Foreword

Solomon said "a good name is rather to be chosen than great riches." Too frequently we use the quotation glibly and without thought as to its truth and its reality. One who devotes any particular amount of time to family research soon becomes impressed, however, with the importance of the great heritage enjoyed by the descendants of those who have had a due regard for the truth of the quotation.

And let me assure those who bear the name Lamar or Lemar in its variations and different spellings, that they do bear a good name. For almost 280 years the descendants of the original settlers of that proud name have been a part of the history of America. They have taken part in their country's activities, they have shed their blood in all its wars, and they have devoted themselves to the arts of peace and the extension of its frontier.

One of the most noteworthy characteristics of all generations of the family have been their devotion to religious principles. The family was founded on this continent as a result of devotion to religious belief and that devotion and fidelity have continued to be one of the outstanding traits of character evident in all generations. May it continue to be as truly the lamp to guide the footsteps of those to come after us.

As will be noted in reading the pages to follow, a great part of the statements made herein are based upon original research of the public documents and records of those places where our ancestors have lived. In all the research which I have made, not one instance of conviction of any crime have I found charged to any descendant of the family. There are approximately four thousand persons mentioned in the following pages and of that entire number there were found no family skeletons which need be hidden in the family closet.

On the other hand, several members of the family have attained positions of national prominence, many have accumulated wealth, still greater numbers have reached positions of importance and trust, and all have been substantial and dependable citizens of the land which became theirs by birth and attainment.

In view of the present European war, it is fortunate that some of the English and French research was undertaken some years ago, for many of the old documents formerly preserved at London and Paris have been destroyed and can never be replaced.

Grateful acknowledgment is made of the kind assistance which has so freely been given by members of the family. All have been most kind in answering my many requests for information, many have been more than kind in not only furnishing information as to their immediate families, but also in helping to gather information as to more remote families and branches of the family. Especially do I wish to acknowledge the kind help of Mrs. Charles W. Lamar, Mrs. Clarinda Pendleton Lamar, Wirt Armistead Cate, W. E. Bard, Mrs. Anna Rumford, Mrs. A. R. Pile, Mrs. Eva Dow Nance, Lewa Jared Lemar and many others. I am sorry that it is not possible to enumerate all the persons who have helped gather this information, and I only trust that this work, incomplete and inaccurate though it may be, will inspire someone else to carry on and complete the writing of a family history.

I should like to pay tribute to the excellent work done by those who have previously gathered parts of the history of the family. Especially do I wish to pay tribute to the excellence of the work done by Edward Mayes, late President of the University of Mississippi; Alexander Blair; L. L. Knight; Wirt Armistead Cate; Rev. Charles R. Lamar; W. E. Bard; Emily Emerson Lantz and others. A great part of the history of certain branches of the family, as herein set forth, is taken wholly from the research of the foregoing persons. If not sufficient acknowledgment of their part in this work has been given, it is from oversight and not from any intent to take credit for the work they have done.

In a work of this magnitude it is impossible to avoid some mistakes. I do not know of any mistakes or errors in the entire book, but I realize that with so many persons named, with so many dates and incidents mentioned, it would be unreasonable to hope that no errors had been

committed, but every effort has been made to make this work entirely accurate and as thoroughly complete as possible. If errors and mistakes have occurred I do not know of them, or they would have been corrected before permitting this record to go to print.

It would be too much to hope that all branches of the family could be traced. I have made a sincere effort to trace all branches but have frequently reached the place where no further trace of a branch of the family could be discovered. Sometimes a chance bit of information would unfold the record of several generations of some branch, but at other times the clue which might unlock the story could not be discovered. Such information as is given, however, may help some of the persons of those branches of the family to trace the record of their own branches, and thereby contribute to the fund of information available to later writers upon the subject.

Finally, if this book shall in any way offer inspiration to any of the members of the family to strive for better things, to seek more honorable attainment, to live a life of greater fidelity and helpfulness, I shall be happy. I hope we may all be proud of our family, proud of our name, and I hope that we may all remember that while a proud family name is a splendid asset, it should never be used as working capital.

PART I
THE ARRIVAL IN AMERICA

CHAPTER 1.

THE CAUSE OF THE EMIGRATION¹

The dawn of the sixteenth century saw France, the native country of the Lamar family, rapidly approaching the religious reformation. The Kingdom was presided over by King Francis I, who had ruled for some time without the aid of the States General, the duly elected representatives of the people. In fact the States General had not been summoned into session after 1483, and was not to meet until 1560, during which period the rule of the King was absolute.

In 1508 to 1512, Lefevre, a Frenchman, published his commentaries on the Psalms and the Epistles of St. Paul, five years before Martin Luther began his teaching of the Reformation. The sway of the Church was, however, absolute and a part of the kingdom was governed directly by the Pope.

During hostilities between the two countries, the King of France became a prisoner of the King of Spain. Through the intercession of the Pope the King of France was released, and in appreciation of the action of the Holy Father, he took vigorous steps to punish heresy. The son of the King, the Duke of Angoulem, heir to the throne, married Catherine de' Medici, niece of the Pope and so the strongest bonds of amity and good will were established between France and Rome.

The punishment of those who practiced the Reformed Faith was undertaken with enthusiasm. Francis I, however, could not long remain faithful to any plan of action, and since he needed the aid of the German Princes in his contemplated war of vengeance upon Spain, he sought to win their favor by somewhat mitigating the rigors of the persecution of those of the Reformed Faith. It is even stated that the new Pope Paul, who ascended the papal throne at the time, requested that greater leniency be shown to the erring believers of the new religion. When it became apparent that the German Princes were unwilling to enter into an alliance with France for

a war upon Spain, the King, through the Cardinal of Tournon, on June 1st, 1540, decreed that all followers of the Reformed Faith were heretics, that all heretics should be tried and that their cases should have precedence over all other cases occupying the courts, that no appeal should be allowed. Heresy was declared to be treason, as well as sedition and riot. All citizens were required to denounce heretics if known. The King said, "all heretics should be remorselessly put to death."

In that part of modern France which was at that time directly ruled by the Pope, the courts were directed to furnish no copies of the accusation to the accused nor to receive any petition or paper whatsoever from the accused. In one instance where nineteen Waldenses were convicted of heresy on November 18th, 1540, they were sentenced to be burned alive, and if not apprehended were to be burned in effigy, their wives and children proscribed, and their possessions confiscated. It was further ordered that all the houses of their town be burned and razed to the ground, the trees cut down for a distance of two hundred paces on each side in order that that spot which had been the receptacle of heresy be forever uninhabited. Landowners were prohibited from leasing land to a tenant bearing the name or belonging to the same family as the miscreants. This order was revoked before its execution, but was later renewed and executed in 1545, and not only was this village destroyed but twenty-one other villages also. It is stated that eight hundred of the believers of the Reformed Faith were butchered in church, and that a total of three thousand men, women and children were killed in the execution of this sentence.

A natural revulsion of feeling developed, and the courts began to show leniency, but the new King, Henry II, decreed that everyone who professed the Reformed Faith should be put to death by burning, or the gallows, and that no exception would be permitted.

But a free people have ever resisted persecution, and so the new faith grew by leaps and bounds. In 1558,

great impetus was given the movement when the King of Navarre, an independent principality of Southern France, espoused the Reformed Faith, and soon the nobles were flocking to his standard.

Not to be placated, Henry II forced the adoption of the Inquisition after the Parliament of Paris, the highest judicial tribunal of the Kingdom, had twice flatly refused. Henry II was injured in a tournament just preceding the marriage of his daughter to Philip of Spain. He died ten days later and was buried with great ceremony. His body lay in state with a cover of tapestry representing the conversion of the Apostle Paul. But the words, "Saul, Saul, why persecutest thou Me," seemed too pointed and the cover was removed.

Henry II was succeeded by Francis II who was King in name. His mother, Catherine de Medici, was his chief adviser, and she continued her implacable resentment against the Reformed Faith, the followers of which had begun to be known as Huguenots.

The name Huguenot is probably derived from Roy Huguet, or Huguon, a hobgoblin supposed to haunt the vicinity of Tours, to whom the superstitious attributed the nocturnal assemblies of the Protestants. Another version is that the name is derived from the Gate de Roy Huguon of the City of Tours, near which the meetings were held.

In an attempt to unify the kingdom, the Edict of January (1562) was issued. It recognized the Huguenots and granted a limited tolerance to them. It permitted daylight meetings outside the city walls in the presence of officers.

This Edict so infuriated some of the majority party that the Duke of Guise and his troops seized the opportunity presented by a meeting of Huguenots to attack them in their meeting at Vassy on March 1st, 1562, killing fifty or sixty men and women and wounding nearly a hundred more. This act precipitated the first Civil War. The Duke of Guise attempted to seize the new King, Charles IX, a boy about twelve or fourteen years of age at the time, and thereby to gain control of the Regency.

The war continued with indifferent success to either side, and was finally ended March 19th, 1563, by the Edict of Pacification, by which Charles IX granted to all gentlemen and nobles permission to celebrate the reformed religion in their own homes, and in certain cities and towns. The other Huguenots were permitted to practice their religion outside the walls. Certain cities were designated where the practice of the religion might be permitted at one or two places within the wall, but the new religion was absolutely prohibited in Paris or its immediate vicinity. General amnesty, however, was granted. This Edict is also known as the Edict of Amboise, the city in which it was promulgated.

Admiral Coligny, the Commander of the Huguenot forces, eventually won some further slight concessions from the Queen Mother, but King Charles IX gradually reduced these privileges. He deprived the Huguenots of public office, three thousand of them were killed and a plot was hatched to kill the leaders of the Huguenots, to revoke the Edict of Amboise and adopt another of opposite tenor in its place, and so the Second Civil War was started in 1567.

On the whole, the Huguenots were successful in the second conflict which ended March 23rd, 1568, with the Edict of Longjumeau which restored the Edict of Amboise without any restrictive interpretations. It was learned that the Papists planned the wholesale slaughter of the Huguenots when they laid down their arms, but the King learned of it and prevented the consummation of the plot.

Within a few months, King Charles IX issued an interpretation in which he stated that he had not intended to include the provinces of his mother, Catherine de Medici, of the Duke of Guise, Anjou, Alencon or the Bourbon Princes. On excuse of necessity, he stationed troops in the cities, billeted of course upon the Huguenots.

Therefore, on September 12th, 1568, the Third Civil War started. On March 15th, 1569, the Pope issued a Bull sanctioning a crusade and emphasizing the complete extermination of the heretics. The King and his mother,

Catherine de Medici, revoked all edicts of toleration. The war continued with indifferent success to either side. The King's party won the battle of Moncontour, but the Huguenots quickly recovered and Admiral Coligny led an expedition through Southern France and even over into Spain. The Huguenots then turned toward Paris and the Court became panic stricken. The German Princes interceded with King Charles in behalf of the Huguenots and some of the German Princes threatened to send troops to their aid. Peace came August 8th, 1570, by the Edict of St. Germaine. This guaranteed freedom of conscience and permitted Huguenots to conduct public worship within the walls of many cities, outside the walls of certain others, and granted four cities as "Cities of Refuge," but did not permit Protestant worship in Paris or within ten leagues of it.

King Charles IX evidently sincerely tried to live up to the Edict of St. Germaine even to incurring the displeasure of Philip of Spain, and the Catholic populace of Paris. But it is believed his mother, Catherine de Medici, together with the King's younger brother, Henry of Anjou, and the widow of the Duke of Guise, planned the massacre of St. Bartholomew's day.

On Friday, August 22nd, 1572, Admiral Coligny, after attending a meeting of the Royal Council, presided over by Henry of Anjou, was wounded by a shot fired from ambush. On Saturday, Catherine, Henry of Anjou and the widow of the Duke of Guise succeeded in persuading King Charles that a plot was on foot against him and that it might be foiled by killing Admiral Coligny. Therefore, the King agreed that the Admiral, and four or five Huguenot leaders were to be killed. The necessary orders were issued, all gates were closed and every avenue of escape was cut off. On Sunday morning, August 24th, 1572, the St. Bartholomew's Day massacre was started by the ringing of the bell on the Palace of Justice. Admiral Coligny, perceiving that a plot was on foot, sent certain friends who were with him, to the roof where they were saved in the darkness of early dawn. The Admiral was killed and the cry was raised that the Huguenots were

in arms to kill the King. Admiral Coligny was beheaded, and the head, after presentation to Catherine de Medici, was sent to Rome as a grateful remembrance to Pope Gregory XIII, and the Cardinal of Lorraine, who was a Guise.

In Paris, it has been claimed that from one thousand to ten thousand Huguenots were slain. The names of more than one thousand are known, but it is probable that ten thousand is an exaggeration. Probably from four to five thousand persons, of all ages and conditions were killed, of whom at least five hundred were women.

King Charles wrote the governors of the provinces that the massacre had occurred through the enmity of the Guises and Admiral Coligny, and that he, the King, had had all he could do to protect the Louvre, and that "there is nothing in this leading to the rupture of the Edict of Pacification which, on the contrary, I intend to be maintained as much as ever." On August 26th, the King publicly assumed responsibility for the massacre, although this was probably done to protect the Duke of Guise. By verbal orders, it is alleged and supported by certain documentary evidence, King Charles invoked the provincial Governors to conduct a similar massacre in their provinces, the King meanwhile protesting his intention to support the Edict of Pacification.

Massacres followed in some cities of the Provinces such as Meaux, Toulouse, Bordeaux, Angers, Rouen, Lyons and others. But the governors of some of the provinces, and the municipal authorities of some cities, refused to accept verbal orders or to follow them. Nantes is a notable example, as is Bayonne.

In all France, from twenty thousand to thirty thousand Huguenots were killed. A few historians estimate the number as high as one hundred thousand, but this is probably an exaggeration.

On receipt in Rome of the news of the massacre, Pope Gregory ordered high masses of thanksgiving, struck medals commemorating the event, and had pictures painted upon the Vatican walls honoring the holocaust, which

pictures still remain in the ante chamber to the Sistine Chapel.

King Charles sent Governors to take possession of the "Cities of Refuge" and others in which the Huguenots were strong. Nismes, La Rochelle, and Sancerre refused admittance to the Governors and their troops, which act precipitated the Fourth Civil War. This war consisted largely of the sieges of these cities. La Rochelle successfully defended itself and drove off the King's forces with a loss, by war and disease, of thirty thousand men. Nismes and Montauban successfully withstood siege, and Sancerre held out for about eight months when it was driven to surrender by famine. Owing to the fact that the Duke of Anjou had just been elected King of Poland and it was desirable to win support in Protestant nations, good terms were obtained by the Huguenots, and the Edict of Pacification issued in July, 1573, guaranteed complete and public worship in LaRochelle, Nismes and Montauban, while throughout the rest of France all Huguenots were granted freedom of conscience, and the right to sell their property and to remove wherever they might choose, whether within or without the realm. General amnesty was granted and all Huguenots who had defended their homes for months against the King were solemnly declared to be the King's "good, loyal and faithful subjects and servants."

For their self protection, the Huguenots organized at Milhau in 1573 a governmental organization providing their own council, or legislative and executive body, and arbitrators to attend to the judicial functions between themselves. These protective measures were made necessary by reason of the ecclesiastical nature of the courts maintained by the kingdom.

The Catholic party likewise split into two parties, one of which, the Malcontents or Politiques, demanded the removal of all Italian influence from the government of France, including Catherine de Medici, the Guises, and all others owing allegiance to any sovereign except the King of France.

In 1574, the Fifth Civil War started with the full moral support of the Malcontents. The Huguenots demanded free cities in each province, freedom of worship, hostages to assure that the terms should be carried out, and that each side to the controversy should deposit a large sum of money with some neutral German prince to be used to hire mercenary troops to punish whichever side should break the pledge.

Scarcely had the war begun when King Charles IX died and was succeeded by the Duke of Anjou, Henry III, who was weak in character, self indulgent, and influenced by ignoble favorites. The Catholic League was formed with the Duke of Guise at its head. Henry of Navarre put himself at the head of the Huguenots and won a notable victory at Coutras. Paris, however, in 1588 fell into the hands of the Catholic League, and King Henry III fled. In the same year, the King convoked the States General at Blois and had the two Guises assassinated. Paris revolted, so the King joined Henry of Navarre and his Huguenot troops, and advanced to the attack of Paris. At St. Cloud, on August 1st, 1589, the King was stabbed and Henry of Navarre was proclaimed King as Henry IV, by his followers. He won the battle of Arques over the Catholic League and later won another victory at Ivry. Representations were made to Henry of Navarre that by making the mere formal confession of Catholic faith, he would be received by the inhabitants of Paris as their King, and to prevent further bloodshed and to cement his people together, he consented. On July 25th,, 1593, he was anointed King and was then joyfully received by Paris. Peace, however, was not fully established until 1598 when on April 13th, King Henry IV signed the Edict of Nantes granting partial religious toleration to his subjects.

This Edict of Nantes remained in force until October 22nd, 1685, when King Louis XIV revoked it. Throughout the reign of the successors of Henry IV, however, the terms of the Edict were so interpreted that the toleration originally granted was reduced and thinking men could easily foresee the time when it would be entirely

revoked, and another religious war would ensue. Certain it is, that with the passage of time, numerous isolated instances arose where Huguenots suffered severe torture and were even burned at the stake. Eventually a plan was devised whereby it was deemed possible to stamp out the hated Reformed Faith at the end of the generation then living, by providing that the child of any Huguenot might be taken from its parents, its custody given to the Church and its education conducted through the schools maintained in the monasteries and convents. Many children in parts of France were so taken from their parents during their tender years and the desired result of weaning these children from their reformed faith was frequently accomplished.

The certainty of revocation of the Edict of Nantes caused the expatriation of some fifty thousand Huguenot families during this period, and since the Huguenot movement had gained its greatest strength among the artisans and nobility, France thus lost a substantial part of its best families.

It was from these conditions that the ancestors of the Lamar family in America fled about the middle of the seventeenth century.

CHAPTER 2

THE FAMILY ORIGIN

The origin of the name Lamar, or Lemar, as it is variously spelled, is shrouded in obscurity. That it is of French origin is obvious, and an analysis of the name discloses that the basic syllable is the final "mar," which is so patently incorrect or incomplete that it becomes self-evident that as now used, the name differs from its original and correct form. It is not possible now to determine with certainty just which form is correct. There are some² who believe that originally the final syllable was "mer" and that "de la Mer" (of the sea) was the proper use and form of the name. On the other hand the majority contend that the name was originally "de la mare" (of the lake, or pool) and an examination of the English and early American records seems to offer almost conclusive support to the view that the latter is the correct form.

Several of the early American records, however, refer to a family named Lemaire, presumably an Americanization of "le Maire" (the Mayor). The early naturalization records of Thomas and Peter Lamar³ spelled the name Lemore.

One very outstanding student of the family history⁴ stated that "the notion is suggested that there may be some ancient connection between the very early bearers of that name and the Scottish family of *Marr*, celebrated in the histories and literature of that country, which claims descent from Martacus, Earl of Marr, in the year 1065. In the fifth chapter of *Quentin Durward*, Sir Walter Scott tells how it was common, in the latter part of the fourteenth, and early part of the fifteenth centuries, for younger sons of noble Scottish families to find their way to France, and seek their fortunes there."

Still another writer⁵ suggests that the family may have descended from "Eudes Le Maire," who in 1085 made a journey to the Holy Land on foot, in place and stead of Philippe I."

It is possible that several families may have arisen, the origin of whose surnames are as indicated above, but much evidence exists that at least a very large portion of the family which was to be found in Normandy and the other northern provinces of France at the commencement of the Reformation, were related and that the proper form of the name at that time in use was "de la Mare."

Whatever the fact may be as to the proper form of the surname, the records disclose that listed among the nobility of France at that time were Lamaire, Lamare, Lemaire and Lemire, while in Flanders at a somewhat later date, a family named Lemaire arose to the nobility.

It has been stated by one writer upon the subject that the Arms and Crest of the Lamar family in France were as follows:

Blazon: Quarterly, azure, gules, argent and rest. In the first quarter a mullett of the third; in the second quarter a harp or; in the third quarter a rose, leaved and stalked all proper; in the fourth quarter a dexter arm couped at shoulder embowed vambraced, hand clasping sword all proper.

Crest: Ducal helmet affronte coronetted.

Motto: A scroll bearing "Va T'en Aux Etoiles."—
(Mayes Genealogy Notes.)

The official French records, however, fail to show any such arms as ever having been authorized, and under Heraldic rules the record is incomplete since there is no tincture or color known as rest.

Another report of the family Arms and Crest is as follows—

Arms: Gules, Two lions passant guardant, in pale, or.

Crest: A mermaid proper, a mirror in the sinister and a comb in the dexter hand, crined, or.—(Lantz Baltimore Sun, October 22-29, 1905.)

The foregoing is, also, not an official French Coat of Arms but is the Coat of Arms of the English family named Delemare.

French Heraldic records disclose that the LaMare family's arms were as follows—

Arms: D'Azur a la Croix D'or cant. au (1) d'une licorne cont. d'arg., au (2) d'une aigle d'or, bq et m. de gu aux 3 et 4 de deux lions Affre. d'or, arm. et lamp, de gu., les quenes passies en sant. (Register Armorial General by Reitstap, Page 610-1861.)

The foregoing arms is recorded without Crest or Motto. Frequently, in the more ancient Arms of Continental Europe, crests or mottos were not used. The Arms is the first and most significant part of the achievement. The Crest and Motto were later additions to the achievement.

The foregoing Heraldic description is recorded in French with its abbreviations. The translation of the foregoing description in modern language would be as follows:

“A blue shield divided by a cross of gold; in the upper left-hand corner a unicorn of silver color; in the upper right corner an eagle of gold with beak and feet of red color; in the lower left corner and lower right corner two lions of gold color facing each other, with tails over back and standing on their hind feet.”

It would appear that the Norman invasion of England found some of the members of the family involved, and that at least certain of these family members became residents of the new Norman kingdom. As early as 1370, a Sir Peter De La Mare, Knight of the Shire for Hereford, and Speaker of the Commons in the Good Parliament, was imprisoned at Nottingham. He, in turn, had descended from John De La Mare of Oxfordshire, who having been engaged in the French and Scottish wars of Edward the First, was summoned to Parliament as a Baron on February 6, 1299.⁶

That not all of those of similar name had departed from their native France is evidence by the application of one Isaac Le Maire in 1608 for the establishment of a company for exploration of America, and his report of the search made in 1609 for the Northeast Passage.⁷

The Reformation found the family sadly in disagreement as to its religious beliefs. A large portion of the family remained faithful to the Roman Church and rendered distinguished service to France and Canada. During the regime of Cardinal Richelieu, a large number of this branch of the family came to Canada, where the Great Premier permitted only faithful Catholics to settle.⁸ On the other hand, an equally large portion of the family seem to have adopted the Protestant point of view, and with the loss of the Religious Wars of France, many of these found it necessary to seek safety elsewhere, and we find many references to the name in the English records of the period. Thus in 1544, we find Sir Ector LeMare of Southampton, a preacher, born in Normandy, making application for English citizenship. He stated that he was sixty years of age and had resided in England for forty years.⁹ In 1571, we find Charles LeMere reported as a member of the French Huguenot Church in London, and during the same year, Peter Le Mare, a son of David Le Mare of Antwerp, was baptized by a minister of that church.¹⁰ In 1571, John La Mare of Burgundy showed that he desired citizenship, having been a resident of England since the death of King Henry VIII. In 1576, Guillian de Lamere, a Frenchman, applied for English citizenship stating in his petition that he had been a resident of London for two and twenty years. In 1583, John Lemere, a goldsmith, born in Paris, applied for citizenship for himself and wife, stating that they "came for religion and are of the French Church." In 1590, Peter de Lamar became a citizen, and the records of the Huguenot Society of London and of the Harlein Society show many persons of similar name who became residents of England during the period above mentioned. This establishment of residence in England appears to have continued until about 1700. Notable among these are John Lemere, Lewis Lemire, Stephen Lemyre, John de Lamer, Martin de la Mare, Matthew de la Mare, a priest or preacher, Pierre Lamarre, Jean de Lamarre, and perhaps fifty others.

That portion of the family from whom our American Lamars descended appear to have continued to live in France until about the middle of the seventeenth century when, in anticipation of the events that resulted in 1685 in the revocation of the Edict of Nantes, they left their native land to seek security and happiness in foreign lands and among alien peoples.

It has been reported that the ancestral home of the family was at a small village named Wieres in Flanders, near the present thriving city of Lille.¹¹ This seems doubtful since that portion of Flanders had for many years been a possession of the kingdom of Spain and did not become a part of France until 1667. On November 17th, 1663, a certificate of naturalization was issued to Thomas and Peter Lemore, "late of Virginia, subjects of the crown of France."¹² Not until four years later did Flanders become French.

It appears, therefore, that the ancestral home was some place other than Flanders but was definitely within the kingdom of France. The name being of Norman and French origin would indicate that the ancestral home was located in that portion of France now known as Normandy.

CHAPTER 3

THE ARRIVAL IN AMERICA

Throughout many generations and in all branches of the family a tradition has existed that the family was founded in America by three brothers who fled from their native France to escape persecution,¹³ but at least one of the early writers upon the subject declared that the tradition as known to him was that four brothers¹⁴ founded the family here.

The records undoubtedly show that two brothers, Thomas and Peter Lamar, did arrive in Maryland about 1663, after a residence of unknown duration in Virginia. Many writers upon the subject¹⁵ cautiously advance the theory that a Dr. John Lemaire, who arrived in Maryland some ten years later was also a brother, but as later stated herein, the writer does not concur in this belief, which it is thought is fostered and nurtured largely by the tradition of the arrival of three brothers.

On March 19th, 1663, a statement of account in favor of "Peter Lamore & Bro." in the sum of 1,800 pounds of tobacco was certified against Thomas Dent¹⁶ while on October 6th, 1663, Peter and Thomas Laremore were called for coroner's jury duty at St. Maries County, Maryland.¹⁷ Following shortly thereafter on November 17th, 1633, "pattents of dennizacon" or as we would now term it, certificates of naturalization, were issued to "Thomas Lemore and Peter Lemore, late of Virginia, and subjects of the crown of France."¹⁸

As shown by the entries above, it seems certain that Thomas and Peter Lamar had been in Maryland for some little time prior to their naturalization and if the evidence of similarity of names is to be relied upon, it would appear that Thomas Lamar might have been in the colony as early as 1659, for on August 20th of that year survey of a tract of land in Talbot County, Maryland, on the eastern shore of Chesapeake Bay was made for "Thomas Laymour,"¹⁹ but the entry upon the land was never completed, perhaps for the reason that the entryman was not an English citizen, and therefore not entitled to own

land in the colony of Maryland. At the time of his arrival in Maryland, Thomas appears to have been married, for on November 24th, 1665, we find him making application²⁰ for an award of 100 acres of land for the transportation of himself and his wife, Mary, into the colony, under the provisions of the law at that time in effect by which an award of fifty acres of land was made for the transportation of each new resident into the colony. Peter appears, however, to have been single at the time of his arrival, as he received a land grant for himself and his servant, Katherine, a white woman.²¹ In the previous year, November 8th, 1664, Peter and Thomas Lamore, the brothers, had become the owners of three hundred fifty acres of land in Calvert County through purchase²² from William Tennehill to whom on June 6th, 1665, the two brothers, signing themselves as Peter Leamar and Thomas Leamar, sold certain lands lying on the east bank of the Potomac River.

The brothers continued to live and prosper in the new country. Peter married, and became the father of three daughters. Thomas' wife appears to have died and he married Ann Pottinger. He was the father of two sons, presumably the eldest, Thomas, Jr., being the son of the first wife and the youngest, John, being the son of the second wife.²³

Peter seems to have lived in Calvert County. On October 9th, 1693, he made a will leaving his property, which appears to have been extensive, to his wife, Frances, and his three daughters, Ann (who married Peter O'Neill), Mary and Margaret, when they should marry, or become sixteen years of age. He also made a bequest to his grandson, Peter O'Neill, son of the eldest daughter, Ann O'Neill.²⁴ This will was filed for probate in Calvert County on March 31st, 1694. Peter Lamar, having no sons, did not pass the name on to future generations and for that reason we will not follow his family further.

Thomas lived in that part of Calvert County which was erected into Prince George County in 1696. He also appears to have prospered and to have taken his place

as one of the important personages of the colony. On April 30th, 1676, he had become the owner of a tract of land²⁵ known as "Fishing Place" which became the seat of his extensive plantation. In 1697 we find him as one of a body of grand jurors and justices reporting to the legislative Assembly on certain necessary repairs to the state house and state church.²⁶

We do not know the date of birth of his sons, but from later events it would seem probable that the eldest son, Thomas, Jr., was born about 1670. The younger son, John, issue of the second wife, was probably born about 1690 to 1695 as will appear by later references.

The will of the elder Thomas was dated October 4th, 1712, and was filed for probate in Prince George County on May 29th, 1714. It provided ~~that~~ the eldest son, Thomas, Jr., should have "the plantation on which he now dwelleth with half the land which I now possess," that the youngest son, John, should have "the plantation on which I now dwell, with half the land" and that his well beloved wife, Ann, should be appointed executrix and should "enjoy all my land and moveable estate, both here and in England, during her widowhood, not disturbing my son, Thomas Lamar, from any privilege or molest from clearing or building during his possession."²⁷

As we have previously stated, a man of similar name lived in the province at the same time as Thomas and Peter Lamar. He was Dr. John Lemaire, who was naturalized in 1674 and gave his former residence as Anjou, France. Many writers have supposed him to have been the third brother, whom tradition mentions as having established the family upon this continent. No evidence exists, except the similarity in the spelling of his name, that he was related in any way to Thomas and Peter Lamar, and the probate of his estate shows that he died without children, so it becomes apparent that he was not the third brother.

This Dr. John Lemaire, on October 25, 1674, received a deed for certain lands in Charles County which he named "Hispanolia."²⁸ In 1675 he married Margaret Waughob, daughter of Archibald Waughob of Charles

County. In 1681 he was appointed “chyrurgion” to “Capt. Brandts Troope” which was being raised to fight the “northern Indians.”²⁹ In 1681 also he was awarded a judgment for 4,222 pounds of tobacco for medicines, medical services, costs and damages in a suit against one George Godfrey.³⁰ Owing to his position as a physician, he witnessed many wills and his name appears often upon the records of Charles County.

He appears to have died about 1688 for on March 22, 1688, the petition of Phillip and Elizabeth Hoskins of Charles County was presented showing that “Whereas John Lemaire, late of Charles County, did in his lifetime, to wit, Mar. 5, last past, make his will and testament in writing under his hand and seal and thereby bequeathed several legacies to divers persons, and to Margaret, his wife, the remaining part of his real and personal estate, whom he appointed executrix of his said will—and the said executrix dying before she took upon her the burden of the executrixship aforesaid, died intestate leaving one Elizabeth Hoskins *her only sister and next of blood.*”³¹ Thereupon letters of administration with will annexed were issued to the petitioners, but neither the will of Dr. John Lemaire nor that of his wife, Margaret Lemaire is to be found in the records of Charles County or at Annapolis. Many of the records of Charles County have been destroyed by fire, and a copy of the will cannot be obtained as it was evidently destroyed, but the administration records do not reveal the payment of any bequests to any person of the same or similar name. The fact that Elizabeth Hoskins was the next of blood makes it clear that there were no children of Dr. John Lemaire.

During the years of the active business life of Dr. John Lemaire in Charles County and of Thomas and Peter Lamar in Calvert County, which then adjoined Charles County, a number of public records in Charles County make mention of John Lamarr. The name is spelled in a number of different ways, but always pronunciation would be the same as that of Thomas and Peter Lamar, and rather different than that of Dr. John Lemaire. In view of the imperfect and incomplete con-

dition of the public records of Charles County at that time it is impossible to determine whether in fact these records refer to a different man than the physician, for there are a few instances in documents other than those herein mentioned where the spelling is used both ways in the same document. The facts which may indicate that the third brother of Thomas and Peter Lamar lived in Charles County are not at all conclusive but are as follows:

In 1675 John Lemarr was a beneficiary under the last will and testament of Giles Cole³² who was mortally wounded in a battle with the "Northern Indians." Other beneficiaries under the will were Henry Hawkins, Thomas Hawkins, Eliza Hawkins and John Hawkins, Jr. Henry and John Hawkins later moved to Queen Anne County, across Chesapeake Bay, where they became the owners of "Hawkins Charcolia," a plantation which was later sold to Charles Lemar, who in turn was apparently related to the children of Peter Lamar. Furthermore, Charles County Judgment Record Index, Liber WC, at pages 666 and 701 makes mention of a suit brought by Lemarre against Wheeler, while page 785 mentions a suit brought by John Lamarr against James Wheeler. It is to be noted that the Wheeler family also moved to Queen Anne County, where one of the sons of Charles Lemar, above mentioned, married Mary Wheeler in 1733. In Will Book, Vol. 4, at page 160, Charles County records, the will of Edward Gale appears. It bears date of February 1, 1685, and was witnessed by J. Lemare. Court Records Book P, at page 54 mentions a suit brought by John Lemar against Francis Hemersley. Maryland Archives, Vol. 7, page 249, refers to an act passed by the Legislative Assembly ordering payment of 1,500 pounds of tobacco to John Lamarr in compliance with a former act "paying the assessment of the Public charge of the Province for services or money due." A resurvey of "Love Plantation" in Charles County was ordered³³ and the record shows this plantation was owned by John Lemare.

None of the foregoing documents is conclusive. The most that can be said for them is that they are evidence that there may have been, besides Dr. John Lemaire, another man named John Lamarr who lived in the same county at the same time. In view of the imperfect condition of the public records and the unfamiliarity of public officials with the spelling of French names, confusion arising therefrom might easily account for numerous other documents in that county where the surname is spelled in two or more ways in the same document, and in which it is now impossible to determine whether reference is made to Dr. John Lemaire or to a man named John Lamarr.

Many of the people who settled in Charles County later moved to Queen Anne County. Among these were the Hawkins and Wheeler families. The fact that Charles Lemar, who first appeared in the Maryland records in 1704 as a resident of Queen Anne County, was a young man, had been given the Christian name of Charles, had business dealings with the Hawkins family and social relationships with the Wheeler family, lends some strength to the thought that he might have been born in Charles County, possibly the son of John Lamarr, for it seems apparent that he could not have been the son of Dr. John Lemaire. None of the records shows the probate of the estate of John Lamarr or any deed disposing of "Love Plantation" but since so many of the Charles County records have been destroyed these deficiencies are likewise not conclusive.

Some time prior to January 15, 1677, Jane Lemarr had arrived in the colony as is evidenced by the bonus land application of Capt. John Bull.³⁴ It is not known what relationship she might have borne to Thomas and Peter Lamar or to John Lamarr or to Dr. John Lemaire. She was not the wife of Thomas or Peter Lamar, or of Dr. John Lemaire for we know the given names of each of those. She might have been the wife of John Lamarr, or she might have been the sister of any of the men mentioned. What became of her after her arrival in Maryland is not known, for no further reference to her has been dis-

covered unless the following item refers to her. Calvert Papers Number 882 at page 64, and Rent Rolls, Land Records of Calvert County at page 73, both show a "widow Delamare" as owner of one hundred acres of land in Calvert County known as "Lowrys Reserve" plantation. The record does not show the date of her ownership of this land, except that it was sometime between 1651 and 1723. While this is a span of 72 years and it would seem that the reference might apply to the widow of either Thomas or Peter Lamar as easily as to the widow of the third brother, it is well to remember that Thomas Lamar did not die until 1712 and at the time of his death he was a resident of Prince George County. Hence his widow does not appear to be the person mentioned. It is true that Peter Lamar died in March, 1694, and was a resident of Calvert County at the time of his death, but at least a portion of his land holdings were situated in that part of the county which was created into a new county called Prince George County. This was done in 1696, less than two years after Peter Lamar's death. Furthermore no record has been found that Peter Lamar ever owned a tract of land named "Lowrys Reserve." The reference could not have been to the wife of Dr. John Lemaire for she was a resident of Charles County, and died within a few days after becoming a widow.

It is true that the third brother was probably also a resident of Charles County. Considering the wild and unsettled state of the colony at that time, it would seem natural that his widow and young son should seek security and protection near the surviving members of the family. Thomas and Peter Lamar lived in Calvert County and the "Lowrys Reserve" plantation which the widow acquired was also situated in that county and upon its division remained in Calvert County.

We shall later herein refer to the fact that one of the daughters of Peter Lamar, some years after the death of her father, made her home with Charles Lemar and his wife in Queen Anne County (page 36). Perhaps some obligation resulting from the protection and help offered

his mother, as well as blood relationship and childhood association, may have prompted Charles Lemar to open his home to his young cousin.

Throughout the first two generations in America, the family name was sometimes spelled Lamar and at other times Lemar. This was true in the families of all three of the original settlers. Peter Lamar was perhaps most frequently known as Peter Lemar. James Lemar, a descendant of Thomas Lamar, appears to have used the Lemar spelling, while Thomas Lamar himself was frequently mentioned in his business transactions as Thomas Lemar. Charles Lemar, descendant of the third brother, was at times mentioned in public records as Charles Lamar. It is to be noted that in either form, the pronunciation of the name is the same. After the second generation, however, we find the descendants of Thomas Lamar generally using the Lamar spelling, while the descendants of Charles Lemar did not entirely settle down to the Lemar spelling until about the fourth generation although that form had been more frequently used in public records for many years.

As previously stated, one writer has said that the family was founded in America by four brothers, instead of three as tradition relates. An interesting thought is raised by an item which appears in the North Carolina Historical Register, Vol. 3, at page 143, where under date of 1674 appears the following: "Francis De La Mare, humbly sheweth to the General Court that being by nation a Frenchman and being Protestant was compelled to fly from his country on account of religion, and hath been an inhabitant of this government for the space of eleven years * * * therefore craves that he be made a denizen of the country and enjoy ye privileges of his majesty's free born subjects." This establishes that Francis De La Mare arrived in America in 1663, that he was a Protestant, and the place where he was located had been Virginia until during the year 1663 it was granted to eight lords proprietor and formed into a colony under the name Albemarle, which by common consent soon became known as Carolina. In his will, dated May

15, 1739, and probated in Beaufort County, North Carolina, in March, 1741, bequests were made to his wife Susannah, and to his sons, Thomas and Francis.^{34A} From later references and records it is known that the descendants of Francis De La Mare have since that time spelled their surname as "Delamare." If in fact there was a fourth brother, it would seem that his descendants in this country are known by a name considerably different from that of other members of the family.

As stated in the previous chapter, the children of Peter Lamar were all daughters, and no one remained to carry on the name of Lamar. Since we are concerned primarily with the continuation and development of the Lamar family in America, we will not pursue the Peter Lamar line farther.

Also, as stated, Thomas Lamar was the father of two sons, Thomas II, by the first marriage, and John by the second marriage. The eldest son probably was born about 1670 or shortly before, for in 1699 he married Martha Blanford or Beven³⁵ of Prince George County. John, the younger son, was probably born about 1690 to 1695, for on January 21st, 1714, he married Susannah Tyler, daughter of Robert and Mary Tyler of Prince George County, Maryland.³⁶

It would appear that the elder son, Thomas II, commenced the operation of a portion of his father's plantation at an early age and that he prospered. In 1709, his wife inherited certain property under the will of her sister, Eliza Blanford,³⁷ who also bequeathed certain property to a brother, Richard Beven, and as we have noted, he inherited one-half of his father's land under the will of Thomas Lamar, Sr., referred to above. A large number of land transactions appear upon the records of Prince George County by which it is known that he acquired about three thousand acres of land, situated largely upon Rock Creek and Muddy Creek, near the present city of Rockville, in Montgomery County, Maryland. It has been stated that his wife was a sister of the Rev. John Urquhart, Rector of All Faith Parish in St. Mary's County, but the marriage record and the record of the will of her sister, Eliza Blanford, show this belief to be incorrect and her surname to have been Blanford or Beven. To this union were born six sons and three daughters. Thomas Lamar II seems to have been a devout man, for the preamble to his will runs, "I recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God, hoping through the

merits of Christ to have free pardon of all my sins." He seems to have been the owner of several extensive tracts of land, names of some of which were "Joseph and James," "Conclusion," "Two Brothers," "The Pines," and "Hunting Hill."

His will, dated May 11th, 1747, and probated January 31st, 1748,³⁸ appoints his wife Martha his executrix, and divides his extensive holdings between his sons Robert, Thomas III, Samuel, John, James and Alexander; and the husband of his daughter Mary and of a second daughter whose given name does not appear. Mary Lamar married Clementius Davis, the second daughter married William Williams, while Elizabeth, a third daughter not mentioned in the will of her father, married Joseph Wilson.³⁹ Owing to the fact that no bequest was made to the widow or the daughter Elizabeth, the record of the probate reveals that the "widow refuses to stand to the will and has recourse to her thirds."⁴⁰

The other son of Thomas, Sr., was John. It is interesting to note that when John married Susannah Tyler, daughter of Robert Tyler of Parrott Manor and his wife Susan Du Vall Tyler, on January 21st, 1714, she was only a little over thirteen years of age, having been born July 14th, 1700.⁴¹

A few months after the marriage, the will of Thomas Lamar, Sr., was filed for probate and by its terms, John became the owner of half the real estate of his father.

John Lamar also seems to have been successful and to have enjoyed unusual prosperity, for he became the owner of a number of plantations which he later passed on to his children.

It is well to remark also that a favorite brother of his wife was named Mareen Tyler, for one of her sons was named after this favorite brother and the name became almost a family tradition. It is to be found in several successive generations of this branch of the family. To this union were born eleven children, five sons and six daughters. When John died about 1758, only four of the sons survived him since one of his sons, John II, had died in 1756 leaving several children. The will of the

elder John was dated February 27th, 1758, and divided his property between his sons—Thomas, Robert, Mareen and Richard, and his daughters, Susannah (born November 23rd, 1726), Ann, Rachel, Priscilla, Mary and Elizabeth, and a special bequest was made to the children of the deceased son, John II. This will was not probated until 1774.⁴²

Contemporaneous with the growth of the family of Thomas Lemar II on the western shore of Chesapeake Bay in Maryland, another family of the same name was assuming equal proportions on the eastern shore, presumably descended from the Lamar of Charles County, many of the citizens of which had moved to the more productive land on the east side of the bay.

On January 1st, 1704, the records of the Established Church show that one Mary Lemar resided in Queen Anne County, Maryland, in the home of Charles Lemar and his wife, Mary. These church records disclose that the young Mary Lemar was not the daughter of Charles Lemar, but was undoubtedly a relative. As previously noted, the will of Peter Lamar made a bequest to three daughters, one of whom was named Mary. Under the provisions of the will, she was to receive her share of the estate when she should attain the age of 16 years, or should marry, so that in 1694 at the death of her father, she was a very young girl. Ten years later, we find her making her home with Charles Lemar and his wife, Mary, in Queen Anne County. This Charles Lemar was probably a cousin of Mary's and hence the father of Charles was the third brother, which tradition relates came to America to establish the family here.

This Charles Lemar, whose name appears on the records of Queen Anne County at times as Lamar and at other times as Lemar, began about 1707 to take a very active place in the affairs of his section of the colony. He appears to have been a man of considerable education and training, for while his occupation is given as planter, he was charged frequently with the administration of the estates of his friends and neighbors. On May 2nd, 1710, he purchased the services of a white servant for three

and a half years,⁴³ and again in 1714 he purchased the services of a man and wife as servants for a four-year period.⁴⁴ On August 15th, 1712, a neighbor and friend, Mary Simmons, widow of Henry Simmons of Dorchester County, died leaving a will in which she made a bequest to Charles Lemar, Jr., his son who was at that time a baby, and in the will she provided that the father, Charles, Sr., should become executor of the will and trustee of the bequeathed property until Charles, Jr., should become of age.⁴⁵ In the Spring of 1714 we find the elder Charles in London where, on May 19th, he witnessed a Power of Attorney by one Margaret Brown.⁴⁶ By 1716 he was back in Maryland again where he acted as surety for the administration of the will of William Ireland, deceased,⁴⁷ and where he purchased a plantation in Queen Anne County on December 5th, 1716.⁴⁸ Sometime prior to 1728 the wife of Charles Lemar died⁴⁹ and before June 6th, 1729, he had married Margaret Elsberry, widow of Thomas Elsberry who died May 7th, 1728.⁵⁰ Charles and his first wife had at least two sons, Charles II and Gallant, and four daughters, Henrietta (who married John Hutchinson February 13, 1728), Mary Ann (who married William Hadden on September 27, 1733), Rebecca (who married Thomas Morris, February 5th, 1740), and Sophia (who married Isaiah Whitehead on September 26, 1745). By the second wife he had one son, Luke, and a daughter Priscilla (who married Samuel Wilson on May 1st, 1749). Although he was the owner of several plantations and considerable personal wealth, the record of the probate of his estate has been lost, and it is not possible to determine the date of the death of the elder Charles, although the tax records do disclose that he was taxed up to and was still alive in 1750.

It therefore becomes apparent that at about 1750, at which time the family had been in the province of Maryland a little less than one hundred years, the family name was well known in the colony. Peter Lamar had three descendants, Thomas Lamar had twenty, and the third brother had eight. Of this number, fourteen were males and capable of passing on the name to their descendants.

As stated in the preceding chapter, the sons of Thomas Lamar II and his wife Martha were Robert, Thomas III, Samuel, John, James, and Alexander; while the daughters were Mary, wife of Clementius Davis, a second daughter whose name we do not know but who married William Williams, and Elizabeth, wife of Joseph Wilson. In view of the fact that the various branches of the family used similar given names, therefore, to avoid confusion, we will use the letter "A" to designate the descendants of Thomas Lamar II (A2).

- (1) Robert (A3), the eldest son, was born about 1700. He married Sarah Wilson, sister of Joseph Wilson, husband of Elizabeth Lamar and perhaps also sister of Samuel Wilson, husband of Priscilla Lemar, daughter of Charles Lemar of the eastern shore. In 1755, Robert sold his lands which he had inherited from his father to Rev. John Urquhart, Rector of All Faith Parish whom some supposed to have been his uncle. After the sale of his property, he moved with his family to what is now South Carolina, where he settled in the Edgefield District. Very soon after his change of residence, he died, for in 1756 his widow asked for a land grant in South Carolina for "Robert Lamar, Thomas Lamar, James Lamar, and Philip Lamar, sons of Robert Lamar, deceased." In 1771 his son Robert (A4) executed a deed correcting a mistake in his father's conveyance of the land formerly owned in Maryland and conveyed in 1755 to Reverend Urquhart.⁵¹ The first Federal Census taken in 1790 shows the sons of Robert Lamar (A3) living in the 96th District of Edgefield County, South Carolina. It is to be noted that the official records of the county carry the name of this family as Lemar, although the deeds conveying the

Maryland land above referred to were signed Lamar.

- (2) Thomas Lamar III (A3), son of Thomas Lamar II (A2), was born in Maryland, but no record remains of the date of his birth. He became a physician. He married Eleanor, whose surname is not known. He, also, sold his inherited lands in Frederick County, Maryland, in 1755 to Rev. Urquhart, and moved to South Carolina where he settled in the Edgefield District near his brother Robert (A3). He is reported to have had extensive grants of land on the Savannah River in 1756, 1757, 1758, 1764 and 1768.⁵² The family later settled on Beach Island where it became very wealthy. His wife is reported to have died in the winter of 1777-78 and a daughter Ruth, is reported to have died in the following spring. His will, dated 1777, makes bequests to a son, Thomas Lamar IV (A4), and daughters Ruth, Eleanor, Jemima, Ann and Elizabeth. The first Federal Census taken in 1790 shows that the son, Thomas IV (A4), and the daughter Jemima were both residents of Edgefield County and that Jemima had never married.
- (3) Samuel Lamar (A3), son of Thomas Lamar II (A2), was one of the younger sons and the date of his birth is not known. He married prior to 1755 at which time he also sold his lands in Maryland and moved to South Carolina, where he settled in the Beaufort District.⁵³ It is not known whether he had any children.
- (4) John Lamar (A3) was probably the fourth child of Thomas Lamar II (A2). He was born April 22nd, 1713. His wife's name was Rachel, but her surname is not known. He, also, sold his inherited lands in Maryland in 1755 and with his brothers moved to South Carolina. He received a grant of 300 acres of land on Beaver Dam Creek in 1757, but in 1759 he moved to Georgia where he received a grant of land adjoining that

of his brother, Alexander Lamar (A3). At the time of his arrival in Georgia one of his children still lived at home, the other sons being evidently married and away from home. The time of his death is not known, although he is known to have been alive in 1771 when he executed a deed correcting a mistake in the conveyance of the Maryland lands which he had sold in 1755. His children were Zachariah (A4), John, Jr. (A4), Thomas (A4), Basil (A4), and Jeremiah (A4).⁵⁴

- (5) James Lamar (A3), son of Thomas Lamar II (A2), was also one of the younger sons but the date of his birth is not known. He is reported to have married a lady named Valinda Osborn.⁵⁵ He sold his inherited lands at the same time as his brothers and appears to have moved south with them, but it would seem that he did not like the south as well as the other members of the family, for in 1760 we find him again owning some of the ancestral lands in Frederick County, Maryland, and he continued to do so until after 1771. The tax records of 1760 show that his name was carried on the records as James Lemar, formerly of "Carolina."⁵⁶ No descendants are known.
- (6) Alexander Lamar (A3), son of Thomas Lamar II (A2), was one of the younger sons. He married and sold his Maryland inheritance about 1757. He moved to Georgia and appears to have been the first of the family to settle in that colony, the others having moved to what is now South Carolina. In December 1762, his petition was presented to the Governor of Georgia praying for a grant of 300 acres in Halifax, near McBear's swamp and stating that he had been four years in the province.⁵⁷ He is reported to have had three children, whose names are not known.
- (7) Of the daughters of Thomas Lamar II (A2), Mary married Clementius Davis. They sold their inherited lands the same time as her brothers

and appear to have moved to South Carolina with them and later to Georgia. She had a son whose name was Clementius Davis.⁵⁸ Since the name Lamar was not carried farther in this branch of the family, we will not attempt to follow it.

- (8) The second daughter of Thomas Lamar II (A2), whose given name we do not know, married William Williams and apparently moved to North Carolina about the time her brothers moved to South Carolina.⁵⁹
- (9) The third daughter of Thomas Lamar II (A2) was Elizabeth. She was born October 26th, 1722, and on June 18th, 1747, married Joseph Wilson, brother of the wife of Robert Lamar. She did not move to South Carolina with the other members of the family, being the only one of the children of Thomas Lamar II (A2) who remained in Maryland. She lived and died in what is now Montgomery County, Maryland, leaving a son named Joseph Wilson.⁶⁰ Although the foregoing facts seem agreed upon by other commentators upon the subject, there is considerable doubt in the mind of the writer whether or not Elizabeth was in fact a daughter of Thomas Lamar II (A2). It is known that John Lamar (B2), brother of Thomas Lamar II (A2), had a daughter named Elizabeth and the fact that this Elizabeth did not move to South Carolina with the other sons and daughters of Thomas Lamar II (A2), and the further fact that she was not mentioned in the will of Thomas Lamar II (A2), lends strength to the belief that she may have been the daughter of John Lamar (B2).

Descendants of John Lamar (B2)—as will be remembered in the preceding chapter, we called attention to the fact that John Lamar (B2) left as his heirs, sons John II (B3), Thomas (B3), Robert (B3), Mareen (B3) and Richard (B3) and daughters Susannah (born November 23rd, 1726, who married Alexander Magruder February 18th,

1765), Ann (married Dr. John Briscoe), Rachel (who married William Harding March 22nd, 1785), Priscilla, Mary and Elizabeth.

- (1) John Lamar II (B3), the eldest son, was probably born before 1720. He married Sarah Marshall, daughter of William Marshall. It has been stated by Lantz in the Baltimore Sun, October 29th, 1905, that John Lamar II (B3) "married Susannah Pigman," but this is not correct. Susanna Lamar, his daughter, on August 3, 1777, married Ignatius Pigman, and became Susanna Pigman. She was the daughter, not the wife, of John Lamar II. A deed made by John Lamar II (B3) on August 24th, 1752, shows that his wife was Sarah Marshall, daughter of William Marshall and his will shows that his widow's name was "Sarah" and not "Susanna." They are reported⁶¹ to have had issue as follows—William Bishop (B4), Mack or Maxamillian (B4), Jacob (B4), John III (B4), Rebecca, Mareen (B4), Abraham (B4) and Susanna (who married Abraham Jones, 1773, and married Ignatius Pigman August 3rd, 1777, Prince George County, Maryland). The will of the father, John Lamar II (B3), dated November 2nd, 1756, mentioned only the widow Sarah, and children William Bishop (B4), Jacob (B4), John III (B4), Mack (B4), Rebecca and Susanna.⁶² As will be noticed, the will makes no mention of Mareen and Abraham, as to the parentage of whom some doubt exists. There was an Abraham Lamar who served as a Captain during the Revolutionary War from Prince George County and was a Charter member of the Order of Cincinnati following the war, but no records seem available as to the name of his father, unless he might have been a posthumous child of John Lamar II (B3). It would appear that the only Mareen Lamar living at the time was the son of Robert Lamar, brother of John Lamar II. Also as noted, this John Lamar

- II (B3) died in 1756, some two years previous to the death of his father, John Lamar, Sr. (B2).
- (2) Thomas Lamar (B3) seems to have been the second son of John Lamar (B2). He was a physician. He married Mary Hill of Prince George County, Maryland, moved to the Madeira Islands, where he accumulated great wealth. He then moved to London, England, where he engaged in mercantile trade and where he died about 1796 without issue. His will is on file in London. His widow died in 1799.⁶³
- (3) Robert Lamar (B3), another son of John Lamar (B2), married Sarah Hall and lived in Prince George County, Maryland, and later in Allegany County. At the time of the first Federal Census in 1790, he was a resident of Prince George County but died in Allegany County in 1815. His children were Mareen (B4), a Major (who was killed at Paoli during the Revolutionary War), William (B4) of Revolutionary War fame, Priscilla (who married James Drane February 18th, 1789), Richard (B4), and Elizabeth (who married John Simpkins).⁶⁴ Either Elizabeth or her daughter later married Judge David Lynn of Dublin, Montgomery County, Maryland.
- (4) Mareen Lamar (B3), son of John Lamar (B2), appears to have been the first to bear the name of Susan Tyler Lamar's favorite brother. The name will be found to be quite common throughout several generations. Some confusion has arisen in regard to the identity of this particular Mareen, he having frequently been confused with Major Mareen, who was a son of Robert Lamar referred to in the preceding paragraph,—in other words, with his own nephew. This particular Mareen was appointed United States Consul in the Madeira Islands on November 8th, 1803, and served in that capacity until June 22nd, 1807, which appears to have been the time of his death. It is not known whether he had any issue.⁶⁵

- (5) Richard Lamar (B3), the other son of John Lamar (B2), appears never to have married. His will dated April 8th, 1807, willed certain of his inherited lands to his nephew, William Lamar (B4) (son of Robert Lamar (B3), and to Jacob Lamar (B4) (a son of John Lamar II (B3)). He appointed Richard Lamar (B4) (also a son of Robert Lamar (B3)) sole executor of the will.⁶⁶ From this will it seems reasonable to assume that Richard Lamar (B3) had no children of his own.
- (6) Of the daughters of John (B2) and Susan Tyler Lamar one Susannah Lamar, who was born November 23rd, 1726, married Alexander Magruder and became the mother of John Lamar Magruder.
- (7) Ann Lamar became the second wife of Dr. John Briscoe on March 27th, 1776. He served as a surgeon during the Revolution.
- (8) Rachel married William Harding on March 22nd, 1784.
- (9, 10, 11) No information is available as to the marriages of Priscilla, Mary or Elizabeth.⁶⁷

The descendants of Charles Lemar (C2)—At the same time that the children of Thomas Lamar were finding their places in western Maryland and South Carolina, the third generation of the family on the eastern shore of Maryland were also prospering and increasing in wealth and numbers.

As stated in the previous chapter, Charles Lemar (C2) left surviving him by his first wife two sons, Charles II (C3) and Gallant (C3), and four daughters, Henrietta, Mary Ann, Rebecca and Sophia. And by his second wife one son, Luke (C3), and a daughter, Priscilla.

- (1) Charles Lemar II (C3), the eldest son, appears to have been born about 1710 or slightly before, and to have died about 1783. He was a beneficiary under the will of Mary Simmons as set forth in the preceding chapter. In 1733 he married Anne Young of Queen Anne County, Maryland, daughter of John Young, who died in 1750, and of his

wife, Ann Young. The Parish Register of St. Luke's Parish fails to show the date of the marriage,⁶⁸ but it apparently took place at or near the same time as the marriage of Gallant Lemar, his brother, to Mary Wheeler, and of his sister, Mary Ann Lemar, to William Hadden. On June 18th, 1738, Charles Lemar II (C3) and his wife Anne became the parents of a daughter named Sarah who was baptized on July 9th, 1738. They continued to live in Queen Anne County where Charles II (C3) is shown in the tax returns of 1779 and 1783. At the last named date, he showed his family to consist of himself and four females. He and his wife, Anne, were the parents of Sarah, Nathan (C4), John (C4), James (C4), and Charles III (C4)—the last named perhaps a son by a second marriage.

- (2) Gallant Lemar (C3), a younger son of Charles (C2) and Mary Lemar, appears to have been born about 1712. His peculiar name probably resulted from the association of his father and one Gallant Lane, a very active and apparently prosperous planter of the Eastern Shore. On September 27th, 1733, Gallant Lemar (C3) married Mary Wheeler,⁶⁹ daughter of Luke Wheeler, formerly a resident of Charles County, Maryland, but at that time a resident of Queen Anne County, where he died in 1741. Gallant Lemar (C3) and Mary Lemar became the parents of Gallant II (C4), Wheeler (C4), Lemuel (C4), William (C4) and Hannah. The date of his death is not known.
- (3) Henrietta Lemar, daughter of Charles (C2) and his first wife, married John Hutchinson of Queen Anne County on February 13th, 1728.⁷⁰
- (4) Mary Ann Lemar, another daughter of the first marriage of Charles (C2), married William Hadden of Queen Anne County on September 27, 1733,⁷¹ at the same time that her brother Gallant Lemar (C3) married Mary Wheeler, and

perhaps at the same time that her eldest brother, Charles II (C3), married Anne Young.

- (5) Rebecca Lemar, another daughter of Charles Lemar (C2) by his first marriage, married Thomas Morris of Queen Anne County on February 5th, 1740.⁷²
- (6) Sophia Lemar, probably the youngest daughter of the first marriage of Charles Lemar (C2), was born about 1727. She married Isaiah Whitehead of Queen Anne County on September 26, 1745.
- (7) Luke Lemar (C3), born about 1730, was apparently the eldest child of Charles (C2) and his second wife, Margaret Elsberry Lemar. On December 1st, 1748, he married Amy Sprawl of Queen Anne County.⁷³ Some time after the marriage they appear to have moved from Maryland to Georgia where Luke served in the Georgia Militia during the Revolution in the same regiment with members of the branch of the family descending from Thomas Lamar (A2). For this service he received a grant of land. In 1782; 83; 84 he and his sons John, William and James, were residents and taxpayers of Washington County, Virginia. From 1788 to 1790 Luke (C3) was taxed in Russell County, Virginia, which had been cut off from Washington County. Thereafter he appears to have become a resident of Christian County, Kentucky, and to have owned land there. His will, dated May 19, 1798, mentioned his sons John (C4), William (C4), James (C4), and daughters Mary Montgomery and Nasma, and a grandson Alexander (C5), but it did not mention which one of the sons above named was the father of Alexander.
- (8) Priscilla, the youngest daughter of Charles (C2) and his second wife Margaret, was apparently born about 1734. On May 1st, 1749, she married Samuel Wilson of Queen Anne County, who may have been a brother of Joseph Wilson who married Elizabeth Lamar, and of Sarah Wilson who

married Robert Lamar, children of Thomas Lamar (A2).

In Liber G. F. No. 4, page 14 of the court records of Caroline County, Maryland, appears an entry granting 1,000 pounds of tobacco to one Nancy Lemar, “a widow” for support of a crippled child, in 1777. For this to have been true, there must have been another son of Charles Lamar (C2) whose name is not known—nor is the name of the crippled child known. On October 19th, 1780, the widowed Nancy Lemar married Harrison Monticure.

This generation of the family were largely the ones living in America at the time of the Revolution. They were attaining middle age or were approaching old age and most of them had families who had attained manhood and womanhood at the time the national life of America commenced.

As will have been observed, the fourth generation of the family were born in the period roughly embraced between 1730 and 1760, or from 70 to 100 years after the arrival of the family in America. This generation, therefore, becomes largely the Revolutionary War generation, for during this time, the members of the family had generally arrived at manhood and womanhood, but were not so old that they failed to participate in the stirring events leading up to the birth of the Nation.

In view of the fact that the American provinces had provided asylum for their ancestors at a time when few places in the civilized world offered religious tolerance and in further consideration of the fact that the descendants of the original settlers had attained at least a measure of prosperity, it might be expected that the sympathies of the family, as a whole, would be on the side of the King, but from the record, it would appear that such

was not the case. As we shall progress with the record of the family, we shall see that several of the members rendered illustrious service to the new Nation, and at least two gave their lives in its service.

As we have previously stated, Thomas Lamar II (A2) was the father of Robert (A3), Thomas III (A3), Samuel (A3), John (A3), James (A3), Alexander (A3) and daughters Mary, Elizabeth and another daughter whose name is not preserved, but who married William Williams.

Also as previously stated, the eldest son Robert (A3), was the father of four sons, Robert II (A4), Thomas (A4), James (A4), and Philip (A4).

(a) Robert II (A4) is not known certainly to have had any issue⁷⁴ nor is complete information available as to his marital status. The first census of the 96th District of Edgefield County, South Carolina, taken in 1790 shows Robert Lamar II who had in his family one male over 16 years of age (presumably Robert himself), one male under 16 years of age, one female (presumably his wife) and sixteen slaves. It has been claimed that his will indicates that he never married and had no issue⁷⁵ but there is evidence to support the census record and to indicate that he had one son, named Thomas Winfrey Lamar (A5).⁷⁶

(b) Thomas Lamar (A4), son of Robert Lamar (A3), married and is reported to have had one son, Thomas G. (A5) and four daughters, Ann (who became Mrs. Ann Milledge, second wife of John Milledge, Governor of Georgia, and mother of John Milledge), Elizabeth (who became Mrs. Elizabeth Waldo and mother of Benjamin, Jacob Smith, Elizabeth Mimms, and Sarah Mays), Sarah (who became Mrs. Sarah Starke and of whom no issue is known) and Catherine (who became Mrs. Catherine Speight and mother of Harry Hankinson and Elizabeth Barnes).⁷⁷ The 1790 census for the 96th District of Edgefield County, South Carolina, shows one Thomas Lemar

having two males over 16 years of age, one male under 16 years, five females and 34 slaves. Of the males over 16 years of age, one is presumably Thomas himself.

- (c) James Lamar (A4), son of Robert Lamar (A3), married and had a son whom he named Charles (A5) and two daughters, Sarah (who became Mrs. Sarah Wade, mother of Mrs. Sarah Johnston and Mrs. Mary McCain and grandmother of Mary Johnston, who married Bolivar J. Lamar) and Mary (who became Mrs. Mary Bacon).⁷⁸ This apparently is the same James Lamar who reported as James Lemar in the first Federal Census for the 96th District of Edgefield County, South Carolina, that his family consisted of one male over 16 years of age (himself), three males under 16 years of age, three females and 12 slaves.⁷⁹
- (d) Philip Lamar (A4), son of Robert Lamar (A3), became a planter of wealth and influence. He is said to have married his cousin Ruth Davis. They became the parents of John D. (A5), Philip II (A5), George (A5), and Ann (who became Mrs. Ann Grice, mother of Washington C., Quintus C., and Yates Grice).⁸⁰ Philip (A4) and his wife died about 1807 and are said to be buried in the same grave in Edgefield County, South Carolina. In the first Federal Census for the 96th District of this county, we find reported one Philip Lemar, whose family consisted of one male over 16 years of age, two males under 16 years, two females and 9 slaves.

The next son of Thomas Lamar II (A2) as set forth in the preceding chapter was Dr. Thomas Lamar III (A3) and he in turn is known to have been the father of a son (a) Thomas Lamar IV (A4) and daughters (b) Ruth, (c) Eleanor, (d) Jemima, (e) Ann and (f) Elizabeth. It is not known whether Jessee Lamar was related to Thomas Lamar or not but Jessee Lemar resided in the same district in Edgefield County, in 1790, at the time of

the first Federal Census and reported his family to consist of one male over 16 years of age, three males under 16 years and three females.

- (a) Thomas Lamar IV (A4) married and became the father of two children, a son Mack (A5) and a daughter Elizabeth (who became Mrs. Elizabeth Watley).⁸¹ The younger Thomas Lamar IV (A4) is the one who is shown as Thomas Lemar, in the first Federal Census of 1790 for the 96th District of Edgefield County, South Carolina, in which he showed the family to consist of himself and of three males under 16 years of age, three females and 8 slaves.⁸²

As we have stated in the preceding chapter, no descendants are known of Samuel Lamar (A3), son of Thomas Lamar II (A2).

Also as outlined in the previous chapter, one of the most fruitful sons of Thomas Lamar II (A2) was John Lamar (A3) who had sons (a) Zachariah (A4), (b) John II (A4), (c) Thomas (A4), (d) Basil (A4), (e) Jeremiah (A4).

- (a) Zachariah Lamar (A4), son of John Lamar (A3), was born about 1745. He was a Lieutenant Colonel in the Georgia Militia during the Revolution in the regiment commanded by Colonel Elijah Clark of Georgia.⁸³ Zachariah Lamar never married and left no issue.
- (b) John Lamar II (A4), son of John Lamar (A3) and grandson of Thomas Lamar II (A2), was born about 1740 in Maryland. He came with his parents to Georgia in 1755. In June, 1756, he made application to the Governor of the Province of Georgia for lands in St. Paul's Parish near Augusta, adjoining the lands of his father, stating that he had been in the Province about a year and had two negroes. He was married three times. The name of his first wife is not known, but his second wife was Sarah Bugg, daughter of Edmund Bugg, a very wealthy man and a member of the Georgia Provincial Congress which

- met in Savannah in January, 1775. The third wife was Lucy Appling. This John Lamar served during the Revolution as a Captain in the Georgia Militia⁸⁴ for which service he received a land grant in 1784.⁸⁵ His children, by which wife unknown, were (1) John III (A5), Zachariah (A5), Basil (A5), Harmong (A5) and Jackson (A5).⁸⁶
- (c) Thomas Lamar (A4), son of John Lamar (A3), was married and lived in Georgia. He is reported to have married Katherine Reynolds of Baltimore, Maryland. They had a son, Zachariah (A5), and two daughters, Mary (who became Mrs. Mary Jeter) and Rebecca (who married John Lamar III (A5), son of John Lamar, Jr. (A4), her first cousin.⁸⁷
- (d) Basil Lamar (A4), son of John Lamar (A3), married and lived and died in Georgia. His descendants were John (A5), Pennington (A5), Peter (A5), Ezekiel (A5), and a daughter Prudence (who became Mrs. Prudence Winn).⁸⁸ Basil Lamar served in the Georgia Militia during the Revolution in the same regiment in which his brothers Zachariah and John served. For this service, he received a grant of land in 1784.⁸⁹
- (e) Jeremiah Lamar (A4), son of John Lamar (A3), married and had issue as follows—John (A5), James (A5), Thomas (A5) and a daughter whose given name is unknown but who became Mrs. Moses Sinquefield.⁹⁰

As stated in the previous chapter, no descendants are known of James Lamar (A3). He is believed to have moved south with the other members of the family and to have returned in 1760 to Maryland where he continued to live, at least until 1771.

The next son of Thomas Lamar II (A2) was Alexander Lamar (A3). He married, moved to Georgia with the other members of his family and is believed to have had three children whose names are not known.

We have followed the fourth generation descendants of Thomas Lamar, through Thomas Lamar, Jr., and we now turn to the fourth generation as descended from John Lamar (B2), son of Thomas Lamar, Sr.

As we have stated in a previous chapter, John Lamar (B2) had sons (1) John II (B3), (2) Thomas (B3), (3) Robert (B3), (4) Mareen (B3), and (5) Richard (B3), and daughters (6) Susannah, (7) Ann, (8) Rachel, (9) Priscilla, (10) Mary and (11) Elizabeth.

- (1) The eldest son appears to have been John Lamar II (B3), who died in 1756 some two years before the death of his father. It has been stated by Lantz in the Baltimore Sun article on October 29th, 1905, that John Lamar II (B3) married Susannah Pigman, but the records of Frederick County, Maryland, show this statement is not correct. A deed made by John Lamar II (B3) on August 24th, 1752, some four years before his death, shows that his wife was Sarah Marshall

Lamar, daughter of William Marshall, while his will shows that his widow's name was Sarah and not Susannah. On the other hand, he had a daughter, Susanna Lamar, who on August 3rd, 1777, married Ignatius Pigman in Baltimore County, Maryland. As shown in a previous chapter, certain of the children of John Lamar II (B3) were beneficiaries under the will of their grandfather, John Lamar (B2), in 1758. The will, however, of their father, John Lamar II (B3), shows that he had sons (a) William Bishop (B4), (b) Jacob (B4), (c) John III (B4), (d) Mack or Maxamillian (B4), (e) Rebecca and (f) Susanna.

- (a) William Bishop Lamar (B4), the eldest son, was born August 3rd, 1745, and on August 19th, 1767, married Elizabeth Smith who was born in 1751. He is called "Colonel William Bishop Lamar" in the records of Frederick County, Maryland, although no record of military service on his part is shown. He owned vast estates in Maryland and in Breckenridge County, Kentucky. During the summer of 1812, William Bishop Lamar (B4) went to Kentucky to see his land and on the return trip over the famed "Wilderness Trail" was taken ill in Hawkins County, Tennessee. Fearing the approach of death, he made his will⁹¹ which recited: "On my way from the State of Kentucky to my residence in Frederick County, Maryland, and being sick and in a low state of health, but of perfect mind and memory I * * * do give to my son, Mareen T. Lamar, a tract of land which I purchased from John Lewis, 160 acres, situated in Breckenridge County, Kentucky, adjoining lands of Joseph Killenbarger (probably husband of Rachel Lamar) * * * and I also give to him, my son Mareen aforesaid, one negro boy, one horse * * *

and I give to my two sons Benjamin S. Lamar and Richard S. Lamar, the tract of land on which I live including all the land which has not been conveyed to my sons Thomas and William Lamar to be equally divided between the said Benjamin and Richard.” He went on in this will to divide his negroes and live stock between his “four daughters, Henney, Sally, Susannah and Rachel.” It has been stated⁹² that William Bishop Lamar had issue Mary Ann born December 31, 1767, Henrietta (Henney) born February 14, 1769; Sarah born September 20, 1770; John (B5) born September 28, 1772; Archibald (B5) born June 25th, 1774; Anne born March 26, 1776; Thomas (B5) born December 17, 1777; Susannah; Ruth; William (B5) born 1790; Benjamin (B5); Rachel (who married a Mr. Killenbarger) and Mareen Tyler Lamar (B5). As will be noticed, the will above cited fails to mention Anne, John (B5), Archibald (B5), Ruth or Mary Ann.

- (b) Jacob Lamar (B4), the second son of John Lamar II (B3) and beneficiary under the will of his grandfather, John Lamar (B2), is believed to have been born about 1746 and to have died shortly before 1824 as is shown by a suit filed in Prince George County, Maryland, in which it is recited that “The said Jacob Lamar is also dead intestate leaving five children, to wit: Mareen, (B5); Elizabeth; Richard (B5); John (B5); and Gustavus (B5) Lamar, of Prince George County, his sole representatives and heirs at law.”⁹³ Jacob Lamar (B4) served during the Revolution in the Sixth Pennsylvania Regiment, Capt. Finney’s Company.
- (c) John Lamar III (B4), one of the younger sons of John Lamar II (B3), died while a young man. He is reported by Lantz in Bal-

timore Sun article of October 29, 1905, to have "married and had a daughter who married a Mr. Belt, and their son William Belt Lamar * * * had a daughter Margaret." This statement is patently incorrect for the marriage record of Prince George County, Maryland, shows that John Lamar III (B4) married Sarah Belt, widow of Higginson Belt. It is not certainly known whether they had any children, but if such a person as William Belt Lamar lived, he was no doubt a son of this union. Had William Belt Lamar been the son of a daughter of John Lamar, who married a Mr. Belt, the son would have borne the surname "Belt" and not "Lamar," but since his surname was Lamar, it appears certain that William Belt Lamar was the son of John Lamar III and Sarah Belt Lamar. The same record reveals that William Belt Lamar had a sister whose name is unknown but who married a Captain Herbert, who died of camp fever during the War of 1812.

- (d) Maxamillian Lamar (B4), another son of John Lamar II (B3), was sometimes known as Mack Lamar. He married and had a son named John (B5) and a daughter named Polly. Mack became a General in the Revolutionary Army and was killed at the Battle of Saratoga in 1777.⁹⁴
- (e) Rebecca Lamar, one of the daughters of John Lamar II (B3), is not mentioned in later records and it is not known whether she survived her childhood or not.
- (f) Susanna Lamar, another daughter of John Lamar II (B3), appears to have been three times married. In 1773 in Prince George County, Maryland, she married Abraham Jones. On August 3rd, 1777, in Baltimore County, Maryland, she married Ignatius Pigman and on December 28th, 1791, in Prince

George County, Maryland, she married Cornelius Watson. No issue of any marriage is known.

It has been reported by Lantz in the Baltimore Sun, October 29th, 1905, that John Lamar II (B3) also had sons Mareen and Abraham, and that Abraham Lamar was a Captain in the Revolutionary War. It is certain that a Captain Abraham Lamar lived and served in the Revolutionary Army of Maryland and was a member of the "Order of Cincinnati" established after the War of the Revolution, but as above stated, the will of John Lamar II (B3) fails to mention either Mareen or Captain Abraham Lamar and considerable doubt exists as to whether these were sons of John Lamar II (B3).

- (2) Thomas Lamar (B3), son of John Lamar (B2), appears to have been the second son. He became a physician. He married Mary Hill of Prince George County, Maryland, moved to the Madeira Islands where he accumulated great wealth. He then moved to London, England, where he engaged in merchandising and where he died about 1796, without issue. His will is on file in London. His widow died in 1799.⁶³
- (3) Robert Lamar (B3), another son of John Lamar (B2), married Sarah Hall and lived in Prince George County, Maryland, and later in Allegany County. In the first Federal Census, he was shown as a resident of Prince George County. He lived to be a very old man and died in 1815. His children were (a) Mareen (B4); (b) William (B4); (c) Priscilla (who married James Drane February 18, 1789); (d) Richard (B4); and a daughter (e) Elizabeth (who married John Simpkins).
 - (a) Mareen Lamar (B4) seems to have been one of the elder sons of Robert Lamar (B3) and Sarah Lamar. His name is variously spelled—Mareen, Morine, Marien, and Merion. Dur-

ing his young manhood, he appears to have taken up residence in Northampton County, Pa. At the outbreak of the Revolutionary War, he was appointed Captain of the First Pennsylvania Battalion.⁹⁵ He was a member of General Anthony Wayne's expedition against Canada.⁹⁶ On September 30th, 1776, he was appointed Major in the Fourth Pennsylvania Regiment⁹⁷ and in January, 1777, he was made Major in the Fourth Regiment of the Pennsylvania Continental Line.⁹⁸ He was killed in action at Paoli, Parle's Tavern or White Horse as it is variously called.⁹⁹ He died without issue. It has been claimed that Major Mareen Lamar was the son of John Lamar II (B3) instead of Robert Lamar (B3). As previously stated in this chapter, there is no record to indicate that John Lamar II (B3) had a son Mareen and in his will, made in 1756, he fails to mention such a son. On the other hand, the records of the U. S. Pension Office show Bounty Warrant 2323-400 in which certain persons asserted that they were the surviving heirs and next of kin of Major Merian Lamar, deceased, killed at White Horse, and made application for the allowance to them of the bounty lands to which Major Lamar would have been entitled if alive. These petitioners were a niece, Elizabeth Simpkins (daughter of Elizabeth Lamar Simpkins), William S. Lamar (B6) (grandson of Col. William Lamar (B4)), Mary Sprigg (granddaughter of Col. William Lamar (B4) and daughter of Mary Lamar Sprigg), Mary Tilghman (granddaughter of Col. William Lamar (B4) and daughter of either Ann or Louise Lamar, both of whom married Tilghman men), Richard Lamar (B6) (grandson of Richard Lamar (B4) and son of Richard Lamar (B5)).

John W. Lamar (B6) (grandson of Richard Lamar (B4) and son of James Lamar (B5)); Elizabeth Childs (granddaughter of Richard Lamar (B4) and daughter of Elizabeth Lamar Childs); Thomas, James, Richard, Marian, Elizabeth and William Drane (grandchildren of Priscilla Lamar Drane, and children of her son Richard Drane); James H., Maria, and William C. Drane (great grandchildren of Priscilla Lamar Drane and grandchildren of her son William Drane). It will be noticed that these petitioners were all descendants of Robert Lamar (B3) and not of John Lamar II (B3).

- (b) William Lamar (B4) appears to have been the second son of Robert Lamar (B3). With the outbreak of the Revolution, the spirit of patriotism ran in this particular branch of the family and William (B4) became an Ensign and later First Lieutenant in the 7th Regiment of the Maryland Line and later Captain in the First Regiment of the Maryland Line.¹⁰⁰ He served from 1776 throughout the entire conflict until 1782, his services consisting of the Campaigns of the North and those of the South as well. He married Margaret Worthington, daughter of Mary Worthington of Baltimore. They were the parents of (1) Sarah, (2) William Lynch, (B5), (3) Louise (who married Col. Frisby Tilghman of Washington), (4) Ann, (who married George Tilghman, the son of her sister's husband by a former marriage), (5) Richard (B5), and (6) Mary (who married Honorable Michael C. Sprigg). The parent William Lamar (B4) moved to Allegany County, Maryland, in 1808 and participated in the War of 1812. He died at the age of 83 years and lies buried at Cumberland, Maryland. The monument over his grave recites:

“At the tap of the Revolutionary Drum in his native state to the standard of his country he flew, nor left it until she was acknowledged free and independent amongst the nations of the earth. At the battles of Harlem Heights, White Plains, Germantown, Monmouth, Staten Island, in the north; at Camden, Guilford Courthouse, Eutaw, the capture of Forts Motte, Granby and Watson, at the siege of Ninety-six, in the south, he was present and actively engaged, and by his coolness, bravery and skill he rendered most signal and important service to the Army. At Guilford, the desperate charge of the American Troops which turned the scale of battle in their favor was ordered at his suggestion, which was communicated to General Green through Major Anderson; and the plan of firing Fort Motte, which was successfully adopted and which occasioned the immediate surrender of that Fort by the British, originated exclusively with him. In the disastrous battle of Camden, he was foremost in the fight and was by the side of De Kalb when that brave officer fell. At the siege of Ninety-six the immortal Kosciusko was his fellow soldier and served under him for a while. The noble conduct of this brave Pole was the theme of his praise and admiration through life. Entering the army at the commencement of the Revolution, he continued with it, engaged in active service, until the close of the war. During the contest he made but one visit home.”

- (c) Priscilla Lamar, daughter of Robert Lamar (B3), on February 18th, 1789, married James Drane by whom she became the mother of at least two sons. One of these sons, Richard Drane, became the father of Thomas, James, Richard, Jr., Marion, Elizabeth and William

Drane. The other son became the father of James, Maria and William C. Drane. Especial attention is invited to this fact since it is part of the conclusive evidence which establishes that Major Mareen Lamar (B4) above mentioned was the son of Robert Lamar (B3) and not the son of John Lamar (B3).¹⁰²

- (d) Richard Lamar (B4), one of the younger sons of Robert Lamar (B3) and Sarah Lamar, married Ann Drane¹⁰¹ on November 9th, 1790, and they acquired considerable land holdings in Prince George County, Maryland. They became the parents of a daughter (1) Elizabeth, (who married Samuel Childs and became mother of Elizabeth Childs), and three sons (2) James (B5), (3) Richard Jr. (B5), and (4) Mareen T. (B5). In the 1810 census of Prince George County, Maryland, this Richard Lamar (B4) reported his family to consist of five males under 10 years of age, one male under 16 years, one male under 26 years, and one male over 45 years, one female under 16 years, and one female under 45 years. The names of his other sons are not known, but it is known that Richard Lamar Jr. (B5), or a son of the same name, moved to Marion County, Missouri, before March 4th, 1843. The elder Richard Lamar (B4) was deceased by April 2, 1826, when his daughter Elizabeth Lamar Childs and his son James (B5) sold a portion of their inherited lands and on April 1, 1831, Mareen T. Lamar (B5) and his brothers Richard Jr. (B5) and James (B5) joined in selling slaves and other personal property. One writer upon the subject has stated that Richard Lamar (B4) remained unmarried and without issue, but the evidence of marriage¹⁰² and that Elizabeth (Childs), James, Mareen

T. and Richard Jr. are issue of that marriage is beyond question.

- (e) Elizabeth Lamar, the youngest daughter of Robert (B3) and Sarah Lamar married John Simpkins of Allegany County, Maryland, on May 5th, 1805¹⁰³ and became the mother of a daughter also named Elizabeth.
- (4) Mareen Lamar (B3) was one of the younger sons of John Lamar (B2). As stated in a previous chapter, he became the United States Consul in Madeira Islands on November 8, 1803, and served in that capacity until June 22, 1807, which appears to have been the date of his death. He left no known issue.⁶⁴
- (5) Richard (B3) Lamar was also one of the younger sons of John Lamar (B2). He never married and died without issue.

No descendants are known of the daughters of John Lamar (B2), viz., (6) Susannah, (7) Ann, (8) Rachel, (9) Priscilla, (10) Mary or (11) Elizabeth.

During the same period of time, on the eastern shore of Maryland, the descendants of Charles Lemar (C2) had also attained considerable number and assumed an important place in the affairs of the new nation.

As stated in the previous chapter, Charles Lemar (C2) left surviving him by his first wife the following named children: (1) Charles II (C3), (2) Gallant (C3), (3) Henrietta, (4) Mary Ann, (5) Rebecca, and (6) Sophia. By his second wife he had (7) Luke (C3), and (8) Priscilla.

- (1) Charles Lemar II (C3), the eldest son, married Anne Young and became the father of a daughter (a) Sarah, and four sons (b) Nathan (C4), (c) John (C4), (d) James (C4), and (e) Charles III (C4).

- (a) Sarah, born June 18, 1738. Nothing further is known of her.

- (b) Nathan Lemar (C4) probably the eldest son of Charles Lemar II (C3), married Ann Mason, daughter of John and Ann Mason of Queen Anne County, Maryland, in 1770.¹⁰⁴ In a census of Caroline County, Maryland, taken in 1776, he reported that his family consisted of two males under 16 years of age.¹⁰⁵ He appears to have been married a second time to Margaret Harper of Caroline County, Maryland. He died in 1820 leaving¹⁰⁶ surviving him a son (1) Richard (C5) and three daughters, (2) Sarah (who married Barnett McCombs in 1792), (3) Elizabeth (who married Thomas Mumfort in 1801), and (4) Nancy (who married William Brown in 1816). It appears possible that he may have had another daughter, named Ann, for on February

2nd, 1817, an Ann Lemar married Joseph Jackson in Caroline County, Maryland.

- (c) John Lemar (C4), the second son of Charles Lemar II (C3) appears to have been born in that portion of Queen Anne County, Maryland, which in 1774 became Caroline County, Maryland. The name of his wife is not known nor is there any information available as to the time of his marriage. In 1783 the Tax Records of Caroline County, Maryland, show him living in the home of his brother, James Lemar (C4). At the time of the first Federal Census in 1790, he was still a resident of Caroline County, Maryland, and besides himself reported three sons under sixteen years of age, one female, and one slave. He appears to have remained in Caroline County until about 1793. At about that time his wife died and with his children, in 1794 he moved to Mason County, Kentucky,¹⁰⁷ where he thenceforth made his home. The names of his children by his first marriage are not all known, but in his family appears (1) John Jr. (C5) who went to Kentucky with his father and attained his majority about 1813, (2) a daughter, whose name is unknown, but is presumed to have been Rebecca (who married Aaron Burows in Mason County, Kentucky, May 17th, 1802). By a second marriage John Lemar (C4) appears to have become the father of (3) Elijah (C5) born in 1801,¹⁰⁸ and (4) Keziah (C5) born in 1803.¹⁰⁹
- (d) James Lemar (C4), the third son of Charles Lemar II (C3), was probably born about 1750 in Queen Anne County, Maryland, in that part which in 1774 became Caroline County. On February 23rd, 1778, he married Mary Eubanks, the daughter of William and Mary Eubanks of Queen Anne County, Maryland¹¹⁰. Not many of the tax records of Caro-

line County survive, but those of 1779 are available and show he was the owner of considerable property at that time,¹¹¹ while the tax records of 1783, which are also intact, show him to still be a resident of Caroline County with his wife and children, and that his brother John Lemar (C4) lived with him as a member of his household. At the time of the first Federal Census in 1790 he was a resident of Caroline County, Maryland, and reported, besides his wife and himself, four sons under sixteen years of age (oldest was 11 years). His wife died between 1796 and 1799 and between March 1st and July 1st, 1799, he and his six young sons moved to Mason County, Kentucky, where his brother John Lemar (C4) had been located for about five years.¹¹² Having determined to make Kentucky his home, on April 1st, 1800, James Lemar (C4) married Rose McGloghlin in Mason County, Kentucky.¹¹³ In 1804 he purchased land on Bull Creek in that County which land he sold in 1806. No record of the date of his death remains but it was prior to 1813. He left surviving him by his first marriage six sons as follows: (1) John Lemar (C5) born January 2, 1779; (2) William Lemar (C5) born January 27, 1782; (3) James Lemar II (C5) born January 25, 1784; (4) Henry Lemar (C5) born October 4, 1786; (5) Richard Lemar (C5) born August 24, 1791; (6) Thomas Lemar (C5) born November 3, 1795. The incomplete condition of the records of Kentucky at that early date fail to disclose of what his estate consisted but that he left an estate is evidenced by the fact that in 1816 when his widow was about to marry William Tolle of Mason County, Kentucky, she entered into a pre-nuptial agreement by which the estate she had inherited from her

former husband James Lemar (C4) was to remain hers and pass to her heirs, instead of passing to her new husband as was provided by the common law at that time in effect in Kentucky.¹¹⁴

- (e) Charles Lemar III (C4) was the youngest son of Charles Lemar II (C3). The date of his birth is not known but on November 26th, 1781, he married Nancy Jump of Caroline County, Maryland.¹¹⁵ He continued to live in Caroline County, Maryland, until after 1783 during which year the tax records disclose his family to have consisted of three males and three females. But shortly thereafter, he moved with his wife and family to Virginia where in 1786 was born a son named Charles IV (C5). In 1802, the family moved to Fairfield County, Ohio, where they resided at the time of his death.
- (2) As previously stated, the second child of Charles Lemar (C2) was Gallant (C3) who, in 1733, married Mary Wheeler by whom he had four sons, as follows: (a) Gallant II (C4), (b) Wheeler (C4), (c) Lemuel (C4), (d) William (C4), and at least one daughter (e) Hannah. This daughter appears never to have married.
- (a) Gallant Lemar II (C4) was born in Queen Anne County, Maryland, and resided in that part of the County which became Caroline County. He seems to have become the first of the family to settle in Kentucky, for in 1777, shortly after the opening of Kentucky by Daniel Boone and others, Gallant, Jr. asserted his claim to land therein by reason of one year's residence upon the land of his selection. By 1779 he was back in Caroline County, Maryland. In 1782 he owned property and was taxed in Washington County, Virginia, but by the time of the First Federal Census in 1790 he was again living in Caro-

line County, Maryland, where he continued to live thereafter. The census of 1800 shows that he was a man of considerable wealth. The will of his brother William (C4) dated May 26, 1812, named him as a beneficiary, so it would appear that he was still living at that time. The date of his death is not known. He is believed to have been the father of (1) Gallant III (C5), (2) Luke (C5), and (3) James (C5). These sons were all residents of Kent County, Delaware, at the time of the Census of 1800, 1810 and 1820, only a few miles away from their father who was living in Caroline County, Maryland.

- (b) Wheeler Lemar (C4), the second son of Gallant Lemar (C3) appears also to have been born in Queen Anne County, Maryland. In 1790 he and his wife, Anne, who was a daughter of John Murphy, deceased, sold certain lands in Caroline County, Maryland.¹¹⁶ In the First Federal Census of that year he reported one son under 16 years of age, and in the 1800 census of the same county he reported one son under 16 years of age, another son under 10 years of age, and three daughters also under 10 years. The names of his children are not known.
- (c) Lemuel Lemar (C4) was probably also a son of Gallant Lemar (C3) although it is possible that he might have been the son of Charles Lemar II (C3). He was born in Queen Anne County, Maryland. In 1783 he lived in Caroline County which had been carved out of Queen Anne County. At that time he reported two males and two females in his family, which would indicate that he and his wife were the parents of two children, a boy and a girl. The 1790 Federal Census showed his family to consist of one male under 16 years of age, and four females. That he was a son

of Gallant Lemar (C3) is indicated by the fact that in 1792 he was a resident and taxpayer of Logan County, Kentucky, where several known descendants of Gallant Lemar (C3) soon became residents. The names of the children of Lemuel Lemar (C4) are not known. He is presumed to have died before 1812.

- (d) William Lemar (C4) was the youngest son of Gallant Lemar (C3). Little is known of him except that the 1810 Federal Census of Caroline County, Maryland, showed him as a resident and that his family consisted of one male under 10 years of age, two males under 26 years of age, one female under 26 years of age and one female under 45 years of age. His will, dated May 26, 1812, and filed for probate in Caroline County, made bequests to his two surviving brothers, Gallant Lemar II (C4) and Wheeler Lemar (C4), and to his sister Hannah, besides a specific bequest to his son Spencer Lemar (C5).¹¹⁷
- (3) Henrietta Lemar, the third child of Charles Lemar (C2) by his first marriage, married John Hutchinson in Queen Anne County, Maryland, in 1728. No descendants are known.
- (4) Mary Ann Lemar, the fourth child of Charles Lemar (C2), was married on September 27, 1733, to William Hadden in Queen Anne County, Maryland, on the same day that her brother Gallant Lemar (C3) married Mary Wheeler. The date of her death is not known, but the will of her husband, William Hadden, dated May 7, 1770, mentioned his wife's name as Mabel, which would indicate that Mary Ann Lemar Hadden had died and that her husband had married a second time. The first wife, Mary Ann Lemar Hadden, is presumed to have been the mother of William Hadden, Jr., who in 1796 took land in Logan County, Ken-

tucky, where a number of the Lemar family had located.

- (5) Rebecca Lemar, another daughter of Charles Lemar (C2), married Thomas Morris in Queen Anne County, Maryland, in 1740. No descendants are known.
- (6) Sophia Lemar was probably the youngest child of Charles Lemar (C2) by his first marriage. She married Isaiah Whitehead in Queen Anne County, Maryland, in 1745. No descendants are known.
- (7) Luke Lemar (C3), the eldest child of Charles Lemar (C2) by his second marriage, was born in Queen Anne County, Maryland. On December 1, 1748, he married Amy Sprawl of the same county. They continued to live in that county for some time and in 1763 he witnessed the will of John Swift, but that is the last record of Luke (C3) in that county. Shortly thereafter he appears to have moved to Georgia where the descendants of Thomas Lamar (A2) had so recently located. During the American Revolution Luke Lemar (C3) participated as a member of the Georgia Militia, apparently as a member of the same regiment in which so many of the descendants of Thomas Lamar (A2) served. For this service Luke Lemar (C3) received a grant of land in Georgia. Also awarded land in the same county for military service, were Samuel and Benjamin Lamar, members of the branch of the family descending from Thomas Lamar (A2). We shall later have occasion to refer to this Samuel and Benjamin Lamar, who were signers of a petition in Lincoln County, Kentucky, along with Gallant Lemar III (C5), grand nephew of Luke Lemar (C3). Apparently Luke Lemar (C3) did not remain long in Georgia, for from 1782 to 1784 he and his sons, John, William and James, were all residents and taxpayers of Washington County, Virginia. Not all of the records of that part

of Virginia remain, but the tax records of 1788 to 1790 show that Luke Lemar (C3) and his son John still lived in Russell County, Virginia, which had been formed from a part of Washington County. Later Luke (C3) became a resident of Logan County, Kentucky, where he was taxed in 1794. He died in Christian County, Kentucky, and his will, dated May 19, 1798, made bequests to his three sons, (a) John (C4), (b) William (C4), (c) James (C4) and two daughters, (d) Mary Montgomery and (e) Nasma. The will also mentions a grandson Alexander Lemar (C5) but fails to mention which one of the sons was the father of this child.

- (8) Priscilla Lemar, the youngest child of Charles Lemar (C2) by his second marriage, married Samuel Wilson in Queen Anne County, Maryland, in 1749. It is to be noted that Robert Lamar (A3), a son of Thomas Lamar (A2) of the western shore of Maryland, had married Sarah Wilson at about this same time, and that Elizabeth Lamar, a daughter of Thomas Lamar (A2), had married Joseph Wilson, also near this same time. It does not appear whether Samuel Wilson, Sarah Wilson and Joseph Wilson were related, but it seems reasonable to suppose that the marriages above mentioned constituted three alliances of the Lamar and Wilson families. No descendants of the marriage of Priscilla Lemar and Samuel Wilson are known to the writer.

It will be observed that by the year 1800, the Lamar family had grown to considerable proportions and had scattered into a number of states in the new republic. Throughout the first three generations, the residence of the members of the family had been confined to the Atlantic seaboard, but shortly after the Revolution, the members of the family started the westward march which was to scatter those of the name into almost every state of the Union.

By this time, also, the number of family descendants had grown to such large proportions that it is no longer practicable to follow them by generations, and we will, therefore, take up the various descendants by branches of the family tree, following each branch as far as information is available.

Referring back to previous chapters, Thomas Lamar, II (A2) was the father of sons (1) Robert (A3); (2) Thomas III (A3); (3) Samuel (A3); (4) John (A3); (5) James (A3); (6) Alexander (A3). We shall attempt to follow the descendants of Robert Lamar (A3) who had sons—(A) Robert II (A4); (B) Thomas (A4); (C) James (A4); (D) Philip (A4).

- (A) Robert Lamar II (A4), the eldest son of Robert Lamar (A3), died in Edgefield County, South Carolina, in 1808. It has been questioned by some whether Robert Lamar II (A4) ever married or had any children, but the 1790 Census of the 96th District of Edgefield County, South Carolina, shows that his family consisted, besides himself and a wife, of one son under 16 years of age and 16 slaves. It is believed that (1) Thomas Winfrey Lamar (A5) was his son. No descendants of Thomas Winfrey Lamar (A5) are known.
- (B) Thomas Lamar (A4), the son of Robert Lamar (A3), is reported to have married a lady named Ann, whose surname is not known. He was commonly known as Thomas Lamar of Horse Creek to distinguish him from the other Thomas Lamar living in Georgia and South Carolina at that time. He had one son (1) Thomas G. (A5) and four daughters (2) Ann (who became the second wife of Governor John Milledge of Georgia and mother of John Milledge); (3) Elizabeth (who married a Mr. Waldo and became the mother of Elizabeth Mimms, Benjamin, Jacob S. and Sarah Mays); (4) Sarah (who married a Mr. Starke), (5) Catherine Lamar (who married a Mr. Speight).
- (1) Thomas G. Lamar (A5), son of Thomas Lamar (A4), married Martha L. Cary and became the father of (a) B. Cary (A6), born 1824; (b) Thomas G., Jr. (A6), born in 1827; (c) Robert G. (A6), born in 1829; (d) Bolivar D. (A6); (e) Martha (who married Mr. Peavy); (f) Eliza (who married Mr. Starke); (g) Ann (who married Mr. Wardlaw); (h) Caroline. Previous records of the family fail to show the daughter Caroline, but the 1850 Census of Edgefield County, South Carolina, shows the mother, Martha Lamar, as a resident, age 62, born in Virginia, and her family consisted of a daughter, Caroline, age 22, born in South Carolina, and a son Robert, age 21, also born in South Carolina.

- (a) B. Cary Lamar (A6), the son of Thomas G. Lamar (A5), was born in Edgefield County, South Carolina, in 1824. The 1850 Census of that county shows him a resident, that his wife's name was Mary and that they had a son (1) Daniel J. Lamar (A7), born in 1849.
- (b) Thomas G. Lamar, Jr. (A6), son of Thomas G. Lamar (A5), was born in Edgefield County, South Carolina, 1827. He married Sarah, whose surname is not known. The 1850 Census of that county showed that they had children (1) Abner Whatley (A7), born in 1847; (2) Thomas G. III (A7), born in 1849. Later records indicate that they had further children (3) Robert D. (A7); (4) S. Dunbar (A7); (5) Celia; and (6) Calbrith.
 - (1) Abner Whatley (A7), son of Thomas G. Lamar, Jr. (A6), married Bessie Webb and had children (a) W. Landrum (A8); (b) Whatley (A8); (c) Lillie; (d) Mary; (e) another daughter whose name is not known. No descendants of the foregoing are known.
 - (2) Thomas G. Lamar III (A7) became the father of (a) Weed (A8); (b) Tracy (A8); (c) Louise. No descendants of these children are known.
 - (3) No descendants of Robert D. Lamar (A7) are known.
 - (4) S. Dunbar Lamar (A7). No known descendants, and the same is true of—
 - (5) Celia, and
 - (6) Calbrith.
- (c) Robert G. Lamar (A6), son of Thomas G. Lamar (A5), became the father of (1) Willie (A7); (2) Thomas (A7); (3) Robert, Jr. (A7); (4) A. Jones (A7) and daughters

(5) Nana (who married Mr. Gibbs); (6) Ella; (7) Carrie (who married Mr. McCrary); (8) Hattie (who married Mr. Edward); (9) Annie. No descendants of any of these children are known.

(d) Bolivar D. Lamar (A6) was a son of Thomas G. Lamar (A5) and became the father of (1) Bolivar J. Lamar (A7), who married his cousin Mary Johnston and had three children, (a) Avery (A8); (b) Elliott (A8); (c) Mary. No descendants of these children are known.

No attempt is made to follow the descendants of Martha Lamar Peavy, Eliza Lamar Starke, Ann Lamar Wardlaw or Caroline Lamar.

(C) James Lamar (A4), son of Robert Lamar (A3), had one son (1) Charles (A5) and two daughters (2) Sarah (who became Mrs. Wade, mother of Mrs. Sarah Johnston and Mrs. Mary McCain); (3) Mary (who became Mrs. Bacon).

(1) Charles Lamar (A5), son of James Lamar (A4), married Dianne whose surname is not known, and resided in Edgefield County, S. C., where the 1850 Census showed them to have been the parents of (a) James H. Lamar (A6), born in 1824; (b) Charles, Jr. (A6), born in 1832; (c) Victoria, born in 1836. This does not entirely agree with the statements made previously, but being taken from official census records is believed to be correct. No descendants of James H. (A6), Charles (A6) or Victoria are known.

(D) Philip Lamar (A4), son of Robert Lamar (A3), married his cousin, Ruth Davis, and had three sons—(1) John D. (A5); (2) Philip II (A5); (3) George (A5) and one daughter (4) Ann (who married Mr. Grice).

(1) John D. Lamar (A5), son of Philip Lamar (A4), had sons—(a) John M. (A6) and (b) Philip G. (A6) of whom no descendants are known.

- (2) Philip Lamar II (A5), son of Philip Lamar (A4), had sons (a) George W. (A6); (b) John (A6); (c) William H. (A6); (d) James S. (A6); (e) Philip F. III (A6) and a daughter (f) Sarah.
- (a) George W. Lamar (A6) had no descendants so far as is known.
- (b) John Lamar (A6), son of Philip II (A5), moved to Denison, Texas, and had sons (1) James E. (A7); (2) Charles L. (A7); (3) Henry G. (A7); (4) Arthur (A7) of whom no descendants are known to the writer.
- (c) William H. Lamar (A6), son of Philip Lamar II (A5), had one son (1) Alexander B. Lamar (A7) of whom no descendants are known.
- (d) James S. Lamar (A6), son of Philip Lamar II (A5), became a minister of the Christian denomination. He was born May 2, 1829, and died in 1905. In 1856, he married Mary Rucker and to them were born (1) Joseph Rucker Lamar (A7); (2) Philip F. (A7); and (3) Mary.
- (1) Joseph Rucker Lamar (A7), son of Rev. James S. Lamar (A6), was born in Ruckersville, Georgia, in 1857. After a distinguished career in Georgia, he was appointed Justice of the Supreme Court of the United States by President Taft in 1910. On January 30th, 1879, he married Clarinda H. Pendleton of Bethany, W. Va. To them were born (a) Philip Rucker Lamar (A8), (b) William Pendleton Lamar (A8), and a daughter (c) Mary. Justice Lamar died in 1916 survived by his widow and both sons. His widow is President of the Society of Colonial Dames.

- (2) Philip F. Lamar (A7), son of Reverend James S. Lamar (A6), left no children so far as known.
- (3) Mary, daughter of Reverend James S. Lamar (A6), left no descendants so far as is known.
- (e) Philip F. Lamar III (A6), son of Philip Lamar II (A5), had sons (1) Philip IV (A7), (2) Henry (A7), (3) John (A7), (4) Albert J. (A7), and (5) Miller Q. (A7), of whom no descendants are known.
- (3) George Lamar (A5), son of Philip Lamar (A4), had sons (a) Austin (A6); (b) Philip (A6); (c) John (A6); (d) George, Jr. (A6); (e) Thomas J. (A6); (f) James A. (A6); (g) Mirabeau (A6); (h) Bolivar (A6) of which sons no descendants are known.

III. Samuel Lamar—No known issue.

As we have previously observed, Thomas Lamar II (A2) had among his sons Thomas III (A3) who is known as Dr. Thomas Lamar. In 1777, this Dr. Thomas Lamar III (A3) left a will dividing his estate between a son (A) Thomas IV (A4) and five daughters—(B) Ruth; (C) Eleanor (D) Jemima; (E) Ann and (F) Elizabeth. In the First Federal Census of the 96th District of Edgefield County, South Carolina, the son, Thomas Lamar IV (A4) appears and besides himself, reports three males under 16 years of age, three females and eight slaves, and also in the same district, his sister Jemima Lamar reported her household to consist of no males, three females and eight slaves. Evidently two of the younger sisters lived with Jemima Lamar.

(A) Thomas Lamar IV (A4) as above shown had three sons who in 1790 were under 16 years of age. The name of only one of these sons is known. This son was (1) Mack who was born in 1780, and it is known that (2) Elizabeth, one of the sisters of Mack Lamar married a Mr. Whatley, but her descendants, if any, are not known.

(1) Mack Lamar (A5) married Rebecca, whose surname is not known. They became the parents of certainly two, and possibly three sons and at least one daughter. Their oldest son was born in 1817 and was named (a) Barney Lamar (A6). They also had a son (b) Thomas Lamar (A6), born in 1825, and a daughter (c) Lucia R., born in 1836. These sons were shown in the 1850 Census of Edgefield County, South Carolina. One of the writers upon the subject states that Mack Lamar (A5) was also the father of a son, John H. (A6), but if so, this fact is not disclosed by the Census of Edgefield County.

- (a) Barney Lamar (A6) also married a Rebecca, whose surname is unknown. The 1850 Census of Edgefield County, South Carolina, shows them reporting their family to consist of (1) Augusta, age 10; (2) Florida, age 8; (3) Elizabeth, age 6; (4) Bolivar (A7), age 4; (5) McDuffie (A7), age 2; and (6) Thomas (A7), 8 months. In Mayes' Genealogical Notes, it is stated that Barney Lamar also had sons (7) George Marion Baulaven (A7); and (8) Mirabeau (A7), but if so, they were born after the 1850 Census was taken. Correspondence with this branch of the family reveals that George Marion Baulaven Lamar (A7) was in fact a son of Barney Lamar (A6); but the writer has failed to locate any of the descendants of Mirabeau Lamar (A7), if in fact he was a son of Barney Lamar (A6).

- (7) George Marion Baulaven Lamar (A7) was the father of three children—(a) Gary McKinney Lamar (A8); (b) Katie Lamar; and (c) Quessel Lamar (A8).

- (a) Gary McKinney Lamar (A8) was born about 1874 at Aiken, South Carolina, and now lives at Spray, North Carolina. He married and became the father of (1) L. Q. C. Lamar (A9); (2) James B. (A9); (3) Nell M.; (4) George D. (A9); (5) Joseph D. (A9); (6) Ernest M. (A9); (7) Russell M. (A9); (8) Robert S. (A9); (9) Gary Lily; and (10) Caroline Hope Lamar.

- (2) James B. Lamar (A9) is the father of (a) Gary Ann; (b) Barbara Hayden and (c) James Lamar Jr. (A10).

- (3) Nell M. Lamar is a trained nurse and now lives at Greens-

boro, North Carolina. She is not married.

(b) Katie Lamar, the second child of George Marion Baulaven Lamar (A7), married Mr. Fabian, whose Christian name is not known.

(c) Quessel Lamar (A8) is not known to have had any descendants.

(B) Ruth Lamar is not known to have left any descendants.

(C) Eleanor Lamar left no descendants so far as is known.

(D) Jemima Lamar is shown in the 1850 Census to have been a resident of the 96th District of Edgefield County, South Carolina. Evidently two of her younger sisters lived with her. She was not married at that time and is not known to have left any descendants.

(F) Elizabeth Lamar—no known descendants.

As we have previously stated, John Lamar became the father of sons (A) Zachariah (A4); (B) John II (A4); (C) Thomas (A4); (D) Basil (A4); and (E) Jeremiah (A4). Inasmuch as this branch of the family has become so extensive, it will be advisable to divide the descendants of John Lamar (A3) into parts in this chapter according to the descendants from each of the sons above named.

PART (A)—Zachariah Lamar (A4), son of John Lamar (A3), appears never to have married and to have left no issue. He served at Lt. Colonel in the Georgia Militia during the Revolution and lived for many years

thereafter, part of the time with his brother, John Lamar II (A4), and his nephew, John Lamar III (A5).

PART (B)—John Lamar II (A4), another son of John Lamar (A3), became the father of a large and important branch of the family. This John Lamar II (A4), was born about 1740. In 1766 his petition was before the Government of Georgia setting forth that he had been in the province about a year and praying for a grant of 100 acres in St. Paul's Parish about two miles below Augusta, and adjoining the land of his father (Colonial Records of Georgia, Vol. IX, Page 533). He married three times. The name of his first wife is not known. The second wife was Sarah Bugg of a wealthy family, daughter of Edmond Bugg, a member of the Georgia Provincial Congress which met at Savannah, Georgia, in 1775. The third wife was Lucy Appling.

John Lamar II (A4) served as a Captain in the Third Regiment of Georgia Militia, during the Revolution—this being the same regiment in which his brother Zachariah (A4) was a Lt. Colonel.

John Lamar II (A4) became the father (by which wife is not known) of (1) John III (A5); (2) Zachariah (A5); (3) Basil (A5); (4) Harmong (A5). One writer upon the subject states that the will of his third wife, Lucy Appling Lamar, shows he also had a son named Jackson (A5), but this statement is not concurred in by any other writer, and if such is the fact, the descendants of Jackson (A5), if any, are not known.

- (1) John Lamar III (A5), the eldest son of John Lamar, II (A4), is supposed to have been issue of the first wife. He was born in Georgia in 1769 and died in Putnam County, Georgia, in 1833. He married his cousin Rebecca Lamar, daughter of Thomas Lamar (A4). He established his home on Little River near Eatonton, Georgia, and thereby became known as "Little River John" to distinguish him from the others of the same name. His uncle, Lt. Col. Zachariah Lamar (A4), spent some of his declining years

in the family of "Little River John" and being a student of history and literature, the old uncle claimed the privilege of naming the children of John III (A5) and Rebecca as they arrived. Thus, we find the children of John III (A5) and Rebecca Lamar bearing the following names: (a) Jefferson Jackson (A6); (b) Mirabeau Buonaparte (A6); (c) Thomas Randolph (A6); (d) Lucius Quintus Cincinnatus (A6); (e) Louisa; (f) Aurelia ; (g) Mary Ann; (h) Loretto, and one writer adds (i) Evalina.

(a) Jefferson Jackson Lamar (A6) also married a cousin, Rebecca Lamar, and became the father of (1) Lucius Mirabeau (A7); (2) Rebecca Evalina.

(1) Lucius Mirabeau (A7), son of Jefferson Jackson Lamar (A6), had children (a) Jefferson Jackson (A8); (b) John Rawls (A8); (c) Lavoisier L. (A8); (d) Carolina Matilda Rawls; (e) Mary Lee; (e) Lucius Mirabeau, Jr. (A8); (g) Charles Wilbur (A8).

(a) Jefferson Jackson Lamar (A8) was born November 15th, 1853. He left no descendants.

(b) John Rawls Lamar (A8), born April 5th, 1855, was never married.

(c) Lavoisier L. Lamar (A8) was born November 26th, 1856. He now lives at 821 Howard Street, San Antonio, Texas. He became the father of (1) Isabel; (2) Carlos (A9).

(1) Isabel Lamar married W. W. Deane and they now live in San Antonio, Texas. Their four children are (a) W. W. Deane, Jr.; (b) Lamar Deane; (c) Francis Deane; (d) Lanier Deane.

(2) Carlos Lamar (A9) married and now lives in Tampico, Mexico. They have four children whose names are not known to the writer.

- (d) Caroline Matilda Rawls Lamar, born September 17th, 1858, died at the age of six years.
- (e) Mary Lee Lamar was born January 2nd, 1865. She married John Lewis and they now live in Miami, Florida. Their six children are—
 - (1) Pearl Lewis, who never married
 - (2) Caroline Lewis, never married
 - (3) Mary Frances Lewis, who died at the age of three years.
 - (4) Lamar Lewis, who married Dr. Julian Gammon of Jacksonville, Florida, and had two children—
 - (a) Julian Gammon, Jr.
 - (b) Jeane Gammon
 - (5) Helen Lewis, who married Emmett McKenzie. They now live in Macon, Georgia, and have two children—
 - (a) Emmett McKenzie, Jr.
 - (b) Mary Lamar McKenzie
 - (6) John P. Lewis, Jr., who now lives in Miami, Florida, but who never married.
- (f) Lucius Mirabeau Lamar, Jr. (A8) was born November 19th, 1866. He married and has six children—
 - (1) Virginia Lamar, who married Louis Horner. They now live in San Antonio, Texas. Their two children are—
 - (a) Louis Horner, Jr.
 - (b) Virginia Horner
 - (2) Lucius Mirabeau Lamar III (A9) married and lives in Dallas, Texas. They have two children whose names are not known to the writer.
 - (3) Georgia Lamar, died at the age of 16 years.

- (4) Lavoisier Lamar (A9), who now lives in San Antonio, Texas.
- (5) Hopson Lamar (A9), who now lives in San Antonio, Texas.
- (6) Frances Lamar, who married and lives in Houston, Texas, but her married name is not known.
- (g) Charles Wilbur Lamar (A8), born December 13th, 1869. He married Caroline Law Varnedoe on November 10th, 1892, and they now live at 284 West Gonzalez Street, Pensacola, Florida. Their five children are—
 - (1) Mary Frances Lamar, who was born November 28th, 1893, but who died at the age of twelve years.
 - (2) Lamartine Varnedoe Lamar (A9), born March 28th, 1896. On June 6, 1931, he married Stephanie Marie Levert and they live at 801 Iona St., Metairie, New Orleans, La., and have one son—
 - (a) Albert Levert Lamar (A10), born March 28th, 1932.
 - (3) Anna Ashley Lamar, born September 11, 1900. On May 8th, 1924, she married Wendell Gray Switzer, now Lieut. Commander, U. S. N. They live in Pensacola, Florida, and have three children—
 - (a) John Lamar Switzer, born March 23, 1925,
 - (b) Wendell Gray Switzer, born April 11th, 1930,
 - (c) Ann Lamar Switzer, born October 24th, 1932.
 - (4) Charles Wilbur Lamar, Jr. (A9), born December 11, 1902. Now lives at Baton Rouge, La., but is not married.

- (5) Mary Lee Lamar, born November 5th, 1906. On April 18th, 1928, she married William Dodge Sample, now Commander, U. S. N. They live in Pensacola, Florida, and have one daughter—
 - (a) Carolyn Lamar Sample, born November 22nd, 1929.
- (4) Rebecca Evalina Lamar, daughter of Jefferson Jackson Lamar (A6), married Mr. William Polk and became the mother of Alice, William and Eloise.
- (b) Mirabeau Buonaparte Lamar (A6) was born in Louisville, Georgia, August 16th, 1798—the son of John Lamar III (A5) and his wife, Rebecca Lamar. Mirabeau Buonaparte (A6) became a man of much genius and great talent. In 1828 he established the *Columbus Inquirer*, a states-rights newspaper. In 1835 he moved to Texas just prior to the struggle which was to establish the independence of Texas from Mexico. In that struggle he took an active part, serving in the battle of San Jacinto as a Major General. He succeeded Sam Houston as the second President of the Republic of Texas and was the founder of the system of public education which has since become such an important part of the training of the youth of Texas. When Texas became a state of the Union, Mirabeau Buonaparte Lamar served in the American Army in its war against Mexico. He later became U. S. Minister to Argentina and in 1858 was made U. S. Minister to Costa Rica, and Nicaragua. He died December 19, 1859, leaving only one descendant—a daughter Loretta (who married Samuel D. Calder, and became the mother of Henrietta, Lamar, Robert James, Carrie Budd, Lola, Elizabeth and Douglas Calder and two additional daughters who died in infancy), Henrietta married Rev. E. H. J. Andrews and lives at League City, Texas.

Robert James Calder, born June 22, 1878, died June 28, 1941, leaving surviving him Robert James Calder, Jr., William Calder, and Kate Calder Meyer. Carrie Budd Calder married Calvin C. Blake and lives at Houston, Texas. Lola Calder married Robert Gordon and is now deceased. Elizabeth Calder did not marry and lives at Houston, Texas. Lamar and Douglas Calder died in childhood.

- (c) Another son of John Lamar III (A5) was Thomas Randolph Lamar (A6). He became a physician and married Louisa Hill by whom he had one child—
 - (1) Lavoisier Lamar (A7) married and became the father of three children—
 - (a) Henry R. Lamar (A8)—no descendants known to the writer.
 - (b) Thomas R. Lamar (A8) became the father of five children—
 - (1) Clara Lamar
 - (2) Susan Lamar
 - (3) Louisa Lamar
 - (4) Lavoisier Lamar (A9)
 - (5) Lawson Lamar (A9)
 - (c) Lula Lamar, daughter of Lavoisier Lamar (A7), married Mr. Strother and became the mother of Nell Strother.
- (d) Lucius Quintus Cincinnatus Lamar (A6), son of John Lamar III (A5), was born in Warren County, Georgia, but grew to manhood in Putnam County, Georgia. He studied law at Milledgeville and was admitted to the bar in 1818. In 1819 he married Sarah Bird, daughter of a prominent physician. He soon became recognized as an able and outstanding attorney. In 1830, he was elevated to the bench as the youngest judge in the State of Georgia, and was soon recognized as one of the ablest judges of that early period. Besides his legal attainments, he possessed unusual literary culture. He became the father of eight children,

as follows—(1) Lucius Quintus Cincinnatus, Jr. (A7); (2) Mary Ann; (3) Thompson Bird (A7); (4) Jefferson Mirabeau (A7); (5) Susan Rebecca; (6) Mary Elizabeth; (7) Sarah; and (8) Louisa. The last three named children died in infancy.

(1) Lucius Quintus Cincinnatus Lamar, Jr. (A7), the son of Lucius Quintus Cincinnatus Lamar (A6), was born September 17, 1825, in Putnam County, Georgia. He was educated at Emory College where he met, wooed and won Virginia Longstreet, daughter of Judge A. B. Longstreet, President of Emory College. The young couple soon moved to Oxford, Mississippi, where Lucius Quintus Cincinnatus, Jr., soon became interested in politics. In 1857 he was elected to Congress where he remained until the outbreak of the war between the states, when he resigned his seat to accept a commission as Lieutenant-Colonel of a Mississippi regiment of the Confederate Army. In November 1862, he was appointed Special Commissioner of the Confederate States to the Empire of Russia. Upon the termination of the conflict, he returned to Mississippi where he became professor of law in the University of Mississippi. In 1873 he was again elected to Congress where he devoted his special talents to conciliation. In 1878 he was elected United States Senator in which capacity he served with distinction until 1885 when he became Secretary of the Interior in the cabinet of President Grover Cleveland. He served in this capacity until his appointment in 1888 as Justice of Supreme Court of the United States in which office he remained until his death in 1893. His four children were—

(a) Lucius Quintus Cincinnatus Lamar III (A8), born in Mississippi in 1854. He

married Kate Lester and upon her death he married Atala Nicholson. He became an official of the United States Land Office and died in Washington, D. C., April 9, 1936. His descendants were—

- (b) Virginia Longstreet Lamar, daughter of Lucius Quintus Cincinnatus Lamar, Jr. (A7), married a cousin, William Harmoning Lamar, and will be referred to later.
- (c) Sarah Lemar, daughter of Lucius Quintus Cincinnatus Lamar, Jr. (A7), married F. Hugh Heiskell of Memphis, Tennessee, and became the mother of Joseph H.; Lamar; Virginia; Longstreet; Hugh; and Mary.
- (d) Frances Elizabeth Lamar, daughter of Lucius Quintus Cincinnatus Lamar, Jr. (A7), was born July 20, 1848. She married Edward Mayes, Chancellor of University of Mississippi, and became the mother of Frank; Lucius L.; Bessie; Mary; Edward W.; and Basil Robert Mayes.
- (2) Mary Ann Lamar, daughter of Lucius Quintus Cincinnatus Lamar, Sr. (A6), was twice married. Her first husband was James Carter Longstreet by whom she became the mother of Sarah; William and James C. Longstreet, Jr. Upon the death of her first husband, she married John B. Ross and became the mother

of John B., Jr.; T. Lamar; and Donald G. Ross.

- (3) Thompson Bird Lamar (A7), son of Lucius Quintus Cincinnatus Lamar, Sr. (A6), was born January 27, 1828. He became Colonel of the Fifth Florida Regiment of the Confederate Army and fell mortally wounded near Petersburg in April, 1864. He left surviving him (a) Clyde (A8), (b) Jefferson (A8); (c) William B. (A8); (d) Elizabeth and (e) Sarah. It is reported by one writer upon the subject, who is the husband of a cousin, that there was another daughter named (f) Mary.

(a) Clyde Lamar (A8), son of Thompson Bird Lamar (A7), became the father of George Walker Lamar (A9).

(b) No issue of Jefferson Lamar (A8) is known to the writer.

(c) William B. Lamar (A8) became Attorney General of Florida and later was elected to Congress from that state. No issue is known to the writer.

(d) Elizabeth Lamar, daughter of Thompson Bird Lamar (A7), married George P. Raney, Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Florida, and became the mother of T. Lamar; Clyde; Sarah; and George Raney.

(e) Sarah Lamar, married Josiah Lewis, Jr., and they became the parents of three children as follows: Sarah L., Thompson Lamar, and Miles Walker Lewis. Of these children Miles Walker Lewis is now Judge of the Circuit Court and lives at Jacksonville, Florida.

- (4) Jefferson Mirabeau Lamar (A7), son of Lucius Quintus Cincinnatus Lamar, Sr. (A6), was born January 3, 1835. On July 23, 1861, he married his cousin, Mary Ann Lamar. He

became a Colonel in the Confederate Army and was killed at Crampton's Gap September 15, 1862. He left no known issue.

- (5) Susan Rebecca, daughter of Lucius Quintus Cincinnatus Lamar, Sr. (A6), married Mr. Lemuel G. R. Wiggins. No descendants are known.
- (e) Louisa Lamar, daughter of John Lamar III (A5) and Rebecca Lamar, married Mr. McGehee and became the mother of Thomas Jefferson; Lucius; Keenan; Lovern; and Lorretto McGehee.
- (f) Aurelia Lamar, daughter of John Lamar III (A5) and Rebecca Lamar, married Mr. Randle and became the mother of Xenophon; Lackington; and John M. Randle.
- (g) Mary Ann Lamar, daughter of John Lamar III (A5) and Rebecca Lamar, married Mr. Moreland and became the mother of Joseph; Lucius; Thompson; Caldwell; Rebecca; Ella; Turner; Aurelia and Loretto Moreland.
- (h) Loretto Lamar, daughter of John Lamar III (A5) and Rebecca Lamar, married A. H. Chappell and became the mother of Lucius M.; Thomas J.; J. Harris; Lamar and Rebecca Chappell.
- (i) Evalina Lamar, married Mr. Harvey. She is not known to have had any descendants.
- (2) Zachariah Lamar (A5), son of John Lamar II (A4), is believed by most authorities on the subject to have left no issue.
- (3) Basil Lamar (A5), son of John Lamar II (A4), lived in Richmond County, Georgia, married a Miss Kelly and had children as follows—(a) Priscilla; (b) John Thomas (A6); (c) Gazaway Bugg (A6); (d) James Jackson (A6); (e) George W. (A6); (f) Oswald Edward (A6); (g) Sarah; (h) Basil, Jr. (A6); (i) Zachariah (A6); (j) Rebecca; (k) Thomas (A6); (l) a daughter whose given name is not known but who married a Mr. Sims and had a son, William Sims.
 - (a) Priscilla Lamar died in infancy.

- (b) John Thomas Lamar (A6), born March 19, 1797, died in Savannah, Georgia, in 1842, married Louisa Wray and had daughters, Emma and Eliza, both of whom died young—the latter being lost in the wreck of the Pulaski.
- (c) Gazaway Bugg Lamar (A6) was born October 2, 1798. He became a prominent and wealthy banker of Georgia and New York and was the father of several children. Writers upon the subject seem in disagreement as to the names and number of his children. Mayes' Genealogical Notes credits him with the following children: Martha; Charles A. L. (A7); William S. (A7); Rebecca; Thomas (A7); Lucius (A7); Caroline; Anthony C (A7); Annie; G. de Rossett (A7); Charlotte and Harriett. The research of Rev. Charles R. Lemar credits him with three children, namely, Charles A. L. (A7), Derisette and Cazineau. It would seem certain that he did have a son (1) Charles A. L. (A7); daughters (2) Harriett and (3) Annie and (4) Charlotte; and probably sons (5) Anthony C. (A7); and (6) G. de Rossett or Derisette (A7).
 - (1) Charles A. L. Lamar (A7) became a Colonel in the Confederate Army and was killed in battle near Columbus, Georgia, a few days after the surrender of General Lee. He left five daughters—(a) Jane, (b) Eliza, (c) Carol, (d) Georgia and (e) Mary.
 - (2) The daughter, Harriett Lamar, married Mr. Jones and had two children—Paulina and Frank.
 - (3) Annie Lamar married Mr. Minor and had two children—Harriett and Benjamin.
 - (4) Charlotte Lamar married first a Mr. Sentter, by whom she had two sons and a daughter—James T., Robert and Paulina. She later married the Duke D'Aury of Paris by whom she is reported to have had a daughter.

- (5) Anthony C. Lamar (A7), if in fact a son of Gazaway Bugg Lamar (A6), left no known heirs and may have died in infancy.
- (6) G. de Rossett (or Derisette) Lamar (A7) is said to have had three children—Henry C. (A8), Paul C. (A8) and a daughter Maria. No descendants of these children are known.
- (d) James Jackson Lamar (A6) died without issue.
- (e) George W. Lamar (A6) was born January 27, 1802. He had a large family consisting of (1) John Lamar (A7); (2) Rebecca; (3) Matthew L. (A7); (4) Mary; (5) Southworth H. (A7); (6) Gazaway B. (A7); (7) George W., Jr. (A7); (8) Frank (A7); (9) James (A7); (10) Albert Reese (A7); (11) William T. (A7); and (12) Florida.
 - (1) John Lamar (A7) left two children (a) John West Lamar (A8) of whom no issue is known, and (b) Mary, who became Mrs. Reynolds.
 - (2) Rebecca Lamar married Antoine Poullain and became the mother of Rebecca, Lamar, Sally and Florida Poullain.
 - (3) Matthew L. Lamar (A7) left no known issue.
 - (4) Mary Lamar left no known issue.
 - (5) Southworth H. Lamar (A7) left one son, (a) George M. Lamar (A8), of whom no issue is known.
 - (6) Gazaway B. Lamar (A7) married a cousin, Micon Rees, and had three children as follows: (a) Gazaway B., Jr. (A8) of whom no issue is known; (b) Howell (A8), no known issue; and (c) Wylley (A8), no known issue.
 - (7) George W. Lamar, Jr. (A7) had seven children of whom no issue is known to the writer.

These children are as follows—(a) Sally; (b) John W. (A8); (c) Carol Lucius (A8); (d) Pennie; (e) Robert L. (A8); (f) Nellie; (g) George W. III (A8).
 - (8) Frank Lamar (A7) left no known issue.

- (9) James Lamar (A7) also left no known issue.
- (10) Albert Reese Lamar (A7) married Kate Hill and became the father of (a) Eliza; (b) Charles Albert (A8); (c) Tracy (A8); and (d) Nana.
 - (a) Eliza, daughter of Albert Reese Lamar (A7), married Mr. Hull and became the mother of Kate, Marmaduke, Albert, Dan G., Eliza and Joseph.
 - (b) Charles Albert Lamar (A8) married his cousin, Kate Hill, daughter of a brother of his mother, and they became the parents of (1) Florine; (2) Alexander Melrose (A9); (3) Albert Reese (A9); (4) James Hill (A9); (5) Eliza Talbot; and (6) Joseph Hill Lamar (A9). These children are all without issue, except:
 - (2) Alexander Melrose Lamar (A9), born December 10, 1887. On October 3, 1909, he married Nellie Gordon and they now live at Fort Valley, Georgia, where he is an attorney. They are the parents of two children, as follows: (1) Kate Hill and (2) Nellie Lamar.
 - (c) Tracy Lamar (A8) left no issue known to the writer.
 - (d) Nana Lamar married a Mr. Walker. Their children, if any, are not known.
- (11) William T. Lamar (A7), son of George W. Lamar (A6), left no known issue.
- (12) Florida Lamar married a Mr. Anderson and became the mother of Clarence Anderson.
- (f) Oswald Edward Lamar (A6) died in infancy.
- (g) Sarah Lamar married Dr. Rees and they had the following children—(1) Albert; (2) Mary Ann; (3) Raymond; (4) Gazaway; (5) Larmartine, and (6) Micon—the last named of which daughters married her cousin, Gazaway B. Lamar (A7).

(h) Basil Lamar, Jr. (A6) became the father of (1) Gazaway (A7); (2) Martha; (3) Belle; (4) John (A7).

(1) Gazaway Lamar (A7), son of Basil Lamar, Jr. (A6), left no descendants known to the writer.

(2) Martha Lamar—no descendants known.

(3) Belle Lamar married a man named Stockbridge and had a son, Basil.

(4) John Lamar (A7) had no issue known to the writer.

(i) Zachariah Lamar (A6) is reported to have had children as follows—(1) Ellen; (2) Rebecca; (3) Mary; (4) John (A7); (5) Zachariah, Jr. (A7); (6) Gazaway (A7).

No record is available of the descendants, if any, of the above named children of Zachariah Lamar (A6).

(j) Rebecca Lamar married a Mr. Johnson and became the heroine of the Pulaski disaster. She later married General Hugh McLeod in 1842 and became the mother of Casneau McLeod.

(k) Thomas Lamar (A6) is reported to have died when 15 years of age.

(l) The daughter, whose given name is not known, married Mr. Sims and had a son named William W. Sims.

(4) Harmong Lamar (A5) was the fourth son of John Lamar II (A4). He lived in Columbia, in Newton County, Georgia, and later in Barbour County, Alabama, where he died. He was a wealthy and prominent planter, was generally known as Colonel Harmong Lamar. He married Martha Ann Young of Baltimore, Maryland, and Augusta, Georgia. They were the parents of (a) William Harmong (A6); (b) John Oswald (A6); (c) Lucius M. (A6); (d) Sally; and (e) Cornelia; (f) Lucy; (g) Martha; (h) Thomas Charles (A6).

(a) William Harmong Lamar (A6) was born in 1827. He became a physician and practiced his art in

Jasper, Alabama, where he died in 1906. He married Ann M. Glenn on January 7th, 1847. She was the daughter of Rev. John Bowles Glenn. They were the parents of (1) Theodore J. (A7); (2) Charles R. (A7); (3) Glennie C.; (4) William Harmong, Jr. (A7); (5) Howard (A7); (6) Annie; and (7) George Holt (A7).

- (1) Theodore J. Lamar (A7), the eldest son, married Orlena Cleveland and became the father of (a) Theodore J., Jr. (A8); (b) Charles (A8); (c) Orlena; (d) Carrie; and (e) William Harmong Lamar (A8).
- (2) Charles R. Lamar (A7) became a minister of the gospel. He married Laura Cain. They had children, the number and names of whom are not known to the writer, but from certain correspondence of the father, it is known that he has a daughter.
- (3) Glennie C. Lamar married Mr. T. S. Phillips.
- (4) William Harmong Lamar, Jr. (A7) was born in 1859. He married Virginia Longstreet Lamar, daughter of Justice L. Q. C. Lamar (A7) of the Supreme Court of the United States. He became an attorney in the Department of Justice at Washington, served as a Captain in the war with Spain, was an Assistant Attorney General during the Wilson administration. He made his home at Rockville, Maryland, on or near some of the ancestral lands of Thomas Lamar II (A2), son of the emigrant. They were the parents of (a) Virginia Longstreet Lamar; (b) Lucius Q. C. Lamar (A8); (c) Augusta Glen Lamar; and (d) William H. Lamar III (A8).
- (5) Howard Lamar (A7) married Alma Hayes and lived in Jasper, Alabama. His descendants are not known to the writer.
- (6) Annie Lamar left no issue.
- (7) George Holt Lamar (A7) married Edith Stonestreet. He lives now on a portion of

the ancestral lands at Rockville, Maryland, and practices law in Washington, D. C. He was formerly a law partner of his brother, William Harmong Lamar, Jr., until the death of the latter.

(b) John Oswald Lamar (A6) was three times married, his first wife being Sarah Andrews, daughter of Bishop Andrews, and his second wife a Miss Davis, and his third wife Mary Ann Perry. His children were—

(2) Emma Jones Lamar, who married a Mr. Cole and became the mother of three children—

He was killed at Crampton's Gap on September 16, 1862. He left no issue.

preme Court of Georgia), Mary Ann (who married Judge Alexander S. Erwin), and Sarah M. Cobb (who married Tinsley W. Rucker).

- (d) Louisa Catherine Jane, died at the age of 1 year.
 - (e) Horace Carnot (A6), died at the age of 18 years.
 - (f) Thomas Robinson (A6), died at the age of 3 years.
 - (g) Zachariah, Jr. (A6), died at the age of 5 years.
 - (h) William (A6), who died at the age of 26 days.
 - (i) Walter (A6), who died at the age of 1 year.
 - (j) A second Zachariah, Jr. (A6), who died at the age of 6 years.
- (2) Mary Lamar, daughter of Thomas Lamar (A4), married a Mr. Jeter.
 - (3) Rebecca Lamar, daughter of Thomas Lamar (A4), married John Lamar III. (See John Lamar III (A5), page 102.)

- (j) Emily Lamar married a Mr. Moore and became the mother of Andrew, Sarah, John, Samuel and Edward Moore.
- (2) Pennington Lamar (A5), second son of Basil Lamar (A4), died without issue.
- (3) Peter Lamar (A5), another son of Basil Lamar (A4), married Sarah Cobb Benning and became the father of (a) Ezekiel (A6); (b) Jacob (A6); (c) Basil (A6); (d) Lafayette (A6); (e) Mary (who married Mr. Daniel); (f) Antonia (who married Mr. Moore); (g) Jane (who married Mr. Gross); (h) Sarah (who married Mr. Fleming); (i) Bertha (who married Mr. Howell); (j) Virginia (who married Mr. Young); (k) Savannah.

We have related in previous chapters that Thomas Lamar (A1), the original settler in Maryland, was the father of two sons, (1) Thomas Lamar (A2) and (2) John Lamar (B2). In the various chapters of Part III we have traced the known descendants of Thomas Lamar II (A2) and are now about to follow the descendants of John Lamar (B2).

In the chapters of Part II we have traced the descendants of the above John Lamar (B2) throughout the first four generations, but in order to clarify the following paragraphs we will briefly recount the descendants of the four generations mentioned.

John Lamar (B2) on January 21st, 1714, married Susannah Tyler of Prince George County, Maryland. They became the parents of I. John Lamar II (B3); II. Thomas Lamar (B3); III. Robert Lamar (B3); IV. Mareen Lamar (B3); V. Richard Lamar (B3); VI. Susannah Lamar; VII. Ann Lamar; VIII. Rachel Lamar; IX. Priscilla Lamar; X. Mary Lamar; and XI. Elizabeth Lamar.

Of the sons above mentioned, II. Thomas Lamar (B3) is known to have no descendants; V. Richard Lamar (B3) is believed to have had no descendants; and, no descendants of IV. Mareen Lamar (B3) are known of the male line.

Therefore, we have descendants of only I. John Lamar II (B3) and III. Robert Lamar (B3) to follow:

- I. John Lamar II (B3) married Sarah Marshall and died in 1756 some two years before the death of his

father. This John Lamar II (B3) left surviving him the following named children: (A) William Bishop Lamar (B4); (B) Jacob Lamar (B4); (C) John Lamar III (B4); (D) Maxamillian Lamar (B4); (E) Rebecca Lamar; and, (F) Susanna Lamar. It is claimed by some writers that he also had sons, (G) Mareen Lamar (B4) and (H) Abraham Lamar (B4). This would appear to be in error unless they were born posthumously, as they are not mentioned in the will of John Lamar II (B3) as are the other children.

(A) Colonel William Bishop Lamar (B4), eldest son of John Lamar II (B3), married Elizabeth Smith and became the father of a large family as follows: (1) Mary Ann Lamar; (2) Henrietta Lamar; (3) Sarah Lamar; (4) John Lamar (B5); (5) Archibald Lamar (B5); (6) Anne Lamar; (7) Thomas Lamar (B5); (8) Susannah Lamar; (9) Ruth Lamar; (10) William Lamar (B5); (11) Benjamin Lamar (B5); (12) Rachel Lamar; (13) Mareen Tyler Lamar (B5); and (14) Richard Lamar (B5). The will of Colonel William Bishop Lamar (B4) which was made on August 29th, 1812 in Hawkins County, Tennessee, mentions all of the above named children except (4) John Lamar (B5); (5) Archibald Lamar (B5); and, (6) Anne Lamar. Failure to mention these children in the will may have been occasioned by their death prior to the death of Colonel William Bishop Lamar (B4). The descendants of the various children are as follows:

- (1) Mary Ann Lamar. It is not known whom she married and no descendants are known.
- (2) Henrietta Lamar married Eli Marshall in 1791. Their descendants, if any, are not known.
- (3) Sarah Lamar left no known descendants.
- (4) John Lamar (B5) appears to have been the eldest son and was born in 1772. He is not known to have had any issue and was presumably dead before 1812.

- (5) Archibald Lamar (B5) was born in 1774. He married Susan Brown but they are not known to have had any children.
- (6) Anne Lamar. It is not known whom she married and no descendants are known.
- (7) Thomas Lamar (B5) was born in 1777 and died in 1864. He married Mary Willard. His will, dated June 24th, 1864, in Frederick County, Maryland, mentions the following children: (a) Ellen Lamar; (b) John Lamar (B6); (c) William Bishop Lamar II (B6); (d) Mary Ann Lamar; (e) Loretta Lamar; (f) Elizabeth Lamar; (g) Benoni Smith Lamar (B6); and (h) Rebecca Lamar.
 - (a) Ellen Lamar was not married at the time of the death of her father. No descendants are known.
 - (b) John Lamar (B6) was apparently the oldest son of Thomas Lamar (B5). He married Rebecca Johnson and they were the parents of (1) Elizabeth Lamar and (2) James W. Lamar (B7) of whom no descendants are known.
 - (c) William Bishop Lamar II (B6) married Elizabeth Harley in 1832. Their children were: (1) Eliza Lamar; (2) Thomas J. Lamar (B7); (3) Lewis Lamar (B7); (4) Mareen Lamar (B7); (5) Emma Lamar; (6) William H. Lamar (B7); (7) Robert Lamar (B7); (8) Asa F. Lamar (B7); (9) Ellen Lamar; and (10) Susan Lamar. No descendants of any of these children are known except—
 - (3) Lewis Lamar (B7), who was born in 1838, became a physician, married Susan Snyder and became the father of (a) Emma E. Lamar; (b) Angie V. Lamar; (c) Rhoda E. Lamar; (d) Austin A. Lamar (B8);

(e) Bruce Lamar (B8); and (f) Snyder Lamar (B8). Of these children of Lewis Lamar (B7) no descendants are known to the writer except—

(d) Austin A. Lamar (B8) was born in 1876 and, also, became a physician. He married Lena Newcomer and in his will made January 31st, 1928, mentions his children as (1) Austin F. Lamar (B9) and (2) Louise C. Lamar.

(d) Mary Ann Lamar married Dr. Tilghman Biser and became the mother of (1) Emily Biser; (2) William D. Biser; (3) Francis Biser; (4) Laurretta Biser; (5) Charles Biser; (6) Inez Biser; and (7) Clara Biser.

(e) Loretta Lamar married Andrew Kessler. Their descendants, if any, are not known.

(f) Elizabeth Lamar married a man named Spencer whose given name is not known to the writer. At the time of her death she left a son named (1) Albertus Spencer.

(g) Benoni Smith Lamar (B6) was born in 1819, married Mary C. Thomas and became the father of (1) Samuel C. Lamar (B7); (2) Marion T. Lamar (B7); (3) George A. Lamar (B7); (4) William B. Lamar (B7); (5) John C. Lamar (B7); (6) Annie Lamar; and (7) a daughter whose given name is not known, but who became Mrs. Edward Bready. Of the above named children no descendants are known except—

(5) John C. Lamar (B7) became the father of a son, (a) Clarence H. Lamar (B8).

- (h) Rebecca Lamar married William Johnson. She was dead in 1864 at the time of the demise of her father, Thomas Lamar (B5). She left children surviving her but their names are not known to the writer.
- (8) Susannah Lamar is not known to have left any descendants.
- (9) Ruth Lamar is not known to have left any descendants.
- (10) William Lamar (B5), son of Colonel William Bishop Lamar (B4) and brother of (4) John Lamar (B5); (5) Archibald Lamar (B5); (7) Thomas Lamar (B5); (11) Benjamin Lamar (B5); (13) Mareen Tyler Lamar (B5); and (14) Richard Lamar (B5), married Drucilla Thrasher on October 18th, 1803. They moved to Berkeley County, Virginia, where they lived in 1839. They were the parents of a son (a) Benjamin T. Lamar (B6) who was born May 14th, 1820. They may have had other children, but if so, the fact is not known to the writer.
 - (a) Benjamin T. Lamar (B6) appears to have been the father of (1) E. Holmes Lamar (B7) and (2) Charles M. Lamar (B7) who lived in Martinsburg, West Virginia.
- (11) Benjamin Lamar (B5), son of Colonel William Bishop Lamar (B4) and brother of (4) John Lamar (B5); (5) Archibald Lamar (B5); (7) Thomas Lamar (B5); (10) William Lamar (B5); (13) Mareen Tyler Lamar (B5); and (14) Richard Lamar (B5), sold his inherited land on April 12th, 1815, and moved to Hancock County, Kentucky. He apparently did not remain long in Kentucky for he appears in the 1820 census of Spencer County, Indiana, where he reported two males under ten years of age, three

males under 26 years of age, himself over 45 years of age, six females and three slaves. In the same county with him and presumably his descendants were (a) Elijah Lamar (B6); (b) Samuel Lamar (B6); and (c) Uriah Lamar (B6). These were presumably sons of Benjamin Lamar (B5) but their relationship cannot be certainly established. The names of the descendants of these children are not known except that (b) Samuel Lamar (B6) had a son named (1) Samuel Lamar, Jr. (B7). In this same county in 1820 census, a man named Young Lamar, appeared, who gave his age as over 45 years, so that he was about the same age as Benjamin Lamar (B5) himself, and was presumably a cousin of some degree.

- (12) Rachel Lamar. It is not known whether she ever married and no attempt has been made to follow her descendants.
- (13) Mareen Tyler Lamar (B5), a son of Colonel William Bishop Lamar (B4), was born about 1794 and on January 18th, 1815, married Rebecca Rice who was the daughter of Perry Rice. Under the will of his father he had inherited an extensive tract of land in Breckenridge County, Ky., and in 1815 he and his wife, together with his brother, (14) Benjamin Lamar (B5), moved to the new land in Kentucky. There Mareen Tyler Lamar (B5) and his wife became the parents of (a) William Lamar (B6); (b) James Lamar (B6); (c) Elizabeth Lamar; (d) Benoni Smith Lamar (B6); (e) Martha Lamar; (f) John Thomas Lamar (B6); (g) Sarah Ann Lamar; and (h) Robert Coston Lamar (B6).

(a) William Lamar (B6), it appears, became the father of (1) John Howard

Lamar (B7) of whom there are no known descendants.

(b) James Lamar (B6) left no known descendants.

(c) Elizabeth Lamar left no known descendants.

(d) Benoni Smith Lamar (B6) married Martha Wheatley. In 1878 they moved to Young County, Texas, and to them were born the following named children (1) Benoni Lamar (B7); (2) Benjamin Burkley Lamar (B7); (3) Rebecca Lamar; (4) Franklin Lamar (B7); (5) Robert Emery Lamar (B7); (6) George Lamar (B7); (7) Mary Lamar; (8) John Lamar (B7); (9) William Lamar (B7); and (10) Susan Lamar. No descendants of any of these children are known except—

(5) Robert Emery Lamar (B7), who was born in Hancock County, Kentucky, on June 9th, 1848. He moved to Young County, Texas, with his father's family in 1878. He married Mary Martha Stewart, daughter of Thomas Stewart of Hancock County, Kentucky. To them were born: (a) Edmund Newman Lamar (B8); (b) Martha Elizabeth Lamar; (c) Rebecca Henrietta Lamar; (d) Robert Bushrod Lamar (B8); (e) Nannie Sue Lamar; (f) Mamie Lamar; (g) William Martin Lamar (B8); and (h) Ella Gibbs Lamar. Of these children no descendants are known except—

(a) Edmund Newman Lamar (B8), was born on November 28th, 1872, in Hancock County, Kentucky. In 1901 he married Hal-

lie Fletcher. He served many terms as Clerk of Courts in Hancock County, Kentucky. He and his wife are the parents of (1) Thelma Louise Lamar; (2) Garland Lamar (B9); (3) Beulah Lamar (4) Hugh Oliver Lamar (B9); (5) Edna Lamar; (6) Carl Lamar (B9); and (7) Stewart Lamar (B9).

(e) Martha Lamar—no known descendants.

(f) John Thomas Lamar (B6)—no known descendants.

(g) Sarah Ann Lamar—no known descendants.

(h) Robert Coston Lamar (B6)—no known descendants.

(14) Richard Lamar (B5) was a son of Colonel William Bishop Lamar (B5) and brother of (4) John Lamar (B5); (5) Archibald Lamar (B5); (7) Thomas Lamar (B5); (10) William Lamar (B5); (11) Benjamin Lamar (B5); and (13) Mareen Tyler Lamar (B5). He married Polly Johnson and they became the parents of (a) Richard Johnson Lamar (B6).

(a) Richard Johnson Lamar (B6) appears to have been twice married. His first wife was Malinda Welsh whom he married on July 29th, 1839, and who died in 1843. He then married Caroline A. Kemp on December 21st, 1844. Apparently by the first wife he was the father of (1) Baker Lamar (B7). In the will of his second wife, Caroline Kemp Lamar, dated January 23rd, 1878, it reveals that by the second marriage he was the father of (2) William Lamar (B7); (3) Robert Lamar (B7); (4) Richard Lamar III (B7); and (5) Charles Lamar (B7),

all of Frederick County, Maryland. Little is known of the above named children except that (1) Baker Lamar (B7) on June 28th, 1864, married Cornelia E. Kemp, who was presumably a relative of his stepmother.

- (B) Jacob Lamar (B4) was the son of John Lamar II (B3) and the brother of (A) Colonel William Bishop Lamar (B4) whose descendants we have just followed. Jacob Lamar (B4) appears to have been born about 1746. He served in Captain Finney's company of the Sixth Pennsylvania Regiment during the American Revolution and died at Frederick County, Maryland, about 1824. He left no will but a suit filed June 21st, 1824, in Frederick County, Maryland, stated that he had the following children: (1) Mareen Lamar (B5); (2) Elizabeth Lamar; (3) Richard Lamar (B5); (4) John Lamar (B5); and (5) Gustavus Lamar (B5). The petition stated that the children all resided in Prince George County, Maryland. No descendants of the above named children are known.
- (C) John Lamar III (B4) appears to have been the third son of John Lamar II (B3) and the brother of (A) Colonel William Bishop Lamar (B4) and (B) Jacob Lamar (B4). He was born about 1750 and married the widow of Higginson Belt. They became the parents of one son (1) William Belt Lamar (B5) of whom no descendants are known.
- (D) Maxamillian Lamar (B4) was another son of John Lamar II (B3) and a brother of (A) Colonel William Bishop Lamar (B4); (B) Jacob Lamar (B4); and (C) John Lamar III (B4). In many instances during the life of Maxamillian Lamar (B4) he appears to have been called Mack Lamar. At the outbreak of the American Revolution he offered his serv-

ices to his country and rose to the rank of Brigadier General. He was killed while gallantly leading his troops at the Battle of Saratoga. The name of his wife is not known but they were the parents of two children as follows: (1) John Lamar (B5) and (2) Polly Lamar.

(E) Rebecca Lamar, a daughter of John Lamar II (B3), left no known descendants.

(F) Susanna Lamar, also a daughter of John Lamar II (B3), is not known to have left any descendants.

II. Thomas Lamar (B3) became a physician, married Mary Hill, and moved to the Madeira Islands. He later moved to London, England, where he died about 1796. He left no issue.

III. Robert Lamar (B3) was the son of John Lamar (B2) and the brother of (I) John Lamar II (B3) and (II) Thomas Lamar (B3). Robert Lamar (B3) lived to be a very old man and died in Allegany County, Maryland, in 1815. While apparently too old to serve in the American Revolution, he must have been a man whose sympathies were wholeheartedly with the American cause for his two sons are known to have participated very actively in the hostilities on the side of the American Colonies. His children were (A) Mareen Lamar (B4); (B) William Lamar (B4); (C) Priscilla Lamar; (D) Richard Lamar (B4); and (E) Elizabeth Lamar. (A) Mareen Lamar (B4) moved at an early age to Pennsylvania. He became Major of the Pennsylvania troops during the American Revolution, participating with General Anthony Wayne in the campaign against Canada. He returned with his troops to participate in the campaign incident to the British capture of Philadelphia. In the skirmish at Paoli, which is sometimes known as the Battle of White Horse, while gallantly leading his troops, he was killed. He left no descendants.

(B) William Lamar (B4) took a very active part in the American Revolution. He entered the war as an Ensign with the Continental troops from Maryland and rose to the rank of Captain during the war. He participated in all the campaigns both of the North and of the South. A more detailed record of his military service is told in a previous chapter. He married Margaret Worthington of Baltimore. They became the parents of (1) Sarah Lamar; (2) William Lynch Lamar (B5); (3) Louise Lamar; (4) Ann Lamar; (5) Richard Lamar (B5); and (6) Mary Lamar. The descendants of these children are as follows:

(1) Sarah Lamar did not marry. Her will, dated March 18th, 1839, gave her property to the children of her three sisters.

(2) William Lynch Lamar (B5) married Maria Briscoe and to them were born: (a) Hanson Lamar (B6); (b) William S. Lamar (B6); (c) Henrietta Lamar; (d) Marie Lamar; (e) Eliza Lamar; and (f) Mary J. Lamar. No descendants of these children are known to the writer, but—
(c) Henrietta Lamar married G. W.

Richardson.

(d) Marie Lamar married a Mr. Johnson.

(f) Mary J. Lamar married Nelson Clark Read.

(3) Louise Lamar married Colonel Frisby Tilghman who was a member of a very prominent Maryland family. She is known to have had a daughter (a) Louise Tilghman.

(4) Ann Lamar married George Tilghman, a relative of the husband of her sister, Louise Lamar. Their descendants are not known.

(5) Richard Lamar (B5) died without issue. His will, dated March 2nd, 1841, in Alle-

gany County, Maryland, willed his property to the children of his sisters.

- (6) Mary Lamar married Hon. Michael C. Sprigg and became the mother of two children: (a) I. C. Sprigg and (b) Mary Sprigg.
- (C) Priscilla Lamar married James Drane. They were the parents of a number of children as it is known that she had two sons and that she was the grandmother of Richard Drane, Thomas Drane, James Drane, Marian Drane, William Drane and Elizabeth Drane. Also, that she was the great-grandmother of James H. Drane, Maria Drane and William C. Drane.
- (D) Richard Lamar (B4) was the son of Robert Lamar (B3) and a brother of (A) Mareen Lamar (B4); (B) William Lamar (B4); and (C) Priscilla Lamar. He appears to have been born about 1750. He is not known to have been living in 1800 but the date of his death is not known. Apparently he was twice married for in 1790 he married Ann Drane who must have been his second wife. He had four children, all of whom appear to have been issue of the first marriage. These children are as follows: (1) Elizabeth Lamar; (2) James Lamar (B5); (3) Richard Lamar, Jr. (B5); and (4) Mareen T. Lamar (B5).
 - (1) Elizabeth Lamar, daughter of Richard Lamar (4), married Samuel Childs and appears to have left issue but the given names are not known.
 - (2) James Lamar (B5) became the father of a son (a) John W. Lamar (B6).
 - (a) John W. Lamar (B6) lived in Charles County, Maryland, and had the following children:
 - (1) Rebecca Lamar, born January 8, 1841.
 - (2) Victoria Lamar, born March 8, 1843.

(3) Richard Lamar (B7), born March 5, 1845.

(4) Grace Lamar, born April 8, 1847.

(5) John Samuel Lamar (B7), born July 5, 1849.

No information is available as to the descendants of the above named children.

(3) Richard Lamar, Jr. (B5) reported in the 1800 census that he was a resident of Dorchester County, Md., and that his family consisted of himself and his wife, both of whom were under 26 years of age. They reported no children.

(4) Mareen T. Lamar (B5) is not known to have left any descendants.

(E) Elizabeth Lamar, the daughter of Robert Lamar (B3), married John Simpkins and became the mother of (1) Elizabeth Simpkins. The importance of the foregoing information with reference to descendants of female members of the family is shown in that it provides conclusive proof that Major Lamar, killed at Paoli, was the son of Robert Lamar (B3) and not the son of John Lamar II (B3) as some writers have indicated.

IV. Mareen Lamar (B3) apparently died without issue after having served as United States Consul in the Madeira Islands.

V. Richard Lamar (B3) never married.

VI. Susannah Lamar, daughter of John Lamar (B2) and his wife Susanna Tyler Lamar, married a man named Alexander Magruder. Their descendants are not known, but the Magruder family was very prominent in later Maryland affairs, and she was presumably the mother of numerous children.

VII. Ann Lamar married Dr. John Briscoe but her descendants are not known.

- VIII. Rachel Lamar married William Harding. No attempt has been made to follow their descendants, if any.
- IX. Priscilla Lamar is believed not to have married.
- X. Mary Lamar was another daughter of John Lamar (B2) but left no known descendants.
- XI. Elizabeth Lamar, also, another daughter of John Lamar (B2), left no known descendants.

In previous chapters we have mentioned the appearance on the eastern shore of Maryland of Charles Lemar (C2) and have followed his descendants through four generations. In order that we may follow this branch of the family more closely we will briefly review the previous record. This Charles Lemar (C2) was twice married. By his first wife he had two sons—Charles Lemar II (C3) and Gallant Lemar (C3); and four daughters—Henrietta, Mary Ann, Rebecca and Sophia. By the second wife he had one son—Luke Lemar (C3) and a daughter, Priscilla. The descendants of these children were as follows:

1. Charles Lemar II (C3), the eldest son, was born about 1710 and died about 1783. He married Ann Young of Queen Anne County, Maryland, in 1773. They became the parents of the following named children: Sarah Lemar, Nathan Lemar (C4), John Lemar (C4), James Lemar (C4) and Charles Lemar III (C4).

2. Gallant Lemar (C3) married Mary Wheeler in 1773. He and his wife became the parents of Gallant Lemar II (C4), Wheeler Lemar (C4), Lemuel Lemar (C4), William Lemar (C4), Hannah Lemar.

3. Henrietta Lemar, the oldest daughter by the first wife, married John Hutchinson in Queen Anne County, Maryland, on February 13th, 1728. Their descendants, if any, are not known.

4. Mary Ann Lemar, another daughter of the first marriage, married William Hadden of Queen Anne County, Maryland, on September 27th, 1733. Her descendants, if any, are not known.

CHAPTER II.

1. Charles Lemar II (C3) was born about 1710 and died about 1783. He was a beneficiary under the will of Mary Simmons as set forth in a preceding chapter. In 1733 he married Anne Young of Queen Anne County, Maryland, whose father John Young, died in 1750. Charles Lemar II (C3) and his wife became the the parents of five children, as follows: (a) Sarah Lemar; (b) Nathan Lemar (C4); (c) John Lemar (C4); (d) James Lemar (C4); and (e) Charles Lemar III (C4). We shall follow the descendants of these children and in doing so will devote a part of this chapter to the descendants of each one of the foregoing named children.

PART A

- (A) Sarah Lemar was born June 18th, 1738. Nothing further is known of her and no record of her marriage has been found.

PART B

- (B) Nathan Lemar (C4) was probably the eldest son of Charles Lemar II (C3). He married Ann Mason, daughter of John and Ann Mason of Queen Anne County, Maryland, in 1770. Apparently, he was married a second time to Margaret Harper of Caroline County, Maryland. He died in 1820 leaving surviving him a son (1) Richard Lemar (C5) and three daughters (2) Sarah, who married Barnett McCombs in 1792; (3) Elizabeth Lemar, who married Thomas Mumfort in 1801; and (4) Nancy Lemar, who married William Brown in 1816. Possibly Nathan Lemar (C4) may also have been the father of a daughter named Ann, for on February 2nd, 1817, Ann Lemar of Caroline County, Maryland, married Joseph Jackson. No descendants of the above named children are known, but it is known that the son, Richard Lemar (C5) married Mary Williams on December 20th, 1814.

PART C

- (C) John Lemar (C4) is the second son of Charles Lemar II (C3) and appears to have been born in Queen Anne County, Maryland, in that portion which in 1774 became Caroline County. The name of his wife is not known but he appears to have been twice married. In 1783 he lived in Caroline County, Maryland, in the home of his brother, James Lemar (C4). At the time of the first Federal Census in 1790 he still resided in Caroline County, Maryland, and reported that he had three sons under 16 years of age, one female and one slave. In 1794 he moved to Mason County, Kentucky, where he, thenceforth, made his home. The names of the children of his first marriage are not known, except that among his family is (1) John Lemar, Jr. (C5), who went to Kentucky with his father and attained his majority about 1813, and (2) a daughter, presumably named Rebecca, who married Aaron Burrows in Mason County, Kentucky, on May 17th, 1802. By a second marriage John Lemar (C4) appears to have become the father of (3) Elijah (C5), born in 1801; and (4) Keziah Lemar (C5), born in 1803. No issue of any of these children is known, except that the census records of Mason County, Kentucky, at a later date show that at that time there lived in the county the following named Lemar children: (a) Frederick Lemar (C6); (b) James Lemar (C6); (c) Elizabeth Lemar; (d) Francis Lemar (C6); (e) Margaret Lemar; (f) Elijah Lemar, Jr. (C6); (g) Squire Lemar (C6) and (h) Sarah Lemar. It is not known certainly which one of these sons of John Lemar (C4) was the father of the above named children except that it seems reasonable that Elijah Lemar, Jr. (C6) must have been the son of (3) Elijah Lemar (C5). No descendants of the above named children are known.

PART D

- (D) James Lemar (C4), the third son of Charles Lemar II (C3), was born in Queen Anne County, Maryland, probably about 1750. On February 23rd, 1778, he married Mary Eubanks, a daughter of William and Mary Eubanks of Queen Anne County, Maryland. Tax records of Caroline County, Maryland, for 1779 and 1783 show that James Lemar (C4) was a resident of that county which had been formed from a part of Queen Anne County, Maryland, in 1774. The tax records of 1783 reveal that James Lemar (C4) had in his household a brother, (c) John Lemar (C4). The first Federal Census taken in 1790 shows that the James Lemar (C4) family consisted, besides his wife and himself, of four sons under 16 years of age. Sometime after 1796 the wife of James Lemar (C4) died and between March 1st and July 1st, 1799, he and six young sons moved to Mason County, Kentucky, where his brother, (c) John Lemar (C4), had been located for about five years. On April 1st, 1800, James Lemar (C4) married Rose McGloghlin in Mason County, Kentucky, and they obtained a tract of land from Alexander K. Marshall on Mill Creek in Mason County, Kentucky. Alexander K. Marshall was a brother of John Marshall, later the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the United States, and had inherited the land from his father, Thomas Marshall. In 1804 James Lemar (C4) purchased a tract of land on Bull Creek in Mason County, Kentucky, near Maysville. No record of his death remains but apparently he died prior to 1813. He left surviving him by his first marriage six sons as follows: (1) John Lemar (C5), who was born January 2nd, 1779; (2) William Lemar (C5), who was born January 27th, 1782; (3) James Lemar II (C5), who was born January 25, 1784; (4) Henry Lemar (C5), who was born October 4th, 1786; (5) Richard Lemar (C5), who

was born August 24th, 1791; and (6) Thomas Lemar (C5), who was born November 3rd, 1795. It is not known whether he left any children by the second marriage. The descendants of the above children are as follows:

SECTION I.

- I. John Lemar (C5), first son of James Lemar (C4), was born in Caroline County, Maryland on January 2nd, 1779. He moved with his father to Mason County, Kentucky, in 1799. On December 10th, 1800, he married Mary Davidson in Mason County, Kentucky. In 1823 they moved to Shelby County, Indiana, where they later made their home. SECTION II.

II. William Lemar (C5) was born January 27, 1782, in Caroline County, Md. He was the second son of James Lemar (C4) and Mary Eubanks Lemar. He moved with his father to Mason County, Kentucky, in 1799. On August 28, 1813, he enlisted in the Third Regiment of the Kentucky Mounted Volunteers for service in the War of 1812. He served at the Battle of the Thames in Canada and was honorably discharged November 3, 1813. For this service he received a grant of land in Martin County, Indiana, to which he moved in 1819. On October 29, 1834, he married a widow, Mrs. Sophronia A. Beck in Martin County, Indiana. He died about 1845 after which his widow married Vincent Scott and in 1856 moved with her children to Effingham County, Illinois. The pension records of the U. S. - (C) Emily Caroline Lemar, born December 4, 1838, in Martin County, Ind. She moved with her mother, stepfather and family to Effingham County, Ill., in 1856. Nothing further known of her at this time.
- (D) James C. Lemar (C6), born December 19, 1841, in Martin County, Ind. He moved with his mother, stepfather and family to Effingham County, Ill., in 1856. On August 16, 1863, he enlisted in Company B, 97th Illinois Infantry. At the time of his enlistment he was a resident of Cumberland County, Ill. He died of wounds at St. Louis, Mo., on June 25, 1863. He never married. He is buried at Neoga, Cumberland County, Ill.

SECTION III.

III. James Lemar II (C5) was born in Caroline County, Md., on January 25, 1784, the third son of James Lemar (C4) and Mary Eubanks Lemar. He moved with his father and brothers to Mason County, Kentucky, in 1799. On August 28, 1813, he enlisted in the 3rd Regiment of Kentucky Mounted Volunteers for service in the War of 1812 in the same regiment and company of which his brother, William Lemar (C5) was a member. He served at the battle of the Thames River in Canada and was honorably discharged on November 3, 1813. For this service he received a grant of land in Martin County, Ind., and moved there in 1819. On November 18, 1808, in Mason

County, Kentucky, he married Sally Brush, the daughter of a Revolutionary War veteran. They became the parents of the following named children: (a) Polly Lemar, born October 6, 1809; (b) Jared Lemar (C6), born April 10, 1813; (c) William Lemar (C6), born December 17, 1814; (d) John Lemar (C6), born November 3, 1816; and (e) Sarah Lemar, born January 12, 1819. The wife, Sally Brush Lemar, died in 1820 just after the family had moved to Martin County, Ind., and after the taking of the Federal Census of 1820. This census showed that at that time his household consisted of three males under ten years of age (Jared, William and John), two males under forty-five years of age (one being James Lemar, himself, and the other not identified, but probably one of his brothers), one female under ten years of age (Sarah), one female under sixteen years of age (Polly), one female under forty-five years of age (his wife, Sally Brush Lemar), and two slaves. On October 31, 1822, James Lemar II (C5) married Martha Ann Davis of Daviess County, Ind. The family resided on the land James Lemar II (C5) had received for military service in the War of 1812 which land was situated at the edge of the town of Mount Pleasant, Martin County, Ind. This village has disappeared but was situated near the present town of Loogootee, Ind. In 1856, James Lemar II (C5) and his family by the second marriage moved to Menard County, Ill. The children of the second marriage are: (f) James Marian Lemar (C6), born December 22, 1823; (g) Henry Hunter Lemar (C6), born December 16, 1825; (h) David Davis Lemar (C6), born March 31, 1828; (i) Helen Mary Lemar, born October 3, 1830; (j) Eliza Ann Lemar, born May 12, 1835; (k) Mary Green Lemar, born April 26, 1839; and (l) Charles Hambleton Lemar (C6), born August 26, 1842. The date when James Lemar II (C5) died is not known but he survived his second wife and it is believed died at the home of his son (b) Jared Lemar (C6) in Clermont County, Ohio, in 1869. His descendants are as follows:

(C) William Lemar (C6), born December 17, 1814, in Mason County, Ky. He moved to Martin County, Ind., with his parents in 1819. He is reported to have been killed while serving in the Union Army during the Civil War. It is not known whether he ever married. No descendants are known.

(D) John Lemar (C6), born November 3, 1816, in Mason County, Kentucky. He moved with his parents to Martin County, Ind., in 1819. In 1838 he married Emila Love and they lived on his farm in Martin County, Ind. In 1841 he sold his Martin County land and shortly thereafter moved to Wabash County, Ind., where the family lived near the town of Lagro. In 1856 he moved his family to Warren County, Ill., and settled near the town of Little York. He died September 1, 1860, and is buried in the Cedar Creek Cemetery near Little York, Warren County, Ill. His tombstone recites that he died, "Sept. 1st, 1860, Age 43 years, 10 Months and 13 Days," which indicates a difference of 16 days from the date of his birth as shown by the old family Bible but the Bible record is no doubt correct. His widow, Emila Lemar, survived him, and died in Saunders County, Nebr., on May 2, 1889. At the time of her death she lived with her son, Irvin Brush Lemar (C7). She is buried at Marietta Presbyterian Church Cemetery near Wahoo, Saunders County, Nebr. Their children were as follows:

- (1) Atlas H. Lemar (C7), born June 1, 1840. He moved with his parents to Warren County, Ill. When the Civil War opened he became a spy with Company L, 7th Missouri Cavalry commanded by his uncle, Capt. Wesley Love. by whom he had one child, Unity Ann Lemar. Upon the death of the second wife he married Roxey Ann Hunt by whom he had two children who died in infancy. CHAPTER III.

In previous chapters we have related that Gallant Lemar (C3) was the second son of Charles Lemar (C2). The date of his birth is not known but in 1733 he married Mary Wheeler and they made their residence in Queen Anne County, Maryland. They appear to have been the parents of four sons, and one daughter, as follows: (A) Gallant Lemar II (C4); (B) Wheeler Lemar (C4); (C) Lemuel Lemar (C4); (D) William Lemar (C4); and (E) Hannah Lemar. The descendants of the above named children are as follows:

(A) Gallant Lemar II (C4) was born in Queen Anne County, Md. He appears to have been an adventurous young man for in 1777 he claimed land in Kentucky, but by 1779 he had returned to Caroline County, Md. In 1782 he was taxed on certain property in Washington County, Va., where he apparently lived at that time. On October 21, 1790, he was the signer of a petition to the Virginia Legislature asking for the establishment of a new county to be carved out of Lincoln County, Kentucky, so was apparently a resident of Kentucky at that time. He later returned to Caroline County, Md., where he appeared in the U. S. Census of 1800 and 1810 and where he was mentioned in the will of his brother, William Lemar (C4), dated May 26th, 1812. He appears to have been the father of three children, as follows: (1) Gallant Lemar III (C5); (2) Luke Lemar (C5); and (3) James Lemar (C5).

(1) Gallant Lemar III (C5) was a resident of Kent County, Delaware, at the time of the 1800, 1810 and 1820 census. His descendants are not known.

(2) Luke Lemar (C5), also resided in Kent County, Delaware, at the time of the 1800, 1810 and 1820 census. Kent County, Delaware, was just across the state line from Caroline County, Maryland, so he continued

to live in the same general neighborhood as his father. His descendants are not known.

- (3) James Lemar (C5) appears in the 1800 and 1810 census of Kent County, Delaware. During the year 1810 and apparently after the taking of the Federal census of that year, he moved to Campbell County, Tenn. He married and became the father of a son, Samuel Lemar (C6) and apparently of another son, Shelby Lemar (C6).

(a) Samuel Lemar (C6) was born August 7, 1810, in Campbell County, Tenn. He married Rebecca Montgomery. He later moved to Hancock County, Tenn., where he died shortly after the Civil War. He was the father of nine children, as follows:

- (5) Elbert Lemar (C7), was born in 1863. He lives now in Lee County, Va., his post office being Jonesville, Va. It is understood that he has a family, but the names of his children are not known.
- (6) Elizabeth Lemar. No further information is available.
- (7) Sarah Lemar. No information is available.
- (8) Creed Taylor Lemar (C7), was born February 17, 1858, in Hancock County, Tenn. He married Beckie Minton and they became the parents of eight children, as follows:
 - (a) Neal Lemar (C8), died when eight years of age.
 - (b) Samuel Lemar (C8), died when about 20 years of age. How-

ever, he was married and had one child.

(1) Samuel Lemar II (C9). He lives now at 2434 Crest Ave., Jackson, Mich. He has two young sons, as follows:

(c) Lonzie C. Lemar (C8). He is not married and lives at 417 Damon St., Jackson, Mich.

(e) John Gilbert Lemar (C8). His present place of residence is unknown but he has one child, as follows:

(1) Edith Lemar. No information regarding her is available.

(f) Alex Lemar (C8). He lives now at Middlesboro, Ky. It is understood that he has several children but their names are not known.

(g) Margaret Lemar, died when 19 years of age without issue.

(h) Dude Lemar (C8), was born February 17, 1900, at Middlesboro, Ky. On November 22, 1928, he married Irene M. Gartin and they now live at 1529 Race St., Cincinnati, Ohio. They have no children.

(9) John Lemar (C7). His descendants, if any, are not known.

- (b) Shelby Lemarr (C6). The date of his birth is not known but he died in 1894. He was known to have been the father of William Jackson Lemarr (C7) and was, apparently, the father of several other children, as follows:
 - (1) James L. Lemarr (C7) was born in 1831 and lived in Claiborne County, Tenn., in 1850.
 - (2) Elizabeth Lemarr was born in 1833. She also lived in Claiborne County, Tenn., in 1850. No further information is available.
 - (3) William Jackson Lemarr (C7) was born July 24, 1837, and died August 7, 1935. The name of his wife is not known but they were the parents of one son, as follows:
 - (a) James W. Lemarr (C8). The date of his birth is not known. He lives now at 917 S. Roger St., Colorado Springs, Colo. He is married and it is understood has three children but the names and birth dates of the children are not known.
 - (4) Francis M. Lemarr (C7) was born in 1838 and lived in Claiborne County, Tenn., in 1850. No further information known.
 - (5) David Lemarr (C7) was born in 1839. He also resided in Claiborne County, Tenn., in 1850, but no further information regarding him is available.
- (B) Wheeler Lemar (C4). There is little information regarding him available. A public record of Caroline County, Md., shows that he sold certain lands in that county and was joined in the deed by his wife, Anne, the daughter of John

Murphy. The first Federal Census shows that in 1790 they had one son under sixteen years of age and the 1800 census shows they had one son under sixteen years of age, one son under ten years of age and three daughters under ten years of age. He was mentioned in the will of his brother, William Lemar (C4) in 1812. No further information as to him or his descendants is available.

- (C) Lemuel Lemar (C4). The 1790 census of Caroline County, Md., showed that he lived in that county at that time. He was married and had one son under 16 years of age and four females whose ages were not shown. In 1792 he was a resident of Logan County, Ky. No further information regarding him or his descendants is available.
- (D) William Lemar (C4). The 1810 census of Caroline County, Md., showed that his family consisted of one son under ten years of age, two males under twenty-six years of age, apparently himself and another, one female under twenty-six years of age, apparently his wife, and one female under forty-five years of age who was probably a relative. His will dated May 26th, 1812, made bequests to his brothers, (A) Gallant Lemar II (C4), (B) Wheeler Lemar (C4) and his sister, Hannah Lemar, with the principal part of his estate going to his son, Spencer Lemar (C5).
 - (1) Spencer Lemar (C5). The date of his birth is not known. No further information regarding him or his descendants, if any, is available.
- (E) Hannah Lemar, sister of the above named William Lemar (C4), was apparently charged with the care of her nephew, Spencer Lemar (C5), upon the death of her brother. No further information regarding her has been found.

CHAPTER IV.

3. Henrietta Lemar was the third child of Charles Lemar (C2) by his first marriage. In 1728 she married John Hutchinson in Queen Anne County, Md. No further attempt has been made to follow her descendants.
4. Mary Ann Lemar was the fourth child of Charles Lemar (C2). She was married on September 27, 1733, to William Hadden in Queen Anne County, Md. No attempt to follow her descendants has been made.
5. Rebecca Lemar, married Thomas Morris in Queen Anne County, Md., in 1740. Her descendants have not been traced.
6. Sophia Lemar was probably the youngest child of Charles Lemar (C2) by his first marriage. In 1745 in Queen Anne County, Md., she married Isaiah Whitehead. Her descendants, if any, are not known.
7. Luke Lemar (C3) was the eldest child of Charles Lemar (C2) by his second marriage. He was born in Queen Anne County, Md. On December 1, 1748, he married Amy Sprawl of Queen Anne County, Md. He

apparently moved to Georgia before the American Revolution in which he participated as a member of the Georgia Militia. In 1782 and to 1784 he and his three sons were residents and taxpayers of Washington County, Va. Many of the tax records of Virginia have been destroyed but the records of 1788 to 1790 show that he and his son, John Lemar (C4), lived in Russell County, Va., which had been formed from a part of Washington County, Va. Later he became a resident of Logan County, Ky., in which he was taxed in 1794. He died in Christian County, Ky., and his will, dated May 19th, 1798, made bequests to his children and to a grandchild. His children as shown by said will were as follows:

(a) John Lemar (C4). Presumably he was the father of the grandson mentioned in the will of Luke Lemar (C3).

(1) Alexander Lemar (C5)

(b) William Lemar (C4). No further information regarding him is available.

(c) James Lemar (C4). No further information as to him or his descendants is known.

(d) Mary Montgomery Lemar. No further information available.

(e) Nasma Lemar. No information as to her descendants available.

8. Priscilla Lemar was the youngest child of Charles Lemar (C2) by his second marriage. In 1749 in Queen Anne County, Md., she married Samuel Wilson. Presumably this Samuel Wilson was a relative of the Sarah Wilson who married Robert Lamar (A3) and of the Joseph Wilson who married Elizabeth Lamar. No descendants of the marriage of Priscilla Lemar and Samuel Wilson are known and no attempt has been made to follow their descendants.
