#### PREFACE.

Nearly nine generations of Dr. Samuel Fuller's descendants have passed away without any collection of their genealogical records having been made. Meanwhile old records have been fading, wearing out, being lost, neglected and burned, as for example, the list of towns whose documents have been destroyed by fire is quite extensive.

While making a search for the records of descendants of Edward Fuller of the Mayflower, a brother of Dr. Samuel, and since publishing (in 1908) the material obtained, I have been collecting information concerning this, another of the ancestral American Fuller families, and herewith present the results thus far obtained.

Records of this kind will always be incomplete, and in this case it is my judgment that it is time, and the safest and most advisable course, to publish what I have already obtained rather than await the slow and uncertain process of accumulation of some of the data which will be found wanting.

In regard to the term "Ancestral Fuller families," it has seemed quite appropriate to speak of those American families as ancestral, whose emigrant ancestor settled in America prior to 1650.

These heads of families so far as I know were ten in number: Edward Fuller, born in 1575, came to America in 1620. Dr. Samuel, born in 1580, came to America in 1620. John of Lynn, born in ?, came to America in 1630. John of Newton, born in 1611, came to America in 1635. John of Ipswich, born in 1620, came to America in 1635. Thomas of Woburn, born in ?, came to America in 1638. Robert of Salem, born in ?, came to America in 1640. Captain Matthew, born in ?, came to America in 1640. Thomas of Dedham, born in ?, came to America in 1642.

In this volume the extension of data concerning those descendants not bearing the name of Fuller, has been more restricted than in the first volume, in order to keep the cost of the work within the bounds suggested by previous experience. Beyond the names and dates of birth of children of Fuller daughters, who have married 6 PREFACE.

those having other names than Fuller, genealogical details have generally been left to the genealogist of the allied family.

The compiler has been especially aided in the records of the earlier generations by the work of the late Newton Fuller of New London, Ct.; by the MSS. of Prof. H. W. Brainard of Hartford, Ct.; and by material furnished by F. A. Fuller of Buffalo, N. Y. and Charles M. Thatcher of Middleboro, Mass., all of whom are experienced genealogists.

Among correspondents, I have been favored by having many who were particularly interested in the work, as Mrs. L. A. Cobb, No. 148 of 1st Group; Mr. W. F. Fuller, No. 255 of 5th Group; the late Charles Richardson Smith, husband of Mrs. Nellie (Fuller) Smith, No. 319 of 5th Group; Miss Sarah M. Fuller, No. 143 of 5th Group; Mr. E. L. Philoon, descendant of No. 117 of 5th Group; Miss Mabel A., No. 226, and Mr. Linus E. Fuller, No. 116 of 12th Group, and Mrs. Anna (Fuller) Bennett, No. 69 of the 13th Group; and there are many others to whom thanks are due not only from the compiler, but also from the descendants.

Acknowledgements are also due to "The Mayflower Descendant" Magazine, the New England Historical and Genealogical Register, and the authors of numerous family genealogies for information taken from their pages.

Since it has seemed a most appropriate place, I have added to this volume a supplement containing additional information concerning the descendants of Edward Fuller of the Mayflower, and corrections of errors in Volume 1 that have been brought to my notice.

These two volumes constitute what may be considered the "Mayflower Fuller Genealogy," and by Mayflower Fullers I mean those who came to America in 1620 on the ship Mayflower, and their descendants.

In conclusion I desire to thank the printers, C. B. Fiske & Company, of Palmer, Mass., for their care and attention; the photo-engravers, especially Mr. McKinnon, of James B. McKinnon & Co., of Springfield, Mass., for his personal interest in the making of half-tone portraits, and the binder, Mr. W. J. Eldred of Springfield, for neat and substantial work on these volumes.

## **EXPLANATIONS.**

In the arrangement of the genealogical record, each descendant bearing the surname Fuller has an individual number and also a family number.

The sign # placed before the family number of a son indicates that his family record is given further on, in his group and generation, placed in order of seniority by his individual number.

In the case of daughters, it has been the intention to give immediately after their individual and family number and names, their individual genealogical record, and in case of marriage the date of the same, with name of husband, and if there are children their names and date and place of birth, their further genealogical record being generally left to the genealogist of the allied family. The explanation of the change from the record by generations to record by group and generation is given on page 22.

## AMERICAN FULLER GENEALOGY.

## DR. SAMUEL FULLER LINE.

Samuel Fuller was one of the band of Pilgrims, persecuted on account of religious convictions, who escaped from England to Holland in 1608, and settled in Leyden, Holland, in 1609.

In the results of Mr. Dexter's researches among the records of Holland, published in a volume entitled "The England and Holland of the Pilgrims," Samuel Fuller is mentioned as a witness Oct. 7, 1611, to the betrothal of Degory Priest, and to that of William White Jan. 27, 1612.

As the widower of Alice Glascock, it is recorded he was betrothed to Agnes Carpenter March 15, 1613, and the witnesses were her father, Alexander Carpenter, Edward Southworth, William White, Roger Nelson, her sister, Alice Carpenter, and his sister, Anna or Susanna (Fuller) White.

Samuel <sup>1</sup> Fuller was also a witness May 7, 1613, to the betrothal of his sister-in-law, Alice Carpenter, to Edward Southworth, and that of Samuel Terry May 16, 1614. He buried his child June 29, 1615, and his wife Agnes July 3, 1615. Later he lived in Pieterskerkhof and was a witness Aug. 7, 1615, to the betrothal of Samuel Butler, and that of Edmond Jessup Sept. 16, 1615. He was betrothed to Bridget Lee, May 12, 1617, and as witnesses there were her mother, Josephine Lee, and her brother, Samuel Lee.

They took up their residence near Marepoort, and Samuel<sup>1</sup> Fuller witnessed the betrothal of John Goodman Sept. 16, 1619. He

joined with Isaac Allerton, Mr. Bradford and Mr. Winslow June 10, 1620, in a letter concerning the affairs of the Pilgrims, to their associates, Mr. Carver and Mr. Cushman, then in England.

The Pilgrims left Holland for America about Aug. 1, 1620, by way of Southampton, England, and Samuel Fuller's name appears as one of the signers of the "Compact" drawn up for the government of the Colony at Cape Cod, in November, 1620, in the vicinity of what is now Provincetown, Mass. Some days later the Pilgrims made a permanent landing and settled at what is now Plymouth, Mass.

Bridget (Lee) Fuller, third wife of Samuel 1 Fuller, came to America in 1623 on the ship Anne. The date and place of her death are not now known.

Anna, or Susanna (Fuller) White, sister of Samuel <sup>1</sup> Fuller, came to America with the Pilgrims in 1620. She died in 1680. She married for her first husband William White in Holland, who died at Plymouth, March 3, 1621. She married second, Edward Winslow, who became the third governor of the Colony. It was also his second marriage. He died in 1655. By her first husband she had Peregrine White, born on the Mayflower between Dec. 7 and 10, 1620, and Resolved White. It is stated that she had several children by her second husband.

Alexander Carpenter, father of Samuel 1 Fuller's second wife, was from Wrington in Somerset, England, and had five daughters, Agnes, Alice, Juliana, Priscilla and Mary. The last four came to America. Alice married first Edward Southworth; second, William Bradford. Juliana married George Morton. Priscilla married William Wright. Mary remained single.

It has been said that Samuel¹ Fuller was also from Wrington, but from the researches of Mr. Francis H. Fuller in England, it appears he was baptized in Redenhall Parish in Harleston, Norfolk County, England, as a son of Robert Fuller. For extracts from the earliest records of the Redenhall Parish Church, reference is made to the 55th volume of the New England Historical and Genealogical Register. For a copy of the will of Robert Fuller, father of Samuel¹ Fuller, see the volume on "Some Descendants of Edward Fuller of the Mayflower," published by the compiler of this volume in September, 1908.

Samuel<sup>1</sup> Fuller was a physician, and the biographical sketches

published mention him as eminent in his profession, devoutly pious, and wise in counsel in the affairs of the Massachusetts Bay Colony. His will, a copy of which is printed herewith, indicates that he was just, kind hearted and benevolent.

His children were:

I. A child that died in Holland.

2. II. A child born in Holland that died young in Plymouth, Mass.

3. III. Samuel<sup>2</sup>, born about 1625; m. Elizabeth Brewster.

4. IV. Mary<sup>2</sup>, b. ——; m. Ralph James.

#### Will of Dr. Samuel Fuller.

The first will entered in the first volume of Plymouth Colony Wills and Inventories is that of Dr. Samuel Fuller.

New Plymouth

1633.

A true Coppy of the last will and Testm of Samuel ffuller the elder as it was proved in publick Court the 28th of Oct in the ninth yeare of the raigne of our Soveraign Lord Charles by the grace of God King of Engl. Scott. ffr. & Irel. Defender of the ffaith &c

I Samuel ffuller the elder being sick & weake but by the mercie of God in perfect memory ordaine this my last will & Testmt. And first of all I bequeath my soule to God & my body to the earth untill the resureccon Item I doe bequeath the educacon of my children to my Brother Will Wright & his wife, onely that my daughter Mercy be & remaine wthgoodwife Wallen so long as she will keepe her at a reasonable charge. But if it shall please God to recover my wife out of her weake estate of sickness then my children to be wth her or disposed by her. Also whereas there is a childe comitted to my charge called Sarah Converse, my wife dying as afore I desire my Brother Wright may have the bringing up of her. And if he refuse then I comend her to my loving Neighbour & brother in Christ Thomas Prence desiring that whosoever of them receive her pforme the duty of a step ffather unto her & bring her up in the ffear of God as their owne, wch was a charge laid upon me pr her sick ffather when he freely bestowed her upon me & wch I require of them. Item whereas Eliz. Cowles was comitted to my educacon by her ffather & Mother still living at Charles Towne, my will is that she be conveniently apprelled & returne to her ffather or mother or either of them. And for George ffoster being placed wth me upon the same termes by his prents still living at Sago's (Lynn) my will is that he be restored to his Mother like wise.

Item I give to Samuell my son my howse & lands at the Smeltriver to him & his heires for ever. Item (worn) will is that my Howse & garden at towne be sold & all my moveables there & at the Smeltriver (except my Cattle)

togeather with the print Croppe of Corne there standing by my Overseers heerafter to be menconed, except such as they shall thinke meet in the prnt educacon of my two children Samuell & Mercy my debts being first pd out of them, the overplus to be disposed of towards the encrease of my stock of Cattle for their good at the discretion of my overseers. Item I give two Acres of land that fell unto me by lott on the Sowth side the Towne adjoyning to the Acres of mr Isaack Allerton to Samuell my son. Also two other Acres of land wch were given me by Edward Bircher scituate & being at Strawberry hill if mr Roger Williams refuse to accept of them as formerly he hath done. Also one other Acre by mr Heeks his Acres neer the Reed pond. All wch I give to the said Samuell and his heires forever. It. my will is that my Cozen Samuell goe freely away wth his Stock of Cattle & Swine wthout any further recconing which swine are the halfe of six sowes Six Hogges one boare & fowr shotes Also one Cow & one heyfer. Item my will is that not onely the other halfe afore menconed but also all other mine owne propr stock of Swine be sold wth other my moveables for the use before expressed except my best hogg wch I would have killed this winter for the prnt comfort of my children. It. whereas I have disposed of my children to my brother Will. Wright & Prisilla his wife my will is that in case my wife die he enter upon my howse & land at the Smelt River & also my Cattle not disposed on together wth my two servts Thomas Symons & Robt. Cowles for the Remainder of their several termes to be employed for the good of my children he being allowed for their charg vizt. my childrens what my Overseers shall thinke meet. But if in case my said brother Will Wright or Prisilla his wife die then my said Children Samuell & Mercy together wth the said joynt charge committed to the said Will & Prisilla be void except my Overseers (2) or the survivor of them shall think meet. To whos (worn) godly care in such case I leave them to be disposed of else where as the Law shall direct them. My cattle not disposed on o to be employed for the good of my children I meane three Cowes & two steere calves Six old ewes & two ewe lambs two old wethers & three wether lambs together with such overplus upon the sale of my goods before expressed as my Overseers shall adde heerunto. It. I give out of this stock of Cattle the first Cow calfe that my Browne Cow shall have to the Church of God at Plymouth to be employed by the Deacon or Deacons of the said Church for the good of the said Church at the oversight of the ruling Elders. Item I give to my sister Alice Bradford twelve shillings to buy her a paire of gloves. Item whatsoever is due unto me from Capt Standish I give unto his children. It. that a pr. of gloves of 5sh be bestowed on mr Joh. Wynthrop Govr of the Massachusetts. It. I give unto my brother Wright aforesaid one cloath suit not yet fully finished lying in my trunk at Towne weh I give notw standing my wife survive. It. whereas Capt John Endecott oweth me two pownds of Beaver I give it to his sonne. It. my will is that when my children come to age of discretion that my Overseers make a full valuacon of that stock of Cattle & the increase thereof, & that it be equally devided between my children. And if any die in the meane

time the whole to goe to the survivor or survivors. It. my will is that they be ruled by my Overseers in marriage. Also I would have them enjoy that smale porcon the Lord shall give them when my Overseers thinke them to be of fit discretion & not at any set time or appointmt of yeares. It. whereas my will is that my Overseers shall let out that stock of Cattle wch shall be bought wth the Overplus of my goods to halves to such as shall be as well careful as honest men. My will is that my brother Wright have the refusall of them. It. I give unto John Jenny & Joh. Wynslow each of them a paire of gloves of five shillings. It. I give unto mrs Heeks the full sum of twenty shillings. It. I give unto old mr Brewster my best hat and band wch I h (worn) never wore. It. my will is that if my children die that then my stock be thus distributed. ffirst that what care or paines or charge hath been by any about my children be fully recompensed. Next at the discretion of the Overseers I thus bequeath the rest vizt so as it may redownd to the Governing Elder or Elders of this Church at Plymouth aforesaid & towards the helping of such psons as are members of the same & are (illegible) as my Overseers shall thinke meet. It. I give to Rebecca Prence 2sh 6d to buy her a paire of gloves. It. my will is that in case my sonne Samuell & other my children die before such time as they are fitt to enter upon my land for inheritance that then my kinsman Sam. ffuller now in the howse wth me enjoy wtsoever lands I am now possessed of except my dwelling howse at town or whatsoever shall be due to me or them. It. I give to him my Ruffet Cloake & my stuffe sute I now weare. It. I institute my son Samuell my Executor. and because he is young and tender I enjoyne him to be wholly ordered by Edw Wynslow mr Will Bradford & mr Tho. Prence whom I make his Overseers & the Overseers of this my last will & Testmt. so often menconed before in the same. And for their paines I give to each of them twenty shillings apeece. It. I give to Mercy my daughter one Bible wth a black Cover wth Bezaes notes. It. I give all the rest of my bookes to my sonne Samuell wch I desire my Brother Wright Will safely preserve for him. It my will is that when my daughter Mercy is fitt to goe to scole that mrs Heeks may teach her as well as my sonne. It. whatsoever mr Roger Williams is indebted to me upon my booke for phisick I freely give him. Last of all whereas my wife is sick & weake I have disposed of my children to others my will is if she recover that she have the educacon of them, & that the other gifts and legacies I have given may be pformed And if in case any of my Overseers or all of them (3) die before my children be judged by them of age of discretion then my desire is they will before such time when they dispose of their owne affaires depute some other of the Church to pform this duty of care & love towards my children, wch I allow & binde my children to obedience as before. In witnes that this is my last will & Test I have set to my hand & seale the 30th of July Anno 1633.

Samuell ffuller

Memorand that whereas the widow Ring comitted the Oversight of her sonne Andrew to me at her death, my will is that mr Prence one of my Overseers take the charge of him & see that he be brought up in the ffeare of the Lord & See that he sustaine no wrong by any.

Witnesses heerun to Robt Heeks John Wynslow.

See his Inventory, Fol. 22 (This line is in a different hand.)

A note of such debts as Sam ffuller acknowledged
upon his death bed, at the making of the foresaid

I owe to the Acco of Company in the Massachusets six or ten shillings if ffr Johnson of Salem have not pd it. It. I owe mr Joh Winthrop one hogsh of Come for lines I bought of him, but doubt whether pd or not. If he demand it, pay it.


It. I owe him for a Sow of leade except X sh wch I have pd as appeareth pr receipt

It. whereas Henry Wood demands an old debt due at Leyden I desire that wt soever he demand as due debt be pd by my overseers he dealing faithfully.

It. whereas I have an herball belonging to Joh. Chew of Plymouth in old Engl. I desire when the price is known he may be pd. Also whereas there is an co between Joh Jenny Manasseh Kempton & myselfe where in we are all debtors to Joh Cheew my desire is my pt may be pd.

Mention having been made of a "Fuller Fund" for the support of the ministry of the Plymouth church, the foundation of said fund being the proceeds derived from the sale of a plot of ground on Leyden Street given to the church for a parsonage by Mrs. Bridget (Lee) Fuller, widow of Dr. Samuel Fuller, and Samuel Fuller his son, I wrote the pastor of the Congregational church in Plymouth and received the following: "The fund you wrote about is the "Fuller Ministerial Fund," which is used for the purpose named in your note, but not from the source you mentioned. That place was sold and the money used. The "fund" came from an unborn calf. I mean that the calf was bequeathed before it came into the world, and the proceeds of it when a cow was allowed to accumulate, and it has grown into the thousands. This is the history of the "Fuller Ministerial Fund."

Readers are referred to the item in Dr. Samuel's will, given above, relative to "the first cow calfe that my Browne Cow shall have."

#### SECOND GENERATION.

Samuel<sup>2</sup> Fuller, (Samuel<sup>1</sup>), b.—, 1625, in Plymouth, Mass. His burial place was on the "Hill" at Plymouth, and the gravestone inscription reads: "Here lyes ye bodie of ye Rev. Samuel Fuller, who departed this life Aug. ye 17, 1695, in ye 71st year of his age. He was ye 1st minister of ye church in Middleborough."

He married Elizabeth Brewster (Records 1st Church of Middleborough, Mass.), who died in Plympton, Mass., Nov. 11, 1713. (Plympton Records.)

Samuel<sup>2</sup> Fuller was one of the 26 original proprietors of Middle-borough. The Indians burned his home there in 1676 and he returned to Plymouth until the war with them was over. He had been educated for the ministry and preached several years at Middleborough, but was not ordained until 1694. His biographers describe him as a sober, grave, industrious, enlightened, and self-denying man.

His children were:

### Settlement of Rev. Samuel Fuller's Estate.

Rev. Samuel Fuller, son of Dr. Samuel Fuller of the Mayflower, died intestate at Middleborough 17 August, 1695, and his widow Elizabeth was appointed administratrix 25 September, 1695. The record of this appointment and of the inventory taken 5 September 1695, may be found in the Plymouth County Probate Records, volume I, page 223. On page 224 is recorded the appointment of a guardian for the minor son Isaac, and on pages 246 and 247 is the agreement between the heirs.

The appointment and the administration bond are omitted here as not being of great genealogical interest.

#### Explanation of Group Arrangement.

From this point the arrangement of the work is made similar to that found so satisfactory in the Edward Fuller volume. Sons of the third generation are made the heads of groups, and the genealogy of each group completed by itself by generations, as before, with individual numbering relative to the groups and family numbering, as before. He always saw the bright side of affairs, and was singularly sensitive to the humorous. His hearty laugh and genial greeting are remembered by all who knew him; yet was he a vigorous fighter, sturdy, resolute and resourceful, as his opponents in the old days were well aware." 





Mark Twain was at his best. The audience laughed until some declared, at the close, they were too weak to leave their seats. His success as a lecturer was assured."

Mr. Fuller received a common school education and entered the employment of a prominent mercantile house. Later he started in business for himself, but conditions and circumstances not being favorable his first adventures proved disastrous. He persevered however, and directing his attention to acquiring and operating coal properties, became recognized as one of the most capable and efficient individual operators. Later, he sold his collieries and organized the International Salt Company. He was also a railroad director and promoter; director Pennsylvania Casualty Co.; director Wyoming Shovel Works; treasurer Lackawanna Hospital; president board of trustees, Second Presbyterian Church; member Scranton Board of Trade, and of the Municipal League. Socially, Mr. Fuller was as active as in business, being a member of various local clubs, and also of the Maryland Club of Baltimore, the Buffalo Club of Buffalo, N. Y., of various New York clubs, and of the New England societies of both Scranton and New York. Mr. Fuller was not ostentatious. It was an article of his creed that wealth was a trust to be administered by its owner for the benefit of all whom it could wisely be made to reach, and that the trust should be discharged, as far as possible, personally and not by will. It was thoroughly characteristic of him and his wife that they chose as a method of celebrating their silver wedding the building of an addition to their church, in order that its activities might be widened and facilitated.

Mr. Fuller was deservedly popular. He possessed rare personal charms, manly vigor, a frank and open disposition, unusual conversational ability and unfailing cheerfulness. Perhaps his most striking quality was his dauntless courage. His spirit seemed to rise superior to every disaster and to take fresh impulse from multiplied obstacles. He was deeply loved by all who came most closely in contact with him, and his loss will be deeply felt by a country-wide circle of friends. (Gleanings from Scranton, Pa., Tribune, Jan. 30, 1909.)

Quoting from a publication of the Rhode Island Historical Society, a correspondent says: "In 1843 he joined N. P. Willis and George P. Morris in publishing the N. Y. Mirror and eventually became sole proprietor. He wrote for it a series of piquant society letters: "Belle Brittan on a Tour," "At Newport," "Here and There;" also published "The Groton Letters," 1845; "Sparks from a Locomotive," 1849; and "Glimpses of Home after Thirteen Years Abroad," 1875.

Espousing the cause of the Southern Confederacy, he went to London, Eng., and established "The Cosmopolitan," devoted to the advocacy of the Southern question. Later he removed to Paris, where he died. One night in 1883, after Mr. Fuller's death, the invalid wife disappeared from a steamboat on the Hudson River and the body never was found."

Vernon. He lived at Bridgewater, Mass., and Kent, Ct. He died in Easton, Mass., at what is known as the "Fuller place." He died out under the apple trees, where he had begged to be taken to see the sun set once more." (F. A. Fuller's MSS.)

In answer to inquiries concerning Isaiah's family, the Brockton City Clerk states that Jacob, born in 1776, is the only child of Isaiah's mentioned in Mitchell's or Kingman's Histories of Bridgewater and North Bridgewater, apparently assuming that these histories contain all the information the vital records of those towns contain regarding him. The U. S. census for 1790 mentions Isaiah in Bridgewater with six persons in his family, and also in Warwick with the same number. The volumes of "Massachusetts Soldiers and Sailors of the Revolution" credit Isaiah Fuller of Bridgewater with service in the Revolutionary war. The "History of Warwick" mentions Isaiah Fuller in a list of house owners in Warwick in 1798. The vital records of the town of Warwick, according to the town clerk, contain no mention of Isaiah Fuller.

Mr. Linus E. Fuller (No. 116 of this Group) states that Isaiah Fuller was described by Lemuel<sup>6</sup> (No. 11 of this Group) to a nephew as a man of middle size with blue eyes and dark hair, and his wife as a beautiful woman of a very respectable Bridgewater family. Mr. L. E. Fuller has visited the Warwick and Winchester cemeteries, but thinks that Isaiah, Isaiah's widow, and Isaiah's father, Isaac, are buried in a small graveyard near the northeast corner of Warwick which he had not time to visit.

The following letter from Prof. H. W. Brainard of Hartford, Ct., recently received, is of interest:

HARTFORD, June 28, 1910.

DEAR SIR:

The following is important, and may be new to you. It was sent me by my friend, Frank F. Starr, the genealogist, of Middletown. It refers to Elizabeth Fuller, wife of Rev. Samuel Fuller of Plymouth and Middleboro, and she died at Plympton, about 1713. I think you must have the exact date. Whether she was Fuller's only wife, and the mother of his children, I cannot say. She must have married Fuller after April 11, 1663, and was widow then of Thomas Bowen of Marblehead, New London and Rehoboth, who was brother to Richard and Obadiah Bowen of Rehoboth.

New London County Court records, Vol. 2, fifth leaf from the end:

May 2, 1667. Power of attorney. Elizabeth ffuller of Towne of Plimouth in the Jurisdicktion of Plimouth—sometime the wife of Thomas Bowen. Late of Rehoboth in the Jurisdiction Aforesd, Cooper, deceased, and Samuell ffuller of the Towne of Plimouth—to our well beloved Brother-in-lawe John Prentice of New London in new England. Blacksmith, land in New London, sometime the land of said Thomas Bowen. I the sayde Elizabeth ffuller being Exequitrics unto the sd Thomas Bowen,—as by his will dated April 11, 1663. Power to sell the lands.

Thomas Cushman, witnesses.

This also shows that Bridget, widow of Deacon and Dr. Samuel Fuller, was living May 2, 1667.

Since receiving the above mentioned letter, I find that Savage, in his Genealogical Dictionary, printed 50 years ago, says: "Thomas Bowen, Salem, 1648, was of New London 1657-60; rem. to Rehoboth 1663. His wid. Elizabeth was in 1669 w. of Samuel Fuller of Plymouth. His will of 11 April 1663, made her extrix., names his s. Richard and br. Obadiah. Thomas Bowen of Marblehead 1674 may have been son of Thomas of Salem 1648."

Also, "Samuel Fuller of Plymouth, son of first Samuel had w. Elizabeth, but was not married before 1650."

In Felt's "Annals of Salem," Vol. 1, Thomas Bowen is in list of first settlers "mentioned as of this place." No other reference to him found.

In the "Supplementary Vital Records of Marblehead," item from Court Records, Vol. 1, page 56, mentions Thomas Bowen "aged abt. 24 y; his wife Elizabeth, 26–10 m. 1646." Also Vol. 6, p. 151, "Thomas Bowen, w. Elizabeth mentioned June 1661."

Also, Vol. 14, p. 116, "Thomas Bowen a. abt. 45 y. dep. June T. 1669." The "History of the First Church of Roxbury, Mass.," says John Prentice came over with his father Valentine in 1631; removed to New London, 1652; blacksmith. Valentine Prentice died 1633 and his widow Alice m. John Watson.

Ellis, in his "History of Roxbury," says Valentine Prentice brought but one child, his son John.

In the matter of dates of birth of Rev. Samuel Fuller's children, I have followed on page 15 those given in the Brainard and F. A. Fuller MSS., but I notice on page 20 the birth of John 3 ( Samuel², Samuel¹) is given as "about 1668," and the Brainard MSS. gives the same year, which is probably an error, as John would be but about 18 years of age when married about 1686-7. I find also that the statement in the Brainard MSS. (which I have given on page 15), that the burial place of Rev. Samuel Fuller was on the "Hill" at Plymouth is incorrect, and on inquiry of Charles M. Thatcher of Middleboro, he says Rev. Samuel Fuller was buried in Nemasket Hill Cemetery, Middleboro, and the gravestone is still standing.

Davis, in his "Ancient Landmarks of Plymouth," 1883, says: "Samuel, son of Samuel of the Mayflower, by w. Elizabeth had Mercy m. Daniel Cole, Samuel 1659, Experience m. James Wood, John, Elizabeth m. Samuel Eaton, Hannah m. Eleazer Lewis, and Isaac." Now Davis, so far as I have noticed in that volume, gives the children in the order of birth in his genealogical record, but Prof. Brainard, in a later letter of July 14, 1910, states that he finds in the Mayflower Descendants, Vol. 8, p. 3, that "Daniel Cole died 15 June 1736 in 70th year," and "Mercy, wife of Daniel, died Sept. 25, 1735, in 63d year"—"Gravestones, Ancient Cemetery, Eastham, Mass." Then Mercy, wife of Daniel Cole, was born in 1672 or 1673.

Was this Mercy, Mercy Fuller, dau. of Rev. Samuel Fuller? This letter of Prof. Brainard's is one in answer to my inquiry as to his authority for the dates of birth of Rev. Samuel Fuller's children given in his MSS., so often quoted. This letter contains no other new facts fixing the dates of birth of the other children.

In answer to a letter of inquiry to Mr. F. A. Fuller, he states that "about all his data was furnished by Newton Fuller." (Both Brainard and F. A. Fuller exchanged genealogical information with the late Newton Fuller.)

Weston, in his History of Middleboro, published 1906, says Rev. Samuel Fuller's wife was Elizabeth Brewster. Prof. Brainard says the same in his MSS., and adds, "Tradition says dau. of Elder Brewster, but research does not confirm it." Dr. Sarah E. Crocker of Boston, who has made extended researches in this direction, states in a letter of July 5, 1910, that this tradition has been disproved, and also incidentally that the late Chipman Fuller of Halifax told her that Ebenezer Fuller, his grandfather (?), "when the Middleboro church records were burned, supplied the church with a list of names from his own records, and adds "that it is strange that he should have recorded the maiden name of Samuel Fuller's wife as Brewster."

A Washington, D. C., correspondent finds that the Bowen family genealogies in the library there only relate to the Woodstock, Ct., family and a foreign family of Wales. Prof. Brainard mentions in his MSS. that the "Elizabeth Brewster, dau. of Jonathan and Lucretia Oldham Brewster, who married Peter Brawley of New London, died in 1654."

I have mentioned these facts in a hurried and irregular way, as it is necessary for me to furnish this MSS. to the printer and close up the work on this volume.

# CORRECTIONS IN 5TH GROUP.

Homer Taylor Fuller, number 141, was Principal of St. Johnsbury Academy from 1871 instead of 1872, and the degree of Ph. D. was conferred by Dartmouth instead of Iowa college, as stated in the newspaper clipping.

Henry Jones Fuller, number 291, graduated in 1895 from the Worcester Polytechnic Institute and is President of the Canadian Fairbanks Co., whose business has had a marvelous growth under his efficient management.

A correspondent, a relative of John H. Fuller, number 128, has just enclosed to me a newspaper clipping without date, mentioning "the funeral of Mrs. Emma Cushman Fuller, wife of John H. Fuller of Rockingham Ave.," "born in Dover, N. H., 82 years ago;" "survived by her husband, one son, John S. Fuller, five grand-daughters and two grandsons."

Simeon Fuller was a soldier of the Revolution, and the U. S. Pension records show that he enlisted April 17, 1781, from Sandisfield, Mass., and served as private until the fall of 1782 under Captain Fox, Col. Henry Jackson's Regt.; re-enlisted and served until Jan. 4, 1784, under Capt. Fowler, Col. Greaton's Regt.; applied for pension July 4, 1832, from Steuben, Oneida Co., N. Y., and claim was allowed.

"Soldier's age at date of application 70 years, and soldier's brother Lot was 72 years of age and a resident of Floyd, N. Y., in 1832. No other data as to family.

Simeon Fuller is the only soldier of that name in the Mass. or N. Y. service found on the Revolutionary war pension records. On Mass. war rolls described as 5 ft. 7 in., with light complexion and light hair. He resided for a time in Fort Ann, Washington Co., N. Y., where he was a captain of militia; removed to Steuben about 1792; was a pioneer settler there and one of the most highly respected men of the county.
