.

James Davidson bought land in Sussex Co. Del. in 1735 on Indian River near the land of William Davidson 2nd, and thought to have been a brother of William 2nd. James d in 1744, leaving two children, William and Ann and wife Mary (Ayers) Wharton (widow) who had a son Charles Wharton.

William, son of James, descendants later settled in Pa. and perhaps thought by descendants to have come direct from Ireland.

Robert Davidson had land on the North side of Laws Pond at the head of Braceys branch in Sussex Co. Del.- surveyed by Shankland, 1719. This land located near that of William 2nd.

David Davidson, perhaps the son of William, 1st, was living in Kent Co., Md. in 1695 N.f.r.

After the death of the first wife and when very old William, 1st m 2nd a young woman and they had children. One day he went to the woods to see about fire-wood, telling his wife he would be gone but two or three hours. He was never again heard from or seen by his family and friends. The next day they found evidence the Indians had been in the woods and he had either been killed or carried away alive by the Indians.

In the course of time the widow of William Davidson 1st, m 2nd -- Pyles and they had one or more children. Their grand-son Joseph b 1746 in Chester Co., Pa. served



in the Rev. War and after the war was over, bought land in Washington Co., Pa. He used to visit Lewis and Mary Davidson who lived in Harrison Co., O., and knew all about the fate that befell William Davidson.

In 1753, with his sisters Mary, Sarah and her husband John Arderly, sold to Jacob Warrington the 179 acres which their mother Hannah had surveyed, in 1731.

In 1754 Lewis sold farm to Comfort Houston, Sussex Co., Del.

On 12th March, 1755 Lewis bought a farm of Yeates Conwell. Elizabeth Titus, Ectrx. (Deed Book No. 9.)

Between Lewis Davidson of Bedford County province of Pennsylvania (Yoeman) and Isaac Draper (Cooper) County of Sussex on Delaware now in the possession of Boaz Manlove, seven acres house and orchard where said Lewis Davidson formerly dwelt, bought by Lewis Davidson absolute title of Jacob Stafford and Roseanns, his wife after the decease of Jacob Stafford 9th Feb., 1758. (Book L-No. 11).

Lewis, had deeded to him, June 29, 1767 a tract of land situated on the east side of Monongahala River, in what is now Fayette Co., Pa. The deed recorded at Greensburg Court House, Pa.

Lewis Davidson ran the first ferry at Redstone (now Brownville) Fayette Co., Pa.

1<sup>4</sup>. WILLIAM DAVIDSON, son of Lewis Davidson and first wife Comfort Warrington, b Nov. 20, 1747, Sussex Co., Del., where he remained until grown, then migrated to Westmoreland Co. (now Fayette Co.) Pa. where he owned a tract of land.

Tradition claims he transported food and other supplies from Baltimore, Md. during and after the Revolutionary War, by trains of pack-horses to Western Pa. and Eastern Ohio.

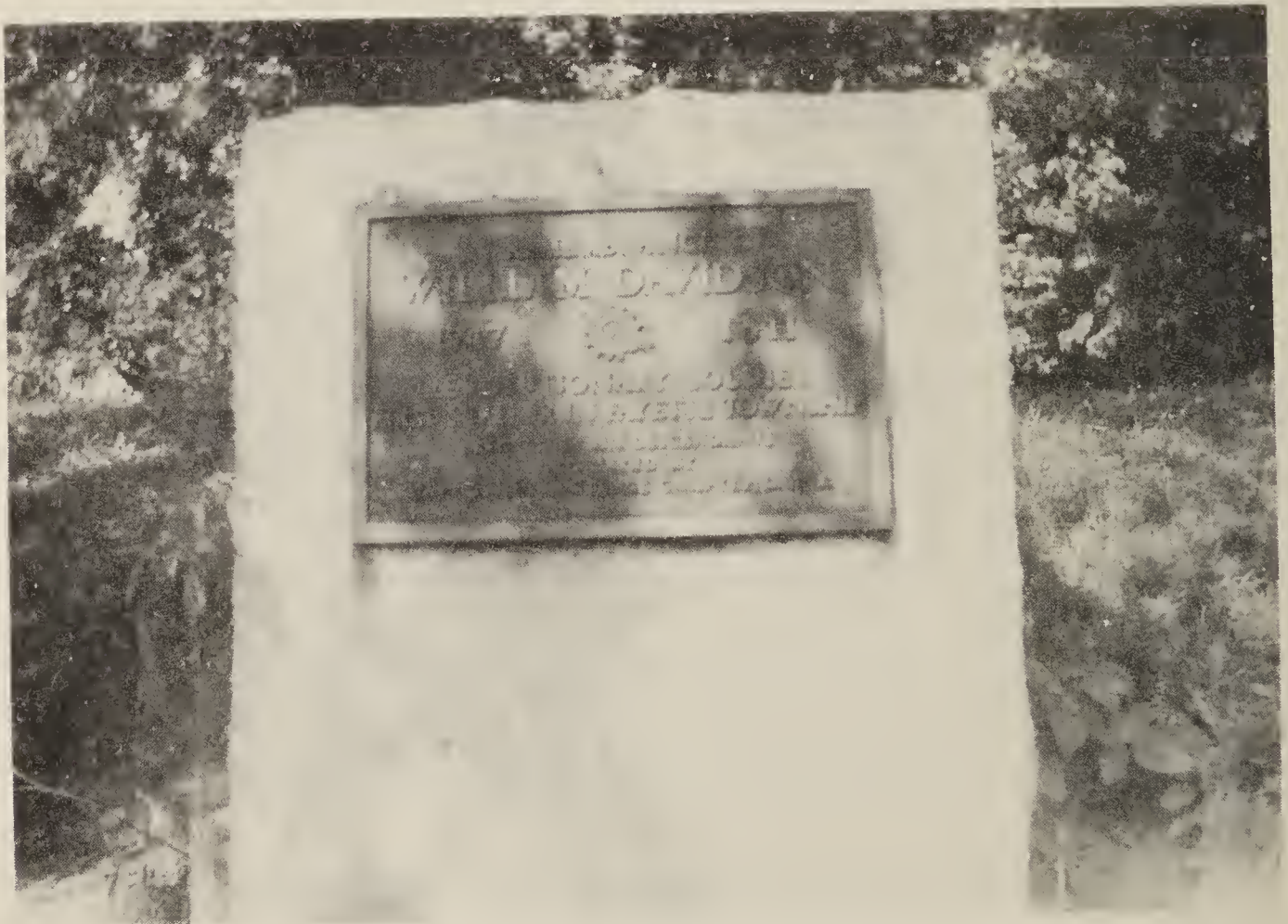
In 1798 William with his family came down the Ohio River in a keel-boat to the present location of South Point, Lawrence Co., Ohio where he had previously purchased a large tract of land. He located his home on the bank of the Ohio, across the river from W. Va. and Ky. and the junction of the Ohio and Big Sandy Rivers. His old home was situated between the brick house of Joseph William, youngest son of William, "Ranger" and the "Old River Road" both of which have long since been carried away by flood waters and thus the widening of the Ohio River.

In 1941, his descendants erected a memorial to him commemorating his service as a "Ranger" in the Revolutionary War and as "Pioneer" to Lawrence Co., Ohio. Through his service many of his descendants have become members of the D.A.R. and S.A.R.

I William Davidson, citizen of the state of Ohio, Do Declare this my last will and testament, revoking all others.

First my just debts are to be punctually and speedily paid and the Legacies herein bequeathed are to be discharged in the manner hereafter directed. To my beloved wife Barbara Davidson I Bequeath all my moveable property and kitchen furniture my debts being first paid out of said moveable property, also all Legacies hereafter Bequeathed to be Discharged out of the aforesaid moveable property and further I do Bequeath to my beloved wife the whole benefit or income of my fractional Section No. 5, on which we now live for her use and the use of the children that belong to her and me that under age or such as chuses to remain under her Jurisdiction.

During her widowhood at her decease I do direct all the Property that she, my wife, may have of the before mentioned moveable property may fall into the hands of my Daughter Cinthia if living, if not to whom of our children she chuses.

I Do bequeath to my eldest son John Davidson thirty dollars to be paid out of the above mentioned moveable property in fifteen months after my decease; if not paid in my life.

To my second son Lewis Davidson, I Do Bequeath the sum of one dollar.

To my eldest daughter Comfort McCourtney, I Do Bequeath the sum of one dollar.

To my son David Davidson, I do bequeath one dollar.

To my daughter Mary Williams, I do bequeath the sum of one dollar.

To my daughter Peggy Francis, I bequeath one horse beast to be worth forty dollars.

To my daughter Betty Lynd I do bequeath the sum of thirteen dollars.

To my daughter Sarah McKee I do bequeath one horse beast worth forty dollars, one good cow and calf, one bed and bedding.

I further direct that the legacy left to my daughter Cinthia be paid to her at the time of her marriage if she be married before she be twenty years of age; if not married to be paid to her at that age.



To my son Abraham A. M. Davidson I do bequeath one fifth part of my fractional Section No. 5 the part on which we now live.

Likewise to my son Thomas one other fifth part of the same, also to my son William one other fifth part of the same. To my son Jesse one other fifth part and to my son Joseph one other fifth part to fall into their hands at the death or marriage of their mother my beloved wife, if of age, if not of age the same I direct to be put to their use by suitable Guardians of their own, or the Court's chusing, by rent, until they become of full age according to law, and I further desire that I may be intombed in a descent and orderly manner, with such of my family as are intombed on my home place.

I do Constitute and appoint my dearly beloved wife, Barbara Davidson, my son A. M. Davidson and my Nephew Joseph Davidson, Executrix and Executors of this my will.

This twentieth day of June Eighteen hundred and ten, I William Davidson being in sound mind and memory do execute this my last Will and Testament.

### JOSEPH WILLIAM DAVIDSON AND JANE BRYSON

14<sup>5</sup>. JOSEPH WILLIAM DAVIDSON, 14th child of William and (9th child of William and 2nd wife Barbara McDowell (McDole), b Dec. 26, 1806, South Point, O. Owned and operated boats on the Big Sandy River. He also owned and cultivated a large tract of land in Fayette Twp., O. Lawrence Co., O.

The brick house he built is still in good condition and at present owned by a great grand-daughter.

It is located on the Ohio, across the river from W. Va. and Ky., and the junction of the Ohio and Big Sandy Rivers.

Between the present site of the house of Joseph and the river were located the old home of William Davidson, "The Ranger" and the "Old River Road" both of which have long since been carried away by flood waters and thus widening the Ohio River.

In the Summer of 1904 the women descendants of Joseph William and Jane Bryson Davidson, organized "The Davidson Club" holding their first meeting at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Lee Andrews, Ironton, Ohio. Originally they held their meetings three times a year but after the organization of the Davidson Reunion in 1932 they meet only annually and in October.

Will of John Bryson Decd.

In the name of God Amen, I John Bryson of Donegal Twp., Washington Co. Pa., being sick of body but sound of mind and knowing that I must go the way of all the earth doth bequeath my soul to God whom gave it and my body to be interred in the dust after decease in a descent maner as my executors shall direct.

First I will that all my lawful debts be payed out of my outstandings accounts and out of my moveable property. Likewise I leave my wife Prisilia Bryson in full possession of my place during her life excepting what afterwards will be left to Isack my son, likewise to have the house I now live in and that with the same, likewise one cow and one horse the moveable property to be at her disposall at her death. Likewise binding her to keep Prisila Lowe my deauter and her two children, binding Prisilla my deaughter for and in consideration of her keeping to live with her mother during her natural life and to take care of her parent while shee the said parent lives for and in consideration of the above. Likewise I leave to my son Isaac Brison Forty acres of land where hee now lives. Beginning at the middle of the woods betwixt Whatmans Keen and my friend thence along Whatman's line to the corner on the hill. Likewise one dollar in money to be payed at the expiration of one year out of my moveable Property. Likewise my son William Brison one dollar to be paid after one year out of my personal estate. Likewise to my son John Bryson All My Wearing aparell. I likewise Will and bequeath all my place containing one hundred and seventy acres be the same more or less unto William Bryson my son-in-law and Hanar Brison and herr eight binding him to pay the aftermentioned sums, one hundred dollars to be payed to my deaughter Priscilia one year after my wifes decease. Likewise fifty dollars to Mary my deauter two years after my wif's death. To Peggy Law Fifty dollars three years after my wife's death. Likewise fifty dollars to my deatether Jeane Kerr four years after my wife's death. If the above named William Brison comply with the above terms then him and his wife and children to have the above named tract of land, but in case of a falour or no compliance with the above the place to be sold by my executors and equally divided according to the above bequethments amongst



the above Legatees. William Brison being himself one-in-law.

Likewise after reflection in my mind I will and bequeth to my son John Bryson five years after my wifes decease to be payed by the above William Brison the sum of twenty dollars. I will and leave to my deauter Prisila one house and garden and firewood, one cow's pasture for the term of six years free of rent after my wife's decease on above mentioned place left to William Bryson. I dou leave and apoint my son-in-law William Bryson and James Dickey my lawful executors of this my last will and testament as witness my hand and seall this twentieth day of July one thousand eight hundred and twenty two.

I, Lewis Davidson of Allegany County, in the State of Maryland, being weak of body but of sound and disposing mind, memory and understanding, considering the certainty of death and the uncertainty of the time thereof, and being desirous to settle my worldly affairs and thereby be the better prepared to leave the world when it shall please Almighty God to call me hence, do make and publish this my last will and testament in manner and form following, to wit:-

First and principally I commit my soul into the hands of Almighty God, and my body to the earth to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executor hereinafter named.

Item. I give and bequeath unto my daughters Elizabeth, Comfort, Margaret, May, Hannah and Rosannah, five pounds current money, each.

Item. I give and bequeath to my son William a tract of land called "Hazle Hollow" containing about twenty two acres, be the same more or less, to be held and enjoyed by him, his heirs and assigns forever.

Item. I give and bequeath to my son Samuel the sum of twenty dollars.

Item. I give and bequeath to my sons Lewis and John, their heirs and assigns forever, the following tracts of land, to wit:- "Walnut Valley" sixty two acres, "Davidson's Choice" seventy and three fourth acres, and "Davidson's Wish" sixty five acres, be the same more or less, to be held and enjoyed by them as tenants in common.

Item. I give and bequeath to my son Thomas the following, tracts of land, to wit:- "Precious Spring" forty nine acres, "Fern Spring" sixteen acres, be the same more or less, to be held and enjoyed by him, his heirs forever.

Item. I give and bequeath to my daughter Ann one feather bed and bedding, one cow and a woman's saddle which belonged to her mother, and the sum of forty dollars to be paid (that is the money) in two annual payments after my decease.



Item. I give and bequeath to my daughter Rebecca one feather bed and bedding, one cow and the sum of forty dollars to be paid in two annual payments after my decease.

Item. I give and bequeath to my daughter Sarah seven pounds ten shilling, current money.

Item. I give and bequeath all the residue of my personal estate after the payment of my debts, legacies and funeral charges to my three sons, Lewis, John and Thomas, to be equally divided between them.

I will that if there should not be a sufficiency of personal property to pay all my debts, legacies and funeral charges, the balance shall be paid by my sons Lewis and John out of the land already bequeathed to them. Note the cows bequeathed to my daughters Ann and Rebecca are now called theirs.

And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my two sons Lewis and John to be my Executors of this my last will and testament, revoking and annulling all former wills by me heretofore made, ratifying this and none other to be my last will and testament.

In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 31st day of July in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and nine.

In the name of God Amen. I Jeremiah Claypoole of the County of Sussex on Delaware, being sick and weak in body but of perfect mind and memory and knowing the uncertainty of Life do make this my Last Will and Testament, I realize my Soul to Almighty God who gave it not doubting of Salvation Through the meritts and mediation of Jesus Christ, my body I order to be decently Interred by my executrix hereafter appointed, my Estate both real and Personal I order to be disposed of in Manner and form Following That is to say -

Item- I give and bequeath unto my son George one Moiety of the plantation whereon I now live Joyning South on the Broadhill, West with Land belonging to the estate of Edward Laws deceased and East with land belonging to Anthony Haverlo to him the said George Claypoole, his Heirs and assigns forever.-

Item- I give and bequeath unto my son Jehu his Heirs and assigns forever the other moiety of the afore said plantation to be Equally Divided between them my Sons George and John aforesaid by and with a Division Line running through the middle of said plantation or tract of Land from South West to North East and I do order that my son George shall have that part of Said Land Joyning in the Broad Kill (or Hill).

Item- I give and bequeath unto my son Joseph my Forrest plantation to him his Heirs and assigns forever.

Item- I give and bequeaty unto my Loving wife my Horse Called Shaver and a woman's Saddle and Bridle.

Item- I give and bequeath unto my daughter Comfort Conwell the sum of Five Shillings.

Item- I do appoint my Loving wife Mary to be my sole Executrix of this my Last Will and Testament and do require my Friend John Conwell and John Clowes to assist her Duely Executing the same. In Testimony whereof I have hereunto put my hand and Seal This Tenth day of December Anno Dom. 1744.

## Pedigree of Elizabeth Claypoole.

Noble quaintly phrases it, the Claypooles were a "Genteel and ancient family, seated at Norborough, in the County of Northampton upon the borders of Lincolnshire, possessing considerable estates in both these counties." In Noble's "Memoirs of the Protectorate House of Cromwell," he begins his history of the family with James Claypoole but James was the son of John Claypoole of King's Cliffe and wife --? dau of Thomas Medcalfe, in the same County. (Ibid., p. 529.)

BLESSINGS. UNTO. MAN. COMETH. FROM. THE. Ja. Cle. 1594, which is five years before his death and the inscription seems to allude to his gratitude to Providence for his singular good fortune. The grant of Arms was made to James Claypoole (Cleypole) in 1583." (Heralds' College, K.I. p. 219.)

Item 1st, I do bequeath unto my beloved wife Hannah one hundred acres of land running from the river to the back line, taking the house the orchard and barn, one mare and saddle, two beds and bedding, six sheep, two cows, four hogs, one desk during so as long as she remains my widow or her death.

Item 2nd I do bequeath to my Daughter Orphy one hundred acres of land, being part of the tract I now live on, to be taken off the upper end adjoining Sims land to begin at Sims corner and the bank of the Ohio River and running out to my back line, then as far down the river as will make one hundred acres, which she has a deed for to be wholly at her own disposal, forever.
